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B. Depending on the circumstances, the Team Coordinator may request participation of the heads of any other state agencies as deemed appropriate.

- C. The Team Coordinator shall also request that a representative of the United States Army Corps of Engineers be appointed by the administrative head of the Tulsa District to participate on the Team.
- D. The Team Coordinator shall also request a representative of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development be appointed by the administrative head of the Oklahoma City office to participate on the team.
- E. The State Hazard Mitigation Team will meet as determined by the Team Coordinator to review and recommend updates to the State Comprehensive All-hazard Mitigation Plan, and shall have those additional responsibilities as provided by the Team Coordinator, including, but not limited to, the review and recommendation for loan and grant application under the Oklahoma Flood Hazard Mitigation Program.
- F. By September 1, 2019, the State Hazard Mitigation Team, with the assistance and participation of additional state agencies as appropriate, shall develop recommendations for the state to safeguard against the threat of an electromagnetic pulse (EMP) attack. The recommendations shall include the following:

2. The identification and development of technical and electronic resources to assist the team in its duties;

- 3. The implementation of a program to educate owners and operators of infrastructure and public utilities and emergency responders about the threat of and course of action following an EMP attack;
- 4. The determination of infrastructure and public utilities that are most at risk from an EMP attack;
- 5. The evaluation of emergency planning and disaster response preparedness in case of EMP attack;
  - 6. The evaluation and identification of available technologies to improve the security and resiliency of infrastructure and public utilities against an EMP attack; and
- 7. The evaluation and assessment of the capabilities of infrastructure and public utilities to recover following an EMP attack.
- No later than November 1, 2019, the team shall presents its
  recommendations for implementation of a comprehensive plan to
  protect infrastructure and utility facilities of this state against
  the threat of an EMP attack to the Governor, the President proTempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
