8	An Act relating to teachers; creating the Oklahoma Teacher Loan Repayment Program Act; providing short

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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-212 of Title 70, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
22	Teacher Loan Repayment Program Act".
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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-213 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. 1. There is hereby established the Oklahoma Teacher Loan
Repayment Program. The Commission for Educational Quality and
Accountability shall administer the Oklahoma Teacher Loan Repayment
Program.

8 2. The program shall provide educational loan repayment 9 assistance to qualifying teachers who teach in an Oklahoma public 10 school for three (3) consecutive years and who meet the criteria set 11 forth in subsection B of this section.

3. Each award shall be distributed at the end of the third 12 consecutive year in which a qualifying teacher meeting the criteria 13 set forth in subsection B of this section has taught. The award 14 shall be paid directly to the financial institution that holds the 15 qualifying teacher's student loans in an amount not to exceed Five 16 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or the total principal and interest of 17 the guaranteed student loans owed by the gualifying teacher at the 18 end of the third year, whichever is less. Prior to any 19 distribution, the Commission shall certify and properly review 20 reports submitted by the qualifying teacher detailing compliance 21 with the criteria set forth in subsection B of this section. 22 B. A certified teacher shall be eliqible to participate in the 23

24 loan repayment program if the teacher:

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1. Graduated from high school after June 30, 2015;

Graduated with a grade point average ranking them in the top
 twenty percent (20%) of the graduating class or has an American
 College Testing Program (ACT) score or Scholastic Aptitude Test
 (SAT) score that falls within the eighty (80) to one hundred (100)
 percentile levels;

3. Graduated from an institution within The Oklahoma State
8 System of Higher Education with a minimum 3.5 grade point average on
9 a 4.0 scale; and

4. Teaches at an Oklahoma public school for three (3)
consecutive years in a geographic area recognized by the Commission
as having a shortage of licensed, full-time teachers or in a
critical shortage subject area, including but not limited to
science, technology, engineering, mathematics and special education.
The teacher is not required to teach at the same public school for
three (3) consecutive years.

17 C. A qualifying teacher must apply for loan repayment18 assistance on a form provided by the Commission.

D. To receive loan repayment assistance pursuant to this act,the qualifying teacher shall:

Apply for loan repayment assistance not later than twenty four (24) months after graduating from an institution within The
 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education; and

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2. Enter into a contract with the Commission agreeing to the
 terms and conditions upon which the loan repayment assistance will
 be granted.

4 E. The Commission shall promulgate rules to implement the5 provisions of this section.

F. The Commission shall maintain complete and accurate recordsin implementing the program, including but not limited to:

8 1. The receipt, disbursement and uses of money from the
9 Oklahoma Teacher Loan Repayment Revolving Fund created in Section 3
10 of this act;

The number of applications for loan repayment assistance;
 The number of applicants in receipt of loan repayment
 assistance.

14 G. The Commission shall submit a report on the program to the 15 Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the 16 President Pro Tempore of the Senate beginning December 1, 2016, and 17 each December 1 thereafter.

18 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-214 of Title 70, unless there 20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability to be designated the "Oklahoma Teacher Loan Repayment Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year

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1	limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit
2	of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund
3	are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the
4	Commission to provide loan repayment assistance. Expenditures from
5	the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer
6	against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the
7	Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
8	payment.
9	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
10	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
