6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to daylight saving time; establishing  
8 standard time in this state; specifying effect on  
9 certain actions; declaring that Oklahoma shall not  
10 observe the federal daylight saving time; authorizing  
11 future action; providing for codification; and  
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.26 of Title 25, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. The standard time in Oklahoma shall be known as Central  
18 Standard Time (CST).

19 B. This section shall not be construed to affect the standard  
20 time established by United States law governing the movements of  
21 common carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for  
22 performance of an act by an officer or department of the United  
23 States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or  
24 regulation of the United States or an agency hereof.

1 C. As authorized by the Uniform Time Act of 1966, as amended,  
2 and notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary by  
3 the United States government relating to adoption of daylight saving  
4 time by all the states, this state elects to not observe daylight  
5 saving time and elects to continue in force the terms of subsection  
6 A of this section relating to the year-round standard time in  
7 Oklahoma.

8 D. The adopting of daylight saving time as provided for in this  
9 section may be changed by future legislative action.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
