8 An Act relating to pharmacy; authorizing licensed  
9 pharmacist to compound certain nonsterile  
10 preparations for specified individuals under certain  
11 conditions; limiting amount in stock; authorizing  
12 licensed pharmacist to dispense and ship certain  
13 nonsterile preparations to specified individuals  
14 under certain conditions; prohibiting certain  
15 shipments; specifying applicability of section;  
16 providing for codification; and providing an  
17 effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 353.19A of Title 59, unless  
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. A licensed pharmacist may compound one or more nonsterile  
23 preparations for office use by a licensed practitioner pursuant to a  
24 valid order or orders by the licensed practitioner. This subsection  
shall apply to a preparation containing either prescription or  
nonprescription ingredients, or both.

1 B. 1. A licensed pharmacist may compound one or more non-  
2 sterile preparations consisting only of nonprescription ingredients  
3 for over-the-counter use by one or more customers or anticipated  
4 customers. Such preparations shall not require a prescription.

5 2. The amount in stock at any given time of each preparation  
6 for over-the-counter use shall not exceed what the pharmacist  
7 reasonably believes would be necessary to fill two weeks' worth of  
8 orders.

9 3. A licensed pharmacist may dispense or ship one or more non-  
10 sterile preparations for over-the-counter use to a customer if:

11 a. the preparation was compounded in compliance with  
12 paragraph 1 of this subsection, and

13 b. the pharmacist deems the preparation to be appropriate  
14 for the customer.

15 4. A pharmacist shall not ship any preparations for over-the-  
16 counter use out of this state. No more than ten percent (10%) of  
17 the volume of any one preparation shall be shipped to a customer or  
18 customers outside of a fifty-mile radius of the pharmacy.

19 C. This section shall apply to any pharmacist who owns, is  
20 employed by or is under contract with any pharmacy licensed by the  
21 State Board of Pharmacy and located in this state. This section  
22 shall not be construed to apply only to certain types of pharmacies  
23 including, but not limited to, a compounding pharmacy.

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SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
