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7	An Act relating to student testing; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as last amended by Section 8,
8	Chapter 430, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1210.508), which relates to criterion-referenced
9	tests; prohibiting the State Board of Education from developing and administering tests for grades three
10	through eight not required by federal law; removing requirement for testing in certain subjects and
11	certain grades; changing reference to certain tests; removing a requirement for a fine arts assessment and
12	report; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as
18	last amended by Section 8, Chapter 430, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp.
19	2014, Section 1210.508), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 1210.508. A. 1. The State Board of Education shall
21	develop and administer a series of criterion-referenced tests
22	designed to indicate whether the subject matter standards, as
23	defined by the State Board of Education, which Oklahoma public
24	school students are expected to have attained have been achieved.

The Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, the Board may shall
not develop and or administer any criterion-referenced test for
grades three through eight in any subject not required by federal
law, contingent upon the availability of funding. Students who do
not perform at least at the proficient level on tests shall be
remediated, subject to the availability of funding.

Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
criterion-referenced tests for grades three and four in:

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## reading/English language arts, and

b. mathematics.

3. Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shalladminister criterion-referenced tests for grade five in:

- 14
- a. reading/English language arts,
- 15 b. mathematics, and
- 16 c. science<sub>7</sub>
- 17 d. social studies, which shall consist of the history,
- 18

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Constitution and government of the United States, and geography, and

20 e. writing of English.

4. Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
criterion-referenced tests for grades six and seven in:

a. reading/English language arts, and

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b. mathematics.

## 2 In addition, the Board shall administer a criterion-referenced 3 test in geography in grade seven.

5. Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shall 4 5 administer criterion-referenced tests for grade eight in:

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## reading/Enlgish language arts, a.

- b. mathematics, and
- science-8 с.
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<del>d.</del> social studies, which shall consist of the history, Constitution, and government of the United States, and writing of English. e.

12 The Board shall administer the tests for grade eight in reading/English language arts and mathematics online with raw score 13 test results reported immediately and complete results reported in 14 less than two (2) weeks beginning in the 2007-08 school year. 15

6. Except as otherwise provided for in Section 1210.523 of this 16 title, each student who completes the instruction for English II, 17 English III, United States History, Biology I, Algebra I, Geometry, 18 and Algebra II at the secondary level shall complete an end-of-19 instruction test, when implemented, to measure for attainment in the 20 appropriate subject matter standards in order to graduate from a 21 public high school with a standard diploma. All students shall take 22 the tests prior to graduation, unless otherwise exempt by law. 23 The State Board of Education shall administer the criterion-referenced 24

1 tests. The Board shall develop and field test the end-ofinstruction tests in English III, Geometry, and Algebra II during 2 3 the 2006-07 school year, implement the tests during the 2007-08 school year, and administer them each year thereafter. The Board 4 5 shall administer the multiple choice portion of the end-ofinstruction tests online with raw score test results reported 6 7 immediately and complete results reported in less than two (2) weeks beginning in the 2008-09 school year. 8

9 The end-of-instruction tests shall serve the purpose of the 10 criterion-referenced tests as provided in paragraph 1 of this subsection. The English II and English III end-of-instruction tests 11 12 shall include a writing component. Students who do not score at least at the proficient level shall be afforded the opportunity to 13 retake each test up to three (3) times each calendar year until at 14 least achieving at the proficient level. In order to provide an 15 indication of the levels of competency attained by the student in a 16 permanent record for potential future employers and institutions of 17 higher education, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior 18 to the 2007-08 school year, school districts shall report the 19 highest-achieved state test performance level on the end-of-20 instruction tests on the student's high school transcript. 21 Beginning with students who enter the ninth grade in the 2008-09 22 school year, school districts shall report the highest-achieved 23 state test performance level on the end-of-instruction tests and any 24

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business and industry-recognized endorsements attained on the student's high school transcript. Any student at the middle school level who completes the instruction in a secondary course specified in this paragraph shall be administered the appropriate end-ofinstruction test.

- 6 7. a. Each school district shall administer to each student
   7 in the school district in grades three through eight
   8 an assessment designed to assess the student in the
   9 fine arts area in which the student has received
   10 instruction.
- 11b. Each school district shall prepare an annual report12for approval by the State Board of Education outlining13the fine arts assessment strategies used by the14district, when the assessments were administered, how15many students were assessed during the previous year,16and the results of the assessments.

1. All criterion-referenced tests required by this section 17 в. shall measure academic competencies in correlation with the subject 18 matter standards adopted by the Board pursuant to Sections 11-103.6 19 and 11-103.6a of this title. The State Board of Education shall 20 evaluate the subject matter standards to ensure the competencies 21 reflect high standards, are specific, well-defined, measurable, 22 challenging, and will prepare elementary students for next-grade-23 level course work and secondary students for postsecondary studies 24

1 at institutions of higher education or technology center schools 2 without the need for remediation. All subject matter standards 3 shall reflect the goals as set forth in Section 11-103.6 of this 4 title and of improving the state average ACT score.

5 2. The State Department of Education shall annually evaluate the results of the criterion-referenced tests. The State Board of 6 7 Education shall ensure that test results are reported to districts in a manner that yields detailed, diagnostic information for the 8 9 purpose of guiding instruction and student remediation. As 10 improvements are made to the criterion-referenced tests required by 11 this section, the Board shall seek to increase the depth of 12 knowledge assessed for each subject. The State Board of Education shall seek to ensure that data yielded from the tests required in 13 this section are utilized at the school district level to prescribe 14 reinforcement and/or remediation by requiring school districts to 15 develop and implement a specific program of improvement based on the 16 test results. 17

3. The State Board of Education in coordination with the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability shall review, realign, and recalibrate, as necessary, the tests in reading/English language arts and mathematics in third through eighth grade and the end-ofinstruction tests. The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall determine the cut scores for the performance levels on the end-of-instruction tests developed pursuant to

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paragraph 6 of subsection A of this section. The Commission shall
 conduct an ongoing review to compare the end-of-instruction test
 content and performance descriptors with those of other states.
 Upon receipt of the review, the Commission may adjust the cut scores
 as necessary.

4. The State Board of Education, for the purposes of conducting 6 reliability and validity studies, monitoring contractor adherence to 7 professionally accepted testing standards, and providing 8 9 recommendations for testing program improvement, shall retain the 10 services of an established, independent agency or organization that 11 is nationally recognized for its technical expertise in educational 12 testing but is not engaged in the development of aptitude or achievement tests for elementary or secondary level grades. 13 These national assessment experts shall annually conduct studies of the 14 reliability and validity of the end-of-instruction tests 15 administered pursuant to this section. Validity studies shall 16 include studies of decision validity and concurrent validity. 17 1. The State Board of Education shall set the testing 18 С. window dates for each criterion-referenced test required in 19 paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades 20 three through eight so that, with the exception of the writing 21  $assessments_{r}$  the tests are administered to students no earlier than 22 April 10 each year and so that the test results are reported back to 23 school districts in a timely manner. Each criterion-referenced test 24

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1 required in paragraph 6 of subsection A of this section may be 2 administered to students at a time set by the State Board of 3 Education as near as possible to the end of the course; provided, if a school district is unable to administer the tests online to all 4 5 students taking the test for the first time and all students retaking the test during the testing window time set by the Board, 6 the school district may elect to administer any of the tests to 7 students retaking the test at any time not more than two (2) weeks 8 9 prior to the start of the testing window time set by the Board. All 10 results and reports of the criterion-referenced test series required 11 in paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades 12 three through eight shall be returned to each school district prior 13 to the beginning of the next school year. The vendor shall provide a final electronic data file of all school site, school district, 14 15 and state results to the State Department of Education and the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability prior to September 16 1 of each year. The Department shall forward the final data files 17 for each school district and each school site in that district to 18 the school district. The Board shall ensure the contract with the 19 testing vendor includes a provision that the vendor report test 20 results directly to the Office of Educational Quality and 21 Accountability at the same time it is reported to the Board. 22 2. State, district, and site level results of all tests 23

required in this section shall be disaggregated by gender, race,

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1 ethnicity, disability status, migrant status, English proficiency, 2 and status as economically disadvantaged, except that such 3 disaggregation shall not be required in a case in which the number of students in a category is insufficient to yield statistically 4 5 reliable information or the results would reveal personally identifiable information about an individual student. Each school 6 site shall notify the student's parents of the school's performance 7 levels in the Oklahoma School Testing Program as reported in the 8 9 Oklahoma Educational Indicators Program at the end of each school 10 year.

The State Board of Education shall be responsible for the 11 D. development, field-testing, and validation of the criterion-12 referenced test series required in subsection A of this section. 13 In the interest of economy the Board may participate in a multistate or 14 multigovernmental cooperative pursuant to the requirements of The 15 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, but shall not bind the state, 16 contractually or otherwise, to the authority of any other state, 17 organization or entity which may supersede the authority of the 18 Board, for the purpose of adapting criterion-referenced tests, to 19 the extent that such tests are appropriate for use in the testing 20 program to be administered to Oklahoma students. 21

E. The State Board of Education shall develop, administer, and incorporate as a part of the Oklahoma School Testing Program, other testing programs or procedures, including appropriate accommodations

1 for the testing of students with disabilities as required by the 2 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 USC, Section 3 1400 et seq.

F. For purposes of developing and administering alternate 4 5 assessments for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities, the State Board of Education shall not be subject to 6 subsections D and E of Section 11-103.6a of this title. 7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015. 8 9 SECTION 3.
