10	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 330.53, as
1112	amended by Section 1, Chapter 241, O.S.L. 2016 (63 O.S. Supp. 2016,
13	Section 330.53), is amended to read as follows:
14	Section 330.53. A. The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for
15	Long-Term Care Administrators shall have authority to issue licenses
16	or certifications to qualified persons as long-term care
17	administrators, and shall establish qualification criteria for each
18	type of long-term care administrator.
19	B. No license or certification shall be issued to a person as a
20	long-term care administrator unless:
21	1. The person shall have submitted evidence satisfactory to the
22	Board that the person is:
23	a. not less than twenty-one (21) years of age, and
24	b. of reputable and responsible character; and

2. The person shall have submitted evidence satisfactory to the Board of the person's ability to supervise the defined facility type in which he or she is licensed or certified to serve as a long-term care administrator.

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- 5 C. All persons currently licensed or certified or lawfully serving as an administrator in their defined facility type shall be 6 7 permitted to continue to serve in their current capacity under their current terms of authorization. The Board may promulgate rules 9 pursuant to Section 330.57 of this title to address future 10 certification and licensure requirements for all long-term care administrator types without effect on the licensure or certification 11 12 status of those currently certified or licensed. The Board shall not include a requirement for a two-year or four-year degree or 13 proof of a passing score on the National Association of Long Term 14 15 Care Administrator Boards Exam (NAB) or Board certified internship 16 or preceptorship in any future licensing or certification requirements for assisted living, residential care or adult day care 17 administrators. Until such rules are promulgated, current licensure 18 and certification processes and standards shall remain in place. 19
 - D. The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Long-Term Care
 Administrators shall, on or before July 1, 2017, promulgate rules
 permitting eligible applicants to sit for the state standards
 examination at a testing facility using procedures approved by the
 National Association of Long-Term Care Administrator Board,

1	including but not limited to the use of electronic or online methods
2	for examination.
3	E. The Oklahoma State Board of Examiners for Long-Term Care
4	Administrators shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of
5	this section.
