13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-270, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1-270. A. As funding permits, the <u>The</u> State Department
17	of Health shall establish a statewide coordinated system of care for
18	stroke, which shall include special focus and attention on timely
19	access to care, diagnosis, and the most advanced treatment for
20	persons most disproportionately affected by stroke. Such system
21	shall include, but shall not be limited to:
22	1. Recommendations from the Oklahoma Hospital Advisory Council
23	and other appropriate advisory councils at the discretion of the
24	State Commissioner of Health;

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2. Partnerships with relevant associations;

- 3. Measures to raise awareness about the effects of <u>risk</u> factors for stroke, such as uncontrolled high blood pressure, tobacco use, and diabetes; and
- 4. Promotion of adherence to primary and secondary stroke recognition, and prevention guidelines by health care professionals, including emergency medical services providers, such as emergency medical responders and transport providers, and hospital emergency room and health clinic personnel.
- B. The Division of Emergency Medical Services and all local and regional emergency medical services authorities statewide shall establish and follow pre-hospital care protocols related to the assessment, treatment, and transport of stroke patients by certified emergency medical responders. Such protocols shall include, at a minimum, plans for the triage and transport of acute stroke patients, within a specified timeframe of onset of symptoms.
- $\underline{\text{C.}}$ The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules as necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
- 19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
