L3	A. As used in this section, "powdered alcohol" means alcohol

L8	powdered alcohol.
L 9	C. It is unlawful for a holder of a license pursuant to the
20	provisions of this chapter for on-premises or off-premises
21	consumption of alcoholic liquors to use powdered alcohol as an
22	alcoholic beverage.
23	D. Any person or license holder that violates this section is

guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished as follows:

1	1. For a first offense, by a fine of not more than Three
2	Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment for not more than
3	thirty (30) days or by both;
4	2. For a second offense, by a fine of not more than Seven
5	Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) or by imprisonment for not more than
6	six (6) months or by both; or
7	3. For a third or subsequent offense, by a fine of not more
8	than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or by imprisonment for not
9	more than two (2) years or by both.
