18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Foster Parent
19	Accountability Act of 2015".
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-9-107.2 of Title 10A, unless
22	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	A. Beginning November 1, 2015, foster parents in this state
24	having custody of a child age fifteen (15) years or older shall be

required to submit quarterly reports on transitional plans for children in their custody to the Department of Human Services. Transitional reports shall include, but not be limited to, the child's understanding of health maintenance, housing, postsecondary educational options, employment opportunities, acquisition of essential documents such as Social Security cards and state identification cards, and interpersonal communication skills.

B. Child welfare specialists shall keep a record of annual
transition plans submitted by foster parents and ensure that such
records are delivered to the Department. It shall be the duty of
child welfare supervisors to ensure that child welfare specialists
submit transition plans in a timely manner. The provisions of this
subsection shall not apply to therapeutic foster care caseworkers.

14 C. The Department of Human Services shall promulgate and adopt 15 rules for the provisions of this section.

16 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-9-107.3 of Title 10A, unless 18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 The Department of Human Services shall submit annual reports on 20 the implementation of the provisions of this act to the Chair and 21 Vice Chair of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee and the 22 Chair and Vice Chair of the House of Representatives Human Services 23 Committee. Such reports shall include, but not be limited to, the 24 number of foster parents complying with the reports required by this
