Supp. 2014, Sections 34.2 and 34.37), which relate to the Oklahoma State Finance Act; specifying 8 certain duties of State Board of Equalization, 9 Oklahoma Tax Commission and certain state agencies; modifying date upon which Governor's budget must be submitted to Legislature; providing an effective 10 date; and declaring an emergency. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 13 SECTION 1. 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.2, as 14 AMENDATORY amended by Section 333, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp. 15 2014, Section 34.2), is amended to read as follows: 16 Section 34.2. A. Agencies responsible for the collection of 17 monies deposited to the credit of the General Revenue Fund and each 18 of the Special Revenue Funds shall be subject to the provisions of 19 this act the Oklahoma State Finance Act. Upon request of the 20 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, these 21 agencies shall provide the Director of the Office of Management and 22 Enterprise Services an itemized estimate of funds expected to accrue 23

to the General Revenue Fund and each of the Special Revenue Funds

for the ensuing fiscal year in the manner and form established by the Director, in accordance with the duties assigned to the State Board of Equalization in Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution. Each of these agencies shall also provide to the Director, as requested, a written explanation of the methodology and relevant assumptions used in developing the revenue estimates submitted, a statement of the prior year's actual revenue collections and a projection of the current year's revenue collections. No expenditure shall be made from any General Revenue Fund or Special Revenue Fund until such fund has been assigned to an agency by law or by the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

B. In addition to providing the information listed above, the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall also provide to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services a comprehensive economic report no later than two (2) weeks prior to each of the meetings of the State Board of Equalization pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 3 of Section 23 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. Each report shall include a summary of recent national and state economic performance and a forecast of national and state economic performance for both the current and the upcoming fiscal years. These reports shall be considered a basis upon which the itemized revenue estimates of the Commission are developed. The report shall include an analysis of the relative accuracy of the

- 1 economic forecasts on which the previous and current fiscal years'
 2 revenue estimates were based.
 - C. The Tax Commission shall also provide all estimates, explanations, statements, projections, reports, and other documents required by this section to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives at the same time that such documents are provided to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
 - D. The State Board of Equalization, the Tax Commission, and each agency responsible for the collection of state monies shall:
 - 1. Utilize best practices employed in this or other states in developing the methodology and assumptions used in determining the estimates required by this section;
 - 2. Periodically review such methodology and assumptions; and
 - 3. Be authorized to consult with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, institutions of higher education, and any other resource to enable it to determine the best practices which will result in the most accurate revenue estimate possible.

Section 34.37. Immediately after the beginning of each regular
session of the Legislature Except as otherwise provided in Section
34.44 of this title, on the first Monday in February of each year,

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1 the Governor shall submit to the presiding officer of each house of 2 the Legislature, copies of the budget based upon the investigations 3 and conclusions of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. Such budget document shall contain a complete and itemized plan of 5 all proposed expenditures for each agency or undertaking classified according to the various cabinet areas designated by the Governor or 6 otherwise created by law. Such expenditures shall be further 7 classified by function, character, and object, and in the event such 9 proposed expenditures exceed the estimate made by the State Board of 10 Equalization, the Governor shall accompany the budget document with 11 a proposal of new revenue-raising measures sufficient to effect a

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.44, is amended to read as follows:

balanced budget for the ensuing fiscal year.

Section 34.44. In any year in which a Governor-elect assumes office, the budget shall be the budget of the new Governor and shall be submitted to the Legislature by the new Governor on February 15 or the first day that both houses of the Legislature are in session thereafter. The Division of the Budget shall render to the Governor-elect all possible assistance in the preparation of the budget. The Governor and agencies of the state shall furnish the Governor-elect estimates and other budget information, in order that the Governor-elect may discharge effectively his or her budget responsibilities upon assuming office.
