NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-225 of Title 43A, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 A. As used in this section, "emergency opioid antagonist" means 19 a drug including but not limited to naloxone that blocks the effects 20 of opioids and that is approved by the United States Food and Drug 21 Administration for the treatment of an opioid overdose. 22 B. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act, 23

the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall

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- designate a physician, licensed in this state and in good standing,
 to issue a statewide standing order for emergency opioid antagonists
 under the provisions of this section.
 - C. Within thirty (30) days of being designated under subsection B of this section, the physician shall issue a standing order that:
 - 1. Authorizes any licensed pharmacist, any other health care provider licensed or certified in this state, or any mental health or substance abuse provider licensed or certified in this state to distribute emergency opioid antagonists to any person or entity within this state upon request; and
 - 2. Allows for the possession, storage, distribution, and administration of emergency opioid antagonists by any individual or entity within this state.
 - D. The standing order issued under this section shall remain in effect until the United States Food and Drug Administration classifies at least one emergency opioid antagonist as an over-the-counter (OTC) drug.
 - SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
