BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2011, Section 15.4, as
amended by Section 661, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (73 O.S. Supp.
2016, Section 15.4), is amended to read as follows:
Section 15.4. A. There is hereby authorized the creation of a
not-for-profit corporation to be known as "Friends of the Capitol"
to raise funds and to assist in the preservation and enhancement of
the Oklahoma Capitol and surrounding areas as defined in Section 1
of this title.
B. The board of directors of the corporation authorized in
subsection A of this section shall choose its own chairperson.
C. After proper incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation
is authorized and directed to apply for tax-exempt status under

1 Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C., Section
2 501(c)(3)).

D. In addition to funds received from the general public or other public and private sources, the not-for-profit corporation may receive funds from state agencies at such times and in such amounts as may be appropriated by the Legislature for the Oklahoma Capitol or made available to the corporation from state agencies from their sources of revenue.

9 E. Costs to underwrite activities related to the preservation 10 and enhancement of the Oklahoma Capitol may be borne from revenues 11 of the not-for-profit corporation.

F. Upon the incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation shall be authorized to hire staff and name advisory groups or steering committees as necessary to assist in the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma Capitol.

G. The corporation shall coordinate preservation and,
<u>restoration</u>, enhancement, <u>maintenance and modification</u> projects in
conjunction with and the consent of the Capitol Preservation
Commission and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services
<u>State Capitol Preservation Office</u>.

21 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2011, Section 24, as 22 amended by Section 664, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (73 O.S. Supp. 23 2016, Section 24), is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 24. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services State Capitol Preservation Office shall display the current flag of 2 3 the United States of America, an Oklahoma state flag adopted by the Oklahoma Legislature, the American Ex-Prisoner of War flag, a flag 4 5 to commemorate the centennial of the State of Oklahoma, or a combination thereof at the discretion of the Governor on the 6 7 fourteen flag poles located at the south plaza entrance to the State Capitol Building in the area bounded by the south Capitol Building 8 9 steps on the north and by Northeast 22nd Street on the south. The 10 flags shall be displayed in a dignified manner every day except when the weather is inclement. 11 73 O.S. 2011, Section 26, as 12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY amended by Section 665, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (73 O.S. Supp. 13 2016, Section 26), is amended to read as follows: 14 15 Section 26. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services 16 State Capitol Preservation Office shall cause to be displayed in an appropriate and dignified manner north of the State Capitol Building 17 the current flags, standards, or banners of all federally recognized 18 Native American tribal governments located within the boundaries of 19 the State of Oklahoma. The flags shall be displayed every day 20 except when the weather is inclement. 21 73 O.S. 2011, Section 62.2, as SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 22 amended by Section 666, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (73 O.S. Supp. 23

24 2016, Section 62.2), is amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 62.2. The Executive Director of the Office of 2 Management and Enterprise Services State Capitol Preservation Office 3 is hereby authorized to enter into a written agreement with the Post Office Department of the United States permitting said Department to 4 5 occupy and use adequate quarters in the State Capitol for a post office free of cost to the United States. If additional space is 6 7 needed, the Executive Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services is hereby authorized to enter into written 8 9 agreements providing such additional space in the State Capitol. 10 The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall also be 11 authorized to agree to furnish light, heat, water, janitor service 12 for said post office, and a safe receptacle in which to keep 13 property of the United States.

14SECTION 5.AMENDATORY73 O.S. 2011, Section 83.1, as15last amended by Section 1, Chapter 251, O.S.L. 2015 (73 O.S. Supp.)162016, Section 83.1), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 83.1. A. There is hereby re-created to continue until 18 July 1, 2022, in accordance with the Oklahoma Sunset Law, a Capitol-19 Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission to exercise the 20 functions and perform the duties hereinafter prescribed.

B. The Commission shall be composed of eleven (11) members as follows:

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The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services or his or her designee, who shall be ex officio chair of
 the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission;

4 2. The Director of the Transportation Commission or his or her
5 designee;

6 3. The President of the University of Oklahoma or his or her7 designee;

8 4. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the9 Senate;

10 5. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of 11 Representatives;

12 6. The Chair of the Planning Commission of Oklahoma City or his13 or her designee;

The Chair of the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission
 Executive Director of the State Capitol Preservation Office or his
 or her designee; and

17 8. Two members of the Commission appointed by the Governor,
 18 with the advice and consent of the State Senate, for four-year
 19 staggered terms with one term expiring on January 31 of each even 20 numbered year.

C. One of the two members shall be appointed upon the recommendation of the Citizens' Advisory Committee. The Commission is authorized to appoint and hire a Director, who shall serve as the chief administrative officer of the Commission, and other necessary

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1 personnel. The Attorney General of the State of Oklahoma shall be 2 the legal advisor to the Commission in the same capacity as he or 3 she is to other boards and commissions.

D. At least one of the members appointed by the President Pro
Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
Representatives shall be a resident within the boundaries of the
Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District as set forth
in Section 83 of this title.

9 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY Section 1, House Joint Resolution 10 No. 1033, p. 1742, O.S.L. 2014, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 11 335, O.S.L. 2016 (73 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 345), is amended to 12 read as follows:

Section 345. A. In addition to any other authorization 13 provided by law, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority is 14 15 authorized to issue obligations to acquire real property, together with improvements located thereon, and personal property to 16 construct improvements to real property and to provide funding for 17 repairs, refurbishments and improvements to real and personal 18 property of the State Capitol Building in a total amount not to 19 exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). 20 The funds shall be used for the renovation, repair and remodeling of the 21 State Capitol Building. 22

B. The Authority may hold title to the property andimprovements until such time as any obligations issued for this

purpose are retired or defeased and may lease the property and improvements to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. Upon final redemption or defeasance of the obligations created pursuant to this section, title to the property and improvements shall be transferred from the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

7 C. For the purposes of paying the costs for construction of the real property and improvements, and providing funding for the 8 9 project authorized in subsection A of this section, and for the 10 purpose authorized in subsection D of this section, the Authority is hereby authorized to borrow monies on the credit of the income and 11 12 revenues to be derived from the leasing of such property and improvements and, in anticipation of the collection of such income 13 and revenues, to issue negotiable obligations in a total amount not 14 15 to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) whether issued in one or more series. The Authority is authorized 16 to capitalize interest on the obligations issued pursuant to this 17 section for a period of not to exceed one (1) year from the date of 18 issuance. For subsequent fiscal years, it is the intent of the 19 20 Legislature to appropriate to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services sufficient monies to make rental payments for 21 the purpose of retiring the obligations created pursuant to this 22 section. To the extent funds are available from the proceeds of the 23 borrowing authorized by this subsection, the Oklahoma Capitol 24

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Improvement Authority shall provide for the payment of professional
 fees and associated costs related to the project authorized in
 subsection A of this section.

The Authority may issue obligations in one or more series 4 D. 5 and in conjunction with other issues of the Authority. The Authority is authorized to hire bond counsel, financial consultants, 6 7 and such other professionals as it may deem necessary to provide for the efficient sale of the obligations and may utilize a portion of 8 9 the proceeds of any borrowing to create such reserves as may be 10 deemed necessary and to pay costs associated with the issuance and administration of such obligations. 11

12 Е. The obligations authorized under this section may be sold at either competitive or negotiated sale, as determined by the 13 Authority, and in such form and at such prices as may be authorized 14 by the Authority. The Authority may enter into agreements with such 15 credit enhancers and liquidity providers as may be determined 16 necessary to efficiently market the obligations. The obligations 17 may mature and have such provisions for redemption as shall be 18 determined by the Authority, but in no event shall the final 19 maturity of such obligations occur later than ten (10) years from 20 the first principal maturity date. 21

F. Any interest earnings on funds or accounts created for the purposes of this section may be utilized as partial payment of the annual debt service or for the purposes directed by the Authority.

G. The obligations issued under this section, the transfer
 thereof and the interest earned on such obligations, including any
 profit derived from the sale thereof, shall not be subject to
 taxation of any kind by the State of Oklahoma, or by any county,
 municipality or political subdivision therein.

H. The Authority may direct the investment of all monies in any
funds or accounts created in connection with the offering of the
obligations authorized under this section. Such investments shall
be made in a manner consistent with the investment guidelines of the
State Treasurer. The Authority may place additional restrictions on
the investment of such monies if necessary to enhance the
marketability of the obligations.

I. There is hereby created a State Capitol Repair Expenditure 13 Oversight Committee. The proceeds from the sale of obligations 14 15 issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma 16 Legislature that are needed for repairs to the interior and exterior 17 of the State Capitol shall be subject to the approval of the State 18 Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee; provided, however, 19 the expenditure of those proceeds shall be subject to a request for 20 21 proposal process. The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members as follows: 22

23 1. Three persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom 24 shall serve as chair of the Committee;

1	2. Three legislators to be appointed by the Speaker of the
2	House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the
3	majority political party and one of whom shall be a member of the
4	minority political party; and
5	3. Three legislators to be appointed by the President Pro
6	Tempore of the Senate, two of whom shall be members of the majority
7	political party and one of whom shall be a member of the minority
8	political party.
9	Five members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum and the
10	vote of five members shall be necessary for any action taken by the
11	Committee. The Committee shall be staffed by employees of the
12	Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The Committee shall
13	be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
14	J. The Committee shall deliver a preliminary plan for the
15	renovation, repair and remodeling of the State Capitol to the
16	Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no
17	later than December 31, 2014. The preliminary plan shall include
18	the following components:
19	1. Establishment of the Office of Management and Enterprise
20	Services' goal and criteria for use by the vendor; and
21	2. Selection criteria for the design-build team vendor to be
22	selected through a Request For Proposal process.
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1	K. Following receipt of the preliminary plan as approved by the
2	Committee, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
3	solicit Requests For Proposals to select the vendor for the project.
4	L. The Committee shall deliver a final plan to the Director of
5	the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no later than June
6	30, 2015. The final plan shall include the following components:
7	1. Approval of the final scope of work developed by the vendor;
8	and
9	2. Approval of the project phasing developed by the vendor.
10	M. Following delivery of the final plan, the Committee shall
11	continue to oversee the expenditure of proceeds from the sale of
12	obligations issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and
13	Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the
14	55th Legislature, until completion of the renovation, repair and
15	remodeling of the State Capitol. The Committee may also propose and
16	approve amendments to the plan as it deems appropriate.
17	N. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
18	Services shall have responsibility to substantially implement the
19	plan as presented by the Committee; provided, the President Pro
20	Tempore of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives
21	shall approve all proposed designs related to renovation, repair and
22	remodeling of space within the State Capitol Building under the
23	management and control of the Legislature and allocated to that
24	officer's house of the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of

1	Section 15.1 of this title, and any subsequent changes to such
2	plans. Joint approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
3	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be required
4	for such plans for space under the management and control of the
5	Legislature and not allocated to a specific house of the
6	Legislature. Such approval shall be in writing.
7	O. Insofar as they are not in conflict with the provisions of
8	this section, the provisions of Section 151 et seq. of this title
9	shall apply to this section.
10	SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4101, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	Section 4101. As used in Sections 4101 through $4108$ $4109$ of
13	this title:
14	1. "Public areas" means those areas in the Capitol open to the
15	general public for general visitation; and
16	<del>2.</del> "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the
17	highest quality of art objects available to include paintings,
18	murals, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically
19	aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of
20	skill and creative imagination <u>;</u>
21	2. "Enhancement" means an increase or improvement upon the
22	quality, value or extent of the original design intent of the
23	Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or the respective grounds;
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1	3. "Grounds" means all land surrounding the State Capitol and
2	bordered by Lincoln Boulevard and the land contained within the
3	fence line surrounding the Governor's Mansion;
4	4. "Maintenance" means keeping spaces, structures and
5	infrastructure in proper operating condition in a routine, scheduled
6	or anticipated fashion to prevent failure or degradation;
7	5. "Modification" means any change to an existing physical
8	attribute of the Capitol, Governor's Mansion or the respective
9	grounds;
10	6. "Preservation" means the act or process of applying measures
11	necessary to sustain the existing form, integrity and materials of
12	an historic property. Work, including preliminary measures to
13	protect and stabilize the property, generally focuses upon the
14	ongoing maintenance and repair of historic materials and features,
15	rather than extensive replacement and new construction; and
16	7. "Restoration" means the act or process of accurately
17	depicting the form, features and character of the Capitol as the
18	building appeared in 1917, and the dome in 2002, by means of the
19	removal of features from later periods in its history and
20	reconstruction of missing features from the restoration period. The
21	limited and sensitive upgrading of mechanical, electrical and
22	plumbing systems and other code-required work to make properties
23	functional is appropriate within a restoration project.

1 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4102, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 237, O.S.L. 2015 (74 O.S. Supp. 2 3 2016, Section 4102), is amended to read as follows: Section 4102. There is hereby re-created, to continue until 4 5 July 1, 2019 2022, in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol Preservation Commission which shall be 6 7 responsible for planning and supervising the preservation and restoration of the interior and exterior of the State Capitol 8 9 Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's 10 Mansion. The Commission shall control the display of art objects in 11 public areas of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion. The State 12 Capitol Preservation Commission shall provide the highest quality maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement and modification 13 of and long-term planning for the interior and exterior of the State 14 15 Capitol, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, 16 and the respective grounds for the perpetual use by state government and the enjoyment of all persons. 17 AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4103, as SECTION 9. 18 last amended by Section 13, Chapter 209, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. 7	B. The initial term of office of the appointed members shall be
8	as follows:
9	1. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
10	Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
11	Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of
12	the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a one-year term;
13	2. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
14	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
15	Representatives shall serve a three-year term; and
16	3. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
17	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
18	Representatives shall serve a five-year term.
19	The term of office for each successor shall be for five (5)
20	years. Any member of the Legislature who is appointed to the
21	Commission shall serve only as long as the member is a member of the
22	respective house from which the member was appointed.
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1	All appointed voting and ex officio members of the State Capitol
2	Preservation Commission shall serve at the pleasure of their
3	appointing authority.
4	C. The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its
5	membership to serve for a period of two (2) years The first
6	chairperson of the Commission shall be the Governor who will serve a
7	term of two (2) years. Thereafter, the chair of the Commission will
8	rotate between the Speaker of the House, President Pro Tempore of
9	the Senate and the Governor for two-year increments in perpetuity.
10	Members of the Commission shall not be compensated except for
11	reimbursement as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
12	1. The State Capitol Preservation Commission shall meet at
13	least once per quarter and at the call of the chairperson as needed.
14	2. A quorum of the voting members shall be present for any
15	action taken. A quorum is the majority of the appointed voting
16	members.
17	3. The Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting
18	Act.
19	D. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make
20	the necessary arrangements for support services for the State
21	Capitol Preservation Commission A person shall not be eligible for
22	appointment as the citizen-at-large of the Commission if the person
23	or the person's spouse:
24	1. Is employed by the State of Oklahoma;

1	2. Is a registered lobbyist in Oklahoma;
2	3. Is employed by or participates in the management of a
3	business entity or other organization receiving funds from the State
4	Capitol Preservation Office;
5	4. Owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more than a ten
6	percent (10%) interest in a business entity receiving funds from the
7	State Capitol Preservation Office;
8	5. Is currently a member of the House of Representatives or
9	Senate or has served in such capacity within three (3) years of the
10	appointment date;
11	6. Is currently the Lieutenant Governor, State Auditor and
12	Inspector, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Labor Commissioner,
13	Insurance Commissioner, Superintendent of Public Instruction, or
14	Corporation Commissioner or has served in such capacity within three
15	(3) years of the appointment date; or
16	7. Is currently a district judge or appellate judge or has
17	served in such capacity within three (3) years of the appointment
18	date.
19	E. The Commission functions performed by the Governor,
20	President Pro Tempore, Speaker of the House, Secretary of State, and
21	appointed senator and representative are additional functions of
22	their other public offices and duties.
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1	SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4104, as
2	last amended by Section 14, Chapter 209, O.S.L. 2013 (74 O.S. Supp.
3	2016, Section 4104), is amended to read as follows:
4	Section 4104. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission
5	shall provide oversight and advice to the State Capitol Preservation
6	Office and shall:
7	1. Research, plan, and have control of modifications and decor
8	of the interior and exterior of the Capitol and the Governor's
9	Mansion;
10	2. Establish standards for the acquisition and display of works
11	of art for public display in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion
12	and select such works. Such works of art shall be directly related
13	to the history and culture of the State of Oklahoma;
14	3. Establish procedures by which private contributions of
15	suitable art can be accepted for the Capitol and the Governor's
16	Mansion. The Commission is authorized to accept and make proper
17	disposition of works of art as may be donated to the Commission and
18	this state;
19	4. Have authority to approve and submit to the Long-Range
20	Capital Planning Commission any proposed modification, alteration,
21	renovation, repair, or construction on any part of the Capitol and
22	the Governor's Mansion; and
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1	5. Have final approval authority for any plans or programs for
2	the restoration, preservation, or display of fine art programs in
3	and surrounding the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.
4	B. The Long-Range Capital Planning Commission shall submit any
5	capital construction or renovation project with respect to the State
6	Capitol or the Governor's Mansion to the State Capitol Preservation
7	Commission for its advisory opinion prior to consideration by the
8	Long-Range Capital Planning Commission Provide guidance in the
9	maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement or modification
10	of the Capitol and Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds;
11	2. Review and accept the annual budget and the long-range
12	master plan submitted by the State Capitol Preservation Office for
13	the Capitol, Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds;
14	3. Review and accept all requests for preservation,
15	restoration, enhancement and modification to the Capitol, Governor's
16	Mansion and the respective grounds submitted by the State Capitol
17	Preservation Office. This shall not apply to actions deemed to be
18	maintenance necessary for the upkeep and function of the Capitol,
19	Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds;
20	4. Review and accept a security plan submitted by the State
21	Capitol Preservation Office for the Capitol, Governor's Mansion and
22	the respective grounds;
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1	5. Review and accept administrative rules submitted by the
2	State Capitol Preservation Office concerning the Capitol, Governor's
3	Mansion, the respective contents and the respective grounds;
4	6. Review and adopt preservation zones and design standards
5	submitted by the State Capitol Preservation Office for the Capitol,
6	Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds;
7	7. Review and accept standards for the selection or acquisition
8	of works of art and monuments for permanent and temporary public
9	display in the Capitol, the Governor's Mansion and the respective
10	grounds. Such works of art shall be directly related to the history
11	and culture of the State of Oklahoma. The State Capitol
12	Preservation Commission shall be responsible for designating the
13	location for all works of art and monuments to be displayed;
14	8. Recommend an Executive Director of the State Capitol
15	Preservation Office to be appointed by the Governor;
16	9. Provide for the allocation of physical space in the Capitol
17	to tenants. Each tenant shall be responsible for assigning its
18	membership and personnel to locations within its allotted space; and
19	10. Provide for designation of parking space blocks to be
20	allotted to the tenants in the Capitol. Tenants will be responsible
21	for assignment of individual parking spaces.
22	B. As of the November 1, 2017, the State Capitol Preservation
23	Commission shall assume oversight responsibility of the Capitol
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<u>Restoration Project from the State Capitol Repair Expenditure</u>
 Oversight Committee.

3 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4105.1 of Title 74, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Capitol Preservation Office shall be the custodian 6 Α. 7 of the Capitol, Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds. То aid in these duties, the Office is established under the State 8 9 Capitol Preservation Commission. The Executive Director shall be 10 the head of the Office and shall be recommended by the Commission 11 and appointed by the Governor. The compensation of the Executive 12 Director shall be established by the Governor. All administration and budgetary decisions for the Office shall be made by the 13 Executive Director. 14

B. The duties of the Office are as follows:

The Office shall have the responsibility for maintenance,
 restoration, preservation, enhancement and modification of the
 Capitol, Governor's Mansion and respective grounds including
 facilities planning, facilities construction and facilities
 administration;

2. The Office shall be responsible for all maintenance duties
 necessary to properly preserve and maintain the Capitol, Governor's
 Mansion and the respective grounds;

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3. The Office shall be responsible for devising and developing
 processes for tenants in the Capitol and Governor's Mansion to
 submit requests for maintenance, restoration, preservation,
 enhancement and modification and evaluating such requests;

5 4. The Office shall be responsible for submitting preservation
6 zones and design standards to the State Capitol Preservation
7 Commission;

8 5. The Office shall manage each project to ensure execution of
9 the highest quality work product, time-cost schedules and efficient
10 contract performance;

6. The Office shall be responsible for producing an annual
 budget and submitting it to the State Capitol Preservation
 Commission;

14 7. The Office shall be responsible for creating a long-range 15 master plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the Capitol, 16 Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds which shall be 17 submitted to the State Capitol Preservation Commission every three 18 (3) years;

8. The Office shall be responsible for operation of the visitor
 center, visitor relations activities and tours in the Capitol;

9. The Office shall be responsible for producing educational
 programs and materials related to the Capitol and Governor's Mansion
 and the art, exhibits, monuments, memorials and displays in the
 buildings and on the respective grounds;

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10. The Office shall be responsible for operation of all dining
 and vending services in the Capitol and shall approve food trucks
 and other mobile food preparation vehicles on the grounds;

4 11. The Office shall be responsible for approving all displays,
5 both temporary and permanent, in the Capitol, Governor's Mansion and
6 on the respective grounds;

7 12. The Office shall be responsible for promoting the Capitol,
8 Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds through electronic and
9 print media;

10 13. The Office shall be responsible for taking and approving 11 reservations in all meeting rooms and areas of the Capitol and 12 grounds not allocated to the Legislature by the State Capitol 13 Preservation Commission;

14 14. The Office shall be responsible for approving all events15 and gatherings in the Capitol and on the respective grounds;

16 15. The Office shall be responsible for curation of and care 17 for all exhibits, art, monuments and memorials at the Capitol, 18 Governor's Mansion and the respective grounds;

19 16. The Office shall coordinate with the Department of Public 20 Safety to ensure the safety of all visitors, employees and elected 21 officials who are in the Capitol, Governor's Mansion or on the 22 respective grounds. In cooperation with the Department of Public 23 Safety, a security plan shall be submitted to the State Capitol 24 Preservation Commission every three (3) years;

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1 17. The Office shall be responsible for all maintenance, upkeep 2 and access to all parking lots on the grounds of the Capitol and 3 Governor's Mansion. The Office shall issue window stickers or other 4 means of identification for all vehicles with assigned parking 5 spaces;

18. The Office shall be responsible for submitting proposed
administrative rules to the State Capitol Preservation Commission to
govern the execution of the duties of the Office; and

9 19. The Office may collect rent from third-party vendors in the
10 Capitol and proceeds from the sale of merchandise or services
11 rendered. All revenues collected shall be deposited into the State
12 Capitol Preservation Office Revolving Fund created pursuant to
13 Section 12 of this act.

C. All duties prescribed to the Office in this act currently being conducted in other state agencies will be transferred to the State Capitol Preservation Office on November 1, 2017. All personnel associated with such duties shall be reorganized under the purview of the State Capitol Preservation Office on November 1, 2017.

D. The Executive Director is responsible for ensuring the duties of the Office are carried out in an effective and efficient manner. The Executive Director shall employ all staff and consultants necessary to perform the duties of the Office, including, but not limited to, a deputy director, attorney and

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licensed architect. The Executive Director shall organize personnel
 in the Office to ensure the duties of the Office are properly
 administered.

4 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4107.1 of Title 74, unless there 6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 There is created in the State Treasury the "State Capitol Α. Preservation Office Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing 8 9 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and all collections to 10 the fund are hereby appropriated to the Office. The revolving fund 11 shall consist of any monies received by the Office, pursuant to 12 statutory authority. Monies accruing to the revolving fund herein created may be expended for the same purposes and in the same manner 13 as appropriated funds. 14

B. Expenditures from the revolving fund shall be made pursuant to the laws of the state and the statutes relating to the Office. Warrants for expenditures from the revolving fund shall be drawn by the State Treasurer, based on claims signed by an authorized employee or employees of the Office and approved for payment by the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

21 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4108, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 4108. The provisions of Sections 4101 through 4107 4109 24 of this title shall apply to all modifications in the structure or

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decor of the Capitol and the, Governor's Mansion and the respective
 grounds except for those immediate emergency repairs needed to
 prevent loss or damage to property or to protect the <u>health and</u>
 safety of the public during use of the building.

5 SECTION 14. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4109, as 6 amended by Section 1014, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 7 2016, Section 4109), is amended to read as follows:

Section 4109. By the order of the Director of the Office of 8 9 Management and Enterprise Services, restoration and preservation 10 Maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement and modification 11 projects of the State Capitol, Building or of the Governor's Mansion 12 and the respective grounds may be exempted from the provisions of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, Section 101 et seq. of 13 Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes. For exempted State Capitol 14 15 Building or Governor's Mansion construction projects, the State 16 Capitol Preservation Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall select among contractors qualified by past experience to 17 conduct historical preservation projects. 18

SECTION 15. REPEALER 73 O.S. 2011, Sections 15, as amended by Section 658, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012, 15.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 335, O.S.L. 2016, 15.2, 15.3, 19, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 253, O.S.L. 2013 and 22, as amended by Section 663, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (73 O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 15, 15.1, 19 and 22), are hereby repealed.
