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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10 O.S. 2011, Section 1419, as
14	amended by Section 1, Chapter 278, O.S.L. 2014 (10 O.S. Supp. 2018,
15	Section 1419), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1419. A. The Commission for Rehabilitation Services
17	shall establish and maintain such methods of administration,
18	including methods relating to the establishment and maintenance of
19	personnel standards, as are necessary for the proper and efficient
20	administration of the Oklahoma School for the Blind and the Oklahoma
21	School for the Deaf, and programs thereat; shall maintain records
22	and reports, shall provide a uniform accounting system; and shall
23	incur such expenses and make such expenditures as it deems necessary
24	to maintain and operate such schools.

1 1. Instructional Personnel. The Director of the State В. 2 Department of Rehabilitation Services shall employ or contract with 3 such qualified instructional personnel including, but not limited to, teachers, and such other persons serving in an instructional 4 5 capacity, as the director deems necessary for the proper operation of each school and shall fix their duties and compensation. 6 The superintendent, teachers and other employees shall be eligible for 7 membership or participation in the Teachers' Retirement System of 8 9 Oklahoma to the same extent and on the same basis as teachers and 10 other employees of other state educational institutions and public The Director shall not employ or contract with a person as 11 schools. 12 instructional personnel unless the superintendent of the school has 13 recommended that person. If there is a vacancy in the superintendent position or if the superintendent is unable to make a 14 recommendation within thirty (30) days after a request for a 15 recommendation is made, the Director is authorized to employ or 16 contract with any person without a recommendation from the 17 superintendent. 18

19 2. Career Teacher. A career teacher is a member of the 20 instructional staff who has served in an instructional capacity for 21 three (3) or more consecutive years in either school, or who has 22 served in a public school district in such a way so as to meet the 23 definition of a career teacher as provided for in Section 6-101.3 of

Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Career teacher shall not include
 a school nurse.

3 3. Probationary Teacher. A probationary teacher is a member of 4 the instructional staff who has served in an instructional capacity 5 for less than three (3) consecutive years in either school, or who 6 has served in a public school district in such a way so as to meet 7 the definition of a probationary teacher as provided for in Section 8 6-101.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

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C. Administrative Personnel.

The Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation
 Services shall employ or appoint the superintendent of each school
 and shall fix their duties and compensation. The superintendents
 shall be in the unclassified service.

The Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation 2. 14 Services shall employ or contract with such other administrative 15 personnel as the Director deems necessary for the proper operation 16 17 of each school and shall fix their duties and compensation. The administrative personnel may include, but is not limited to, 18 assistant superintendents, principals, vice-principals and other 19 persons who devote a majority of their time to service in a 20 supervisory or administrative capacity. 21

D. An orientation and mobility specialist employed by the State
Department of Rehabilitation Services to serve at the Oklahoma
School for the Blind shall be accorded the same protection of laws

1 and all other benefits accorded instructional personnel, including 2 but not limited to, the minimum salary level for instructional 3 personnel.

The Commission shall, pursuant to the Administrative 4 E. 1. 5 Procedures Act, adopt personnel policies for instructional and administrative personnel, except for superintendents, that are 6 consistent with the law applicable to public school district 7 employees, including, but not limited to, leave, payment for unused 8 9 personal leave and employment policies, evaluation policy, grievance 10 procedures, professional development, and a minimum salary schedule. The Commission shall initiate a rulemaking process for the personnel 11 12 policies for instructional and administrative personnel no later than October 1, 2003. The minimum salary level for qualified 13 instructional personnel shall meet or exceed the minimum salary 14 level provided for public school teachers in Section 18-114.14 of 15 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes or any additional minimum salary 16 schedule enacted by the Legislature and the Commission shall meet or 17 exceed any other legislatively mandated pay raises for teachers that 18 are not part of the minimum salary schedule. The Department shall 19 notify teachers and other personnel on or before the first Monday in 20 June of each year concerning the renewal of contracts consistent 21 with the requirements for public school teachers as provided for in 22 Section 6-101 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The policy for 23 professional development programs for instructional and 24

administrative personnel shall be consistent with the requirements
 for professional development programs for public school teachers as
 provided in Section 6-194 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

2. Final disciplinary action taken against a member of the 4 5 instructional or administrative staff, except superintendents, including termination or the nonrenewal of a contract, shall be 6 7 subject to the administrative hearing procedures as set forth in Article II of the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act. If the 8 9 final decision of the Director is to terminate or to not renew the 10 contract of a career teacher or administrator, the career teacher or administrator, except superintendent, shall not have a right to 11 12 judicial review pursuant to Article II of the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, but shall have a right to a trial de 13 novo as provided for in Section 1419a of this title. Disciplinary 14 15 action against a probationary teacher shall be final unless otherwise provided for by law. 16

The State Department of Education shall insure that any 17 F. funds which have been received in Oklahoma by the State Department 18 of Education because of students who are enrolled and attending the 19 Oklahoma School for the Blind and the Oklahoma School for the Deaf 20 are transferred to the State Department of Rehabilitation Services 21 for use by these schools in proportion to the number of students 22 enrolled and attending who were the basis for the receipt of these 23 federal funds. 24
