4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 81, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 81. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
8 "Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
9 Aeronautics Act."

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 82, is
11 amended to read as follows:

12 Section 82. As used in the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
13 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act, unless the context
14 otherwise requires:

15 1. "Aeronautics" means the science, art and practice of flight
16 including, but not limited to, transportation by aircraft and
17 matters relating to air commerce; the operation, construction,
18 repair or maintenance of aircraft, aircraft power plants and
19 accessories including the repair, packing and maintenance of
20 parachutes; the design, establishment, construction, extension,
21 operation, improvement, repair or maintenance of airports,
22 restricted landing areas or other air navigation facilities; and
23 instruction in flying or ground subjects pertaining thereto;

1 2. "Aeronautical hazard" means any structure, object of natural
2 growth or use of land, which obstructs the airspace required for the
3 flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an airport that is
4 otherwise hazardous to the operation and navigation of aircraft;

5 3. "Air navigation facility" means any facility used in,
6 available for use in, or designed for use in, aid of air navigation
7 including landing areas, any structures, mechanisms, lights,
8 beacons, markers, communicating systems or other instrumentalities
9 or devices used or useful as an aid, or constituting an advantage or
10 convenience, to the safe taking off, navigation and landing of
11 aircraft, or the safe and efficient operation or maintenance of an
12 airport and any combination of any or all of such facilities;

13 4. "Aircraft" means any contraption now known, or hereafter
14 invented, used or designed for navigation of or flight in the air or
15 airspace;

16 5. "Airman" means any individual who engages, as the person in
17 command, or as a pilot, mechanic or member of the crew, in the
18 navigation of aircraft while under way, and any individual who is
19 directly in charge of the inspection, maintenance, overhauling or
20 repair of aircraft, aircraft engines, propellers and appliances;

21 6. "Airport" means an area of land or water that is used, or
22 intended to be used, for the landing and takeoff of aircraft, and
23 buildings and facilities, if any;

24

1 7. "Airspace" means that portion of the atmosphere overlying a
2 designated geographical area considered as subject to territorial
3 jurisdiction or international law in respect to its use by aircraft,
4 guided missiles, and rockets;

5 8. "Commercial service airport" means an airport meeting the
6 current Federal Aviation Administration definition for commercial
7 service airport;

8 9. "Commission" means the seven members of the Oklahoma
9 Aerospace and Aeronautics Commission as appointed by the Governor;

10 10. "Department" means the Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and
11 Aeronautics;

12 ~~10.~~ 11. "Director" means the Director of the Oklahoma
13 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics of Oklahoma;

14 ~~11.~~ 12. "General aviation airport" means an airport not meeting
15 the criteria for definition as a commercial service or reliever
16 airport;

17 ~~12.~~ 13. "Helipad" means a small, designated area, usually with
18 a prepared surface, on a heliport, airport, landing or takeoff area,
19 apron or ramp, or movement area used for takeoff, landing or parking
20 of helicopters;

21 ~~13.~~ 14. "Heliport" means an area of land, water or structure
22 used or intended to be used for the landing and takeoff of
23 helicopters and includes its buildings and facilities, if any;

24

1 politic and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or other
2 similar representative thereof;

3 ~~19.~~ 20. "Primary commercial service airport" means an airport
4 meeting the current Federal Aviation Administration definition for
5 primary commercial service airport;

6 ~~20.~~ 21. "Reliever airport" means an airport designated by the
7 Federal Aviation Administration as a reliever airport and which
8 provides substantial capacity or instrument training relief to a
9 primary commercial service airport;

10 ~~21.~~ 22. "Resources" means services, facilities, funds,
11 equipment, property, personnel and such other activities as are
12 customarily included within the term;

13 ~~22.~~ 23. "State" or "this state" means the State of Oklahoma;

14 ~~23.~~ 24. "Unmanned aircraft" means an aircraft, as defined in
15 this section, that is operated without the possibility of human
16 intervention from within or on the aircraft; and

17 ~~24.~~ 25. "Unmanned aircraft system" means an unmanned aircraft
18 and associated elements including communication links and components
19 that control the unmanned aircraft that are required for the pilot
20 in command to operate safely and efficiently in the National
21 Airspace System.

22 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 84, is
23 amended to read as follows:

24

1 Section 84. A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Aerospace
2 and Aeronautics Commission, which shall be the successor to the
3 Oklahoma Aviation Commission created by Section 81 et seq. of this
4 title. The Oklahoma Aerospace and Aeronautics Commission shall
5 consist of seven (7) members, who shall be appointed by the Governor
6 and who shall continue in office, as designated by the Governor at
7 the time of appointment, through the last day of the second, third,
8 fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh calendar years, respectively,
9 following the passage of ~~this act~~ Section 81 et seq. of this title,
10 with the initial seventh member remaining in office until the end of
11 the calendar year 1979. The successors of the members initially
12 appointed shall be appointed for terms of six (6) years in the same
13 manner as the members originally appointed under ~~this act~~ Section 81
14 et seq. of this title, except that any person appointed to fill a
15 vacancy shall be appointed only for the remainder of such term.
16 Each member shall serve until the appointment and qualification of a
17 successor. One member shall be appointed from each congressional
18 district and any remaining members shall be appointed from the state
19 at large. However, when congressional districts are redrawn each
20 member appointed prior to July 1 of the year in which such
21 modification becomes effective shall complete the current term of
22 office and appointments made after July 1 of the year in which such
23 modification becomes effective shall be based on the redrawn
24 districts. Appointments made after July 1 of the year in which such

1 modification becomes effective shall be from any redrawn districts
2 which are not represented by a board member until such time as each
3 of the modified congressional districts are represented by a board
4 member. No appointments may be made after July 1 of the year in
5 which such modification becomes effective if such appointment would
6 result in more than two members serving from the same modified
7 district. To qualify for appointment to the Commission, an
8 appointee shall have the following minimum qualifications:

- 9 1. A citizen and bona fide resident of the state; and
- 10 2. Three (3) years' experience in aeronautical activities, such
11 as general aviation, agricultural aviation, airport management, or
12 air carrier operation.

13 Members of the Commission shall receive no salary but shall be
14 entitled to be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses pursuant to
15 the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The members of the Commission
16 may be removed by the Governor for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or
17 malfeasance in office in the manner provided by law for the removal
18 of officers not subject to impeachment.

19 B. 1. A The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Aerospace
20 and Aeronautics shall be appointed by the Commission, ~~who~~ and shall
21 serve at the pleasure of the Commission. The Director shall be
22 appointed with due regard to such person's fitness, by aeronautical
23 education and by knowledge of and recent practical experience in
24 aeronautics for the efficient dispatch of the powers and duties duly

1 vested in and imposed upon the Director. The Director shall devote
2 full time to the duties of the office and shall not be actively
3 engaged or employed in any other business, vocation, or employment,
4 nor shall the Director have any pecuniary interest in or any stock
5 in or bonds of any civil aeronautics enterprise. The Director shall
6 be reimbursed for all traveling and other expenses incurred in the
7 discharge of the official duties of the Director, subject to general
8 statutory limitations on such expenses as contained in the State
9 Travel Reimbursement Act.

10 2. The Director shall be the executive officer of the
11 ~~Commission~~ Department and under its supervision shall administer the
12 provisions of ~~this act~~ Section 81 et seq. of this title and rules,
13 regulations, and orders established thereunder and all other laws of
14 the state relative to aeronautics. The Director shall attend all
15 meetings of the Commission, but shall have no vote. The Director
16 shall be in charge of the offices of the ~~Commission~~ Department and
17 responsible ~~to the Commission~~ for the preparation of reports and the
18 collection and dissemination of data and other public information
19 relating to aerospace and aeronautics. The Director is hereby
20 empowered to execute all contracts entered into by the Commission.

21 3. The Commission may, by written order filed in its office,
22 delegate to the Director any of the powers or duties vested in or
23 imposed upon it by ~~this act~~ Section 81 et seq. of this title. Such
24

1 delegated powers and duties may be exercised by the Director in the
2 name of the Commission.

3 4. The Director shall appoint, subject to the approval of the
4 Commission, such experts, field and office assistants, clerks, and
5 other employees as may be required and authorized for the proper
6 discharge of the functions of the ~~Commission~~ Department.

7 C. The Commission shall, within thirty (30) days after its
8 appointment, organize, adopt a seal, and make such rules and
9 regulations for its administration, not inconsistent herewith, nor
10 inconsistent with, or contrary to, any act of the Congress of the
11 United States or regulations promulgated or standards established
12 pursuant thereto, as it may deem expedient and from time to time
13 amend such rules and regulations. At such organizational meeting it
14 shall elect from among its members a chair, a vice chair, and a
15 secretary, to serve for one (1) year, and annually thereafter shall
16 elect such officers, all to serve until their successors are
17 appointed and qualified. The Commission shall schedule meetings at
18 a convenient time and place as they become necessary. Four (4)
19 members shall constitute a quorum, and no action shall be taken by
20 less than a majority of the Commission. Special meetings may be
21 called as provided by the rules and regulations of the Commission.
22 Regular meetings shall be held at the established offices of the
23 ~~Commission~~ Department, but, whenever the convenience of the public
24 or of the parties may be promoted, or delay or expense may be

1 prevented, the Commission may hold meetings, hearings, or
2 proceedings at any other place designated by it. The ~~Commission~~
3 Department shall report in writing to the Governor on or about
4 January 31 of each year. The report shall contain a summary of the
5 proceedings of the ~~Commission~~ Department during the preceding fiscal
6 year, a detailed and itemized statement of all revenue and of all
7 expenditures made by or ~~in~~ on behalf of the ~~Commission~~ Department,
8 such other information as it may deem necessary or useful, and any
9 additional information which may be requested by the Governor.

10 D. Suitable office space shall be provided by the Office of
11 Management and Enterprise Services for the ~~Commission~~ Department in
12 the City of Oklahoma City, and the ~~Commission~~ Department may incur
13 the necessary expense for office rent, furniture, stationery,
14 printing, incidental expenses, and other necessary expenses needed
15 for the administration of ~~this act~~ Section 81 et seq. of this title.

16 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 84.2, is
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 84.2. A. Beginning July 1, 2002, the Oklahoma
19 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
20 cease to be part of or a division of the Department of
21 Transportation and shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct
22 agency, to be known as the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
23 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics, and not under the Merit
24 System of Personnel Administration. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~

1 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics and the Director
2 of the Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
3 continue to exercise their statutory powers, duties, and
4 responsibilities. All records, property, equipment, assets, monies,
5 matters pending, and funds of the division shall be transferred to
6 the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
7 Aeronautics.

8 B. 1. The number of full-time-equivalent employees for the
9 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
10 Aeronautics shall not be less than ten, nor more than the number of
11 employees currently allowed by law for the Oklahoma Aeronautics
12 Commission division of the Department of Transportation and who
13 transfer to the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
14 Aerospace and Aeronautics pursuant to this section. In no event
15 shall the total full-time-equivalent employees of the Oklahoma
16 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics
17 transferring or electing to remain with the Department of
18 Transportation exceed eighteen full-time-equivalent positions.

19 2. All full-time-equivalent employee positions for the Oklahoma
20 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
21 not be under the Merit System of Personnel Administration and shall
22 be considered unclassified service. All employees shall serve at
23 the pleasure of the Director of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
24 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics.

1 3. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace
2 and Aeronautics and the Department of Transportation may enter into
3 an agreement for the transfer of personnel from the Department of
4 Transportation to the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
5 Aerospace and Aeronautics. No employee shall be transferred to the
6 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
7 Aeronautics except on the freely given written consent of the
8 employee. All classified employees under the Merit System of
9 Personnel Administration who are not transferred to the Oklahoma
10 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
11 retain the status in the class to which the position occupied by the
12 employee on July 1, 2002, is allocated by the Office of Personnel
13 Management. The salary of such an employee shall not be reduced as
14 a result of such position allocation. All employees who are
15 transferred to the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
16 Aerospace and Aeronautics shall not be required to accept a lesser
17 grade or salary than presently received. All employees shall retain
18 leave, sick and annual time earned, and any retirement and longevity
19 benefits which have accrued during their tenure with the Department
20 of Transportation. The transfer of personnel between the state
21 agencies shall be coordinated with the Office of Personnel
22 Management.

23 C. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace
24 and Aeronautics shall be authorized to rent, lease, or own the

1 appropriate office space and property in order to conduct its
2 business. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
3 Aerospace and Aeronautics is authorized to accept gifts, bequests,
4 devises, contributions, and grants, public or private, including
5 federal funds or funds from any other source for use in furthering
6 the purpose of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
7 Aerospace and Aeronautics.

8 D. Funding for the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department
9 of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall be provided for in the
10 appropriation process of the Legislature, in addition to any other
11 funding provided by law. The expenses incurred by the Oklahoma
12 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics as a
13 result of the transfer required by this section shall be paid by the
14 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
15 Aeronautics.

16 E. The division within the Department of Transportation known
17 as the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission shall be abolished by the
18 Transportation Commission after the transfer has been completed.

19 F. The Director of State Finance is directed to coordinate the
20 transfer of assets, funds, allotments, purchase orders, liabilities,
21 outstanding financial obligations or encumbrances provided for in
22 this section. The Department of Central Services shall coordinate
23 the transfer of property and records provided for in this section.

24

1 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 85, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 85. A. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department
4 of Aerospace and Aeronautics and its Director acting under its
5 authority is empowered and directed to encourage, foster, and assist
6 in the development of aerospace and aeronautics in this state and to
7 encourage the establishment of airports and air navigation
8 facilities. It shall cooperate with and assist the federal
9 government, the municipalities of this state, and other persons in
10 the development of aerospace and aeronautics, and shall seek to
11 coordinate the aeronautical activities of these bodies and persons.
12 Municipalities are authorized to cooperate with the ~~Commission~~
13 Department in the development of aeronautics and aeronautical
14 facilities in this state.

15 B. The ~~Commission~~ Department may organize and administer a
16 voluntary program of air-age education in cooperation with the
17 schools, colleges, and for the general public, and may prepare and
18 conduct voluntary flight clinics for airmen and issue such bulletins
19 and publications as may be required.

20 C. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall assist in all aeronautical
21 matters related to emergency management actions in conformance with
22 federal directions and with the Emergency Operations Plan of the
23 state.

24

1 D. The ~~Commission~~ Department may establish air markers
2 throughout the state.

3 E. The ~~Commission~~ Department may purchase and install roadside
4 signs directing highway traffic to airports, subject to approval of
5 the State Transportation Commission.

6 F. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall:

7 1. Draft and recommend necessary legislation to advance the
8 interests of the state in aerospace and aeronautics;

9 2. Represent the state in aeronautical matters before federal
10 agencies and other state agencies; and

11 3. Participate as party plaintiff or defendant or as intervener
12 on behalf of the state or any municipality or citizen thereof in any
13 proceeding which involves the interest of the state in aerospace or
14 aeronautics.

15 G. 1. The ~~Commission~~ Department may, insofar as is reasonably
16 possible, make available its engineering and other technical
17 services to any municipality or person desiring them in connection
18 with the planning, acquisition, construction, improvement,
19 maintenance, or operation of airports or navigation facilities.

20 2. The ~~Commission~~ Department may render financial assistance by
21 grant or loan or both to any municipality or municipalities acting
22 jointly in the planning, acquisition, construction, improvement,
23 maintenance, or operation of an airport owned or controlled, or to
24 be owned or controlled, by such municipality or municipalities, out

1 of appropriations or other monies made available by the Legislature
2 for such purposes. Such financial assistance may be furnished in
3 connection with federal or other financial aid for the same
4 purposes.

5 3. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall be designated as the agent
6 of this state or political subdivision of this state for the purpose
7 of applying for, receiving, administering and disbursing federal
8 funds and other public monies for the benefit of general aviation
9 airports, except reliever airports, as may be available under
10 applicable federal law or other laws. If requested by a political
11 subdivision, the ~~Commission~~ Department may act as its or their agent
12 in contracting for and supervising such planning, acquisition,
13 construction, improvement, maintenance, or operation; and all
14 political subdivisions are authorized to designate the ~~Commission~~
15 Department as their agent for the foregoing purposes. The
16 ~~Commission~~ Department, as principal on behalf of the state, may
17 enter into any contracts with the United States or with any person,
18 which may be required in connection with a grant or loan of federal
19 monies for municipal airport or air navigation facility purposes.
20 All federal monies accepted under this section shall be accepted and
21 transferred or expended by the ~~Commission~~ Department upon such terms
22 and conditions as are prescribed by the United States. All monies
23 received by the ~~Commission~~ Department pursuant to this section shall
24 be deposited in the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of

1 Aerospace and Aeronautics Revolving Fund in the State Treasury and
2 shall be paid out by the ~~Commission~~ Department in accordance with
3 the terms and conditions of any agreement entered into under the
4 provisions of this section.

5 H. 1. The ~~Commission~~ Department is authorized on behalf of and
6 in the name of the state, out of appropriations and other monies
7 made available for such purposes, to plan, zone, establish,
8 construct, enlarge, improve, maintain, equip, operate, regulate,
9 protect, and police airports and air navigation facilities, either
10 within or without the state, including the construction,
11 installation, equipping, maintenance, and operation at such airports
12 of buildings and other facilities for the servicing of aircraft or
13 for the comfort and accommodation of air travelers. However, the
14 regulatory authority shall not extend to any airman employed by, nor
15 to any aeronautics facility or aircraft under the exclusive
16 possession, operation, or control of, a person holding a certificate
17 of public convenience and necessity issued by any agency of the
18 United States to operate as a common carrier by air of persons
19 and/or property in interstate commerce. For such purposes the
20 ~~Commission~~ Department may, by purchase, gift, devise, or lease,
21 acquire property, real or personal, or any interest therein
22 including easements in aeronautical hazards or land outside the
23 boundaries of an airport or airport site, as are necessary to permit
24 safe and efficient operation of the state airports or to permit the

1 removal, elimination, obstruction-marking or obstruction-lighting of
2 airport hazards, or to prevent the establishment of airport hazards.
3 In like manner the ~~Commission~~ Department may acquire existing
4 airports and air navigation facilities. However, the ~~Commission~~
5 Department shall not acquire or take over any airport or air
6 navigation facility owned or controlled by a municipality of this or
7 any other state without the consent of such municipality. The
8 ~~Commission~~ Department may, by sale, lease, or otherwise, dispose of
9 any such property, airport, air navigation facility, or portion
10 thereof or interest therein. The disposal, by sale, lease, or
11 otherwise, shall be in accordance with the laws of this state
12 governing the disposition of other property of the state, except
13 that, in the case of disposals to any municipality or state
14 government or the United States for aeronautical purposes incident
15 thereto, the sale, lease, or other disposal may be effected in such
16 manner and upon such terms as the ~~Commission~~ Department may deem in
17 the best interest of the state.

18 2. All airports owned by the state shall be within the primary
19 jurisdiction of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
20 Aerospace and Aeronautics for purposes of design, development, and
21 operation; provided, that airports owned and operated by the
22 Oklahoma Space Industry Development Authority shall be exempt from
23 such provisions, and during the time of a national emergency, the
24 Air National Guard shall be exempt from such provisions, and

1 provided further, that any airport owned by the state may be leased
2 by the ~~Commission~~ Department to a public or private agency, as it
3 may deem fit.

4 3. Nothing contained in the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
5 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act shall be construed to
6 limit any right, power, or authority of the state or a municipality
7 to regulate airport hazards by zoning.

8 4. The ~~Commission~~ Department may exercise any powers granted by
9 this section jointly with any municipalities or with the United
10 States.

11 5. a. In operating an airport or air navigation facility
12 owned or controlled by the state, the ~~Commission~~
13 Department may enter into contracts, leases, and other
14 arrangements for a term not exceeding twenty-five (25)
15 years with any persons granting the privilege of using
16 or improving such airport or air navigation facility
17 or any portion or facility thereof or space therein
18 for commercial purposes; conferring the privilege of
19 supplying goods, commodities, things, services, or
20 facilities at such airport or air navigation facility;
21 or making available services to be furnished by the
22 ~~Commission~~ Department or its agents at such airport or
23 air navigation facility.

1 In each such case the ~~Commission~~ Department may
2 establish the terms and conditions and fix the
3 charges, rentals, or fees for the privileges or
4 services, which shall be reasonable and uniform for
5 the same class of privileges or services and shall be
6 established with due regard to the property and
7 improvements used and the expenses of operation to the
8 state; provided, that in no case shall the public be
9 deprived of its rightful, equal, and uniform use of
10 the airport, air navigation facility or portion or
11 facility thereof.

- 12 b. The ~~Commission~~ Department may by contract, lease, or
13 other arrangement, upon a consideration fixed by it,
14 grant to any qualified person for a term not to exceed
15 twenty-five (25) years the privilege of operating, as
16 agent of the state or otherwise, any airport owned or
17 controlled by the state; provided, that no such person
18 shall be granted any authority to operate the airport
19 other than as a public airport or to enter into any
20 contracts, leases, or other arrangements in connection
21 with the operation of the airport which the ~~Commission~~
22 Department might not have undertaken under
23 subparagraph a of this paragraph.
24

1 c. To enforce the payment of any charges for repairs to,
2 or improvements, storage, or care of, any personal
3 property made or furnished by the ~~Commission~~
4 Department or its agents in connection with the
5 operation of an airport or air navigation facility
6 owned or operated by the state, the state shall have
7 liens on such property, which shall be enforceable by
8 the ~~Commission~~ Department as provided by law.

9 6. In accepting federal monies under this section, the
10 ~~Commission~~ Department shall have the same authority to enter into
11 contracts on behalf of the state as is granted to the ~~Commission~~
12 Department under paragraph 3 of subsection G of this section with
13 respect to federal monies accepted on behalf of municipalities. All
14 monies received by the ~~Commission~~ Department pursuant to this
15 section shall be deposited in the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
16 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Revolving Fund in the State
17 Treasury and shall be paid out of the ~~Commission~~ Department Fund in
18 accordance with the terms and conditions of any agreement entered
19 into under the provisions of this section.

20 7. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall grant no exclusive right for
21 the use of any airport or air navigation facility under its
22 jurisdiction. This shall not be construed to prevent the making of
23 contracts, leases, and other arrangements pursuant to paragraph 5 of
24 this subsection.

1 I. The ~~Commission~~ Department may enter into any contracts
2 necessary to the execution of the powers granted it by the Oklahoma
3 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act.
4 All contracts made by the ~~Commission~~ Department, either as the agent
5 of the state or as the agent of any municipality, shall be made
6 pursuant to the laws of the state governing the making of like
7 contracts. When the planning, acquisition, construction,
8 improvement, maintenance, or operation of any airport or air
9 navigation facility is financed wholly or partially with federal
10 monies, the ~~Commission~~ Department as agent of the state or of any
11 municipality may let contracts in the manner prescribed by the
12 federal authorities acting under the laws of the United States and
13 any rules or regulations made thereunder.

14 J. 1. The Commission, the Director, or any officer or employee
15 of the ~~Commission~~ Department designated by it shall have the power
16 to hold investigations, inquiries, and hearings concerning matters
17 covered by the provisions of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
18 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act and the rules,
19 regulations, and orders of the ~~Commission~~ Department. Hearings
20 shall be open to the public and shall be held upon such call or
21 notice as the Commission shall deem advisable. Each member of the
22 Commission, the Director, and every officer or employee of the
23 ~~Commission~~ Department designated by it to hold any inquiry,
24 investigation, or hearing shall have the power to administer oaths

1 and affirmations, certify to all official acts, issue subpoenas, and
2 order the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production
3 of papers, books, and documents. In case of the failure of any
4 person to comply with any subpoena or order issued under the
5 authority of this subsection, or on the refusal of any witness to
6 testify to any matters regarding which he may be lawfully
7 interrogated, it shall be the duty of the district court of any
8 county or of the judge thereof, on application of the ~~Commission~~
9 Department or its authorized representative, to compel obedience by
10 proceedings for contempt, as in the case of disobedience of the
11 requirements of a subpoena issued from such court or a refusal to
12 testify therein.

13 2. In order to facilitate the making of investigations by the
14 ~~Commission~~ Department in the interest of public safety and promotion
15 of aeronautics the public interest requires, and it is therefore
16 provided, that the reports of investigations or hearings, or any
17 part thereof, shall not be admitted in evidence or used for any
18 purpose in any suit, action, or proceeding growing out of any matter
19 referred to in the investigation, hearing, or report thereof, except
20 in case of any suit, action, or proceeding, civil or criminal,
21 instituted by or in behalf of the ~~Commission~~ Department or in the
22 name of the state under the provisions of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
23 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act or other laws
24 of the state relating to aeronautics; nor shall any member of the

1 Commission, or the Director, or any officer or employee of the
2 ~~Commission~~ Department be required to testify to any facts
3 ascertained in, or information gained by reason of, such person's
4 official capacity, or be required to testify as an expert witness in
5 any suit, action, or proceeding involving any aircraft. Subject to
6 the foregoing provisions, the ~~Commission~~ Department may in its
7 discretion make available to appropriate federal, state and
8 municipal agencies information and material developed in the course
9 of its investigations and hearings.

10 K. 1. The ~~Commission~~ Department is authorized to confer with
11 or to hold joint hearings with any agency of the United States in
12 connection with any matter arising under the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
13 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act or relating
14 to the sound development of aerospace and aeronautics.

15 2. The ~~Commission~~ Department is authorized to avail itself of
16 the cooperation, services, records, and facilities of the agencies
17 of the United States as fully as may be practicable in the
18 administration and enforcement of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
19 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Act. The
20 ~~Commission~~ Department shall furnish to the agencies of the United
21 States its cooperation, services, records, and facilities, insofar
22 as may be practicable.

23 3. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall report to the appropriate
24 agency of the United States all accidents in aeronautics in this

1 state of which it is informed and shall, insofar as is practicable,
2 preserve, protect, and prevent the removal of the component parts of
3 any aircraft involved in an accident being investigated by it until
4 the federal agency institutes an investigation.

5 L. The ~~Commission~~ Department may organize and administer an
6 aerospace education program in cooperation with universities,
7 colleges and schools for the general public. The ~~Commission~~
8 Department may also plan and act jointly in a cooperative aviation
9 research or high technology program. As part of these programs, the
10 ~~Commission~~ Department may issue aviation communication films and
11 publications.

12 M. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall administer an airport
13 inspection program for all public-use airports within ~~the State of~~
14 ~~Oklahoma~~ this state. The inspection program shall occur on a three-
15 year cycle and shall be administered by the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
16 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics. Airport owners,
17 including individuals and municipalities, shall provide access to
18 airport facilities for conducting the inspections. The ~~Commission~~
19 Department shall provide a written report to each public-use airport
20 detailing the findings of such inspections.

21 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 85.1, is
22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 85.1. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
24 Aerospace and Aeronautics is hereby authorized on behalf of and in

1 the name of the state, to accept title to property, real or
2 personal, or any interest therein including easements from any
3 authority, county, municipality or political subdivision thereof.
4 The ~~Commission~~ Department is further authorized to construct,
5 enlarge, improve, maintain, equip, operate, regulate, protect, and
6 police such property, including the construction, installation,
7 equipping, maintenance, and operation of airports, buildings and
8 other facilities for the servicing of aircraft or for the comfort
9 and accommodation of air travelers. Any property accepted pursuant
10 to this section shall be in accordance with and subject to Section
11 ~~82~~ 81 et seq. of ~~Title 3 of the Oklahoma Statutes~~ this title.

12 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 87, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 87. In carrying out the provisions of ~~this act~~ Section
15 81 et seq. of this title the ~~Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of
16 Aerospace and Aeronautics may use the facilities, services, and
17 resources of other agencies of the state and of the municipalities
18 of the state, and all other such agencies of the state and
19 municipalities are hereby specifically authorized to cooperate with
20 the ~~Commission~~ Department by use of their respective equipment,
21 facilities, services, and resources in the furtherance of the
22 purposes of ~~this act~~ Section 81 et seq. of this title and in the
23 furtherance of the plans and programs of the ~~Commission~~ Department.

1 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 90, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 90. In order to assure a safe and adequate system of
4 airports within this state:

5 1. In every county wherein there is no active airport, the
6 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
7 Aeronautics is authorized to construct within such county or a
8 municipality located therein or upon land owned by the federal
9 government but under the active control of the state, county or a
10 municipality located within such county a runway of not less than
11 two thousand six hundred (2,600) feet in length and to repair,
12 maintain and hardsurface such runway.

13 2. In each county wherein there already exists an active
14 airport owned by such county or a municipality located therein or
15 upon land owned by the federal government but under the active
16 control of the state, county or a municipality located within such
17 county, but there does not exist within such county a hardsurfaced
18 runway of at least two thousand six hundred (2,600) feet in length,
19 the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
20 Aeronautics may construct upon such lands as those described in
21 paragraph 1 of this section a runway of not less than two thousand
22 six hundred (2,600) feet and may repair, maintain and hardsurface
23 such runway, or may, where sufficient land is available for such
24 purpose, expand such existing airport to a length of two thousand

1 six hundred (2,600) feet and may thereupon repair, maintain and
2 hardsurface the entire runway.

3 3. During the fiscal year in which federal funds are available
4 under the Federal Airport Program for development or improvement of
5 a state, county or city owned or controlled airport, the Oklahoma
6 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
7 be prohibited from performing any construction or major repair work
8 upon such airstrip unless and until such federal funds have been
9 available for such purpose.

10 4. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace
11 and Aeronautics, in any county where no airport containing two
12 thousand six hundred (2,600) feet or more runway exists, is
13 authorized to accept gifts of land to be used for a county airport
14 and of money to be used to acquire an airport.

15 5. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace
16 and Aeronautics is further authorized to accept federal grants for
17 construction, repair, maintenance and other purposes not
18 inconsistent with the provisions of this section and to utilize
19 machinery and material for the purpose of matching available federal
20 funds and grants.

21 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 91, is
22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 91. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
24 revolving fund for the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of

1 Aerospace and Aeronautics to be designated as the Oklahoma
2 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics
3 Revolving Fund. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to
4 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of a monthly allocation
5 by the Oklahoma Tax Commission of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00)
6 from the motor fuel excise tax levied and collected pursuant to the
7 provisions of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, such amount being a
8 part of the estimated amount of tax paid on gasoline consumed by

11 Records Act, donations, gifts, bequests, contribution, devices,
12 interagency reimbursements, federal funds unless otherwise provided
13 by federal law or regulation, sale of leases and aircraft
14 registration fees and taxes, fees authorized by Section 1135.5 of
15 Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes or any other source. All monies
16 accruing to the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and
17 expended by the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
18 Aerospace and Aeronautics for airport construction and
19 rehabilitation programs, general operations of the agency, for
20 promoting the awareness of aviation and aerospace, and providing
21 financial support for aviation education programs to address the
22 need for a skilled and competent aviation workforce. Expenditures
23 from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State
24 Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the

1 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
2 approval and payment.

3 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 92, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 92. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
6 Aerospace and Aeronautics is hereby authorized and empowered to
7 offer for sale, sell and execute oil and gas leases, and other
8 mineral and mining leases, and agricultural leases on any of the
9 lands of ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state under the control and
10 supervision of ~~said Commission~~ the Department, provided, the
11 development of ~~said~~ land for the purpose leased will not unduly
12 interfere with the aeronautical purpose for which said land is being
13 used by the state. ~~Said Commission~~ The Department is hereby given
14 authority to adopt and promulgate such additional rules and
15 regulations, not inconsistent herewith, as it may deem necessary and
16 for the best interest of the state in facilitating the sale of said
17 leases. It shall be the duty of the Director of the Oklahoma
18 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics to
19 execute ~~said~~ such leases for and in behalf of ~~said Commission~~ the
20 Department, and ~~said~~ the Director shall be liable on his official
21 bond for failure to faithfully discharge his duties hereunder. The
22 sales of all oil, gas and mineral leases shall be made upon the
23 basis of a retained royalty of not less than one-eighth (1/8) of all
24 oil, gas, casinghead gas, and other minerals produced from the lands

1 covered by ~~said~~ such leases and such additional cash bonus as may be
2 procured. Provided, however, if the state owns less than one
3 hundred percent (100%) of the oil, gas, casinghead gas and other
4 minerals covered by any such lease, the royalty retained shall not
5 be less than one-eighth (1/8) of the mineral interest so owned. All
6 oil, gas, mineral and agricultural leases shall be sold only after
7 advertisement for a period of three (3) weeks in a legal newspaper
8 published and of general circulation in the county in which said
9 lands are located. ~~Said~~ The sale shall be made to the highest and
10 best bidder and all bids shall be in sealed envelopes and opened and
11 considered at the same time.

12 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 93, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 93. All money derived from the sale of ~~said~~ such
15 leases, and from any royalties subsequently accruing, shall be
16 deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the Oklahoma
17 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics
18 Revolving Fund, and ~~said~~ such money may be expended in the same
19 manner and for the purposes as other money in ~~said~~ the fund is
20 authorized to be expended.

21 SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 102.1, is
22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 102.1. A. In order to prevent the erection of
24 structures dangerous to air navigation, subject to the provisions of

1 subsections B, C and D of this section, each person shall secure
2 from the local airport zoning authority, or in the absence of a
3 local airport zoning authority, the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
4 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics, a permit for the erection,
5 alteration, or modification of any structure the result of which
6 would exceed the federal obstruction standards as contained in 14
7 CFR, Part 77. Permits from the local airport zoning authority will
8 be required only within an airport hazard area where federal
9 standards are exceeded and if the proposed construction is within:

- 10 1. A 10-nautical mile radius of the geographical center of a
11 publicly owned or operated airport, a military airport, or an
12 airport open for public use which has a published instrument
13 approach procedure;
- 14 2. A 6-nautical mile radius of the geographical center of a
15 publicly owned or operated airport, a military airport, or an
16 airport open for public use which has no published instrument
17 approach procedure and has runways in excess of three thousand two
18 hundred (3,200) feet in length; or
- 19 3. A 2.5-nautical mile radius of the geographical center of a
20 publicly owned or operated airport, a military airport, or an
21 airport open for public use which has no published instrument
22 approach and has runways three thousand two hundred (3,200) feet or
23 less in length.

24

1 B. Affected airports will be considered as having those
2 facilities which are programmed in the Federal Aviation
3 Administration's Regional Aviation System Plan and will be so
4 protected.

5 C. Permit requirements of subsection A of this section shall
6 not apply to projects which received construction permits from the
7 Federal Communications Commission for structures exceeding federal
8 obstruction standards prior to May 20, 1975; nor shall it apply to
9 previously approved structures now existing, or any necessary
10 replacement or repairs to such existing structures, so long as the
11 height and location is unchanged.

12 D. In determining whether to issue or deny a permit, the local
13 airport zoning authority shall consider:

14 1. The nature of the terrain and height of existing structures;

15 2. Public and private interests and investments;

16 3. The character of flying operations and planned developments
17 of airports;

18 4. Federal airways as designated by the Federal Aviation
19 Administration that lie within the radii described in paragraphs 1
20 through 3 of subsection A of this section;

21 5. Whether the construction of the proposed structure would
22 cause an increase in the minimum descent altitude or the decision
23 height at the affected airport;

24 6. Technological advances;

1 7. The safety of persons on the ground and in the air; and

2 8. Land use density.

3 E. In order to promote the health, safety and welfare of the
4 public and to protect persons and property by promoting safety in
5 aeronautics, the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
6 Aerospace and Aeronautics may review any structure erected, altered,
7 or modified since January 1, 1996, in which no permit was secured
8 from the local airport zoning authority because of the absence of a
9 local airport authority. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
10 Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall determine whether such
11 structures meet the requirements set forth in this section. If the
12 structures do not meet the requirements as set forth in this
13 section, the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace
14 and Aeronautics may request the owners of such structure to make any
15 necessary modifications to protect the health, safety and welfare of
16 the public, including, but not limited to, altering, marking,
17 mapping, or identifying such structure. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
18 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics may assist the
19 owner of such structure in any manner deemed feasible by the
20 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
21 Aeronautics.

22 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 116, is
23 amended to read as follows:

1 Section 116. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
2 Aerospace and Aeronautics may provide technical assistance to any
3 political subdivision requesting assistance in the preparation of an
4 airport zoning code. A copy of all local airport zoning codes,
5 rules, and regulations, and amendments and proposed and granted

8 SECTION 14. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 121, is

11 1. "Anemometer" means an instrument for measuring and recording
12 wind speed;

13 2. "Anemometer tower" means a structure, including all guy
14 wires and accessory facilities, on which an anemometer is mounted,
15 that is fifty (50) feet in height above the ground or higher, is not
16 located within the boundaries of a municipality, and whose
17 appearance is not otherwise regulated by state or federal law; ~~and~~

18 3. "Commission" means the seven members of the Oklahoma
19 Aerospace and Aeronautics Commission; ~~and~~

20 4. "Department" means the Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and
21 Aeronautics.

22 B. In addition to any zoning requirements of the Airport Zoning
23 Act or the Aircraft Pilot and Passenger Protection Act, the
24 ~~Commission~~ Department shall promulgate rules regulating the

1 appearance of anemometer towers to ensure that anemometer towers are
2 clearly recognizable in clear air during daylight hours according to
3 the following guidelines:

4 1. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall consider the best method for
5 making anemometer towers visible, including but not limited to
6 painting, flagging, or marking the towers and guy wires; and

7 2. Any rule promulgated pursuant to this section may apply
8 immediately, upon adoption, to anemometer towers constructed after
9 the date of adoption; however, anemometer towers constructed prior
10 to the date of adoption of the rule shall be exempt from the rule
11 for one (1) year from the date of adoption.

12 C. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall establish and maintain a
13 database containing the location of all anemometer towers by
14 November 1, 2015. The ~~Commission~~ Department may contract with a
15 governmental entity or private entity to create and maintain the
16 database.

17 D. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall promulgate rules requiring
18 an owner of an anemometer tower to provide the ~~Commission~~ Department
19 with information specifying the location and height of the tower,
20 and any other information the ~~Commission~~ Department may require to
21 ensure aviation safety.

22 E. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall promulgate rules requiring
23 any person proposing to construct an anemometer tower to notify the
24 ~~Commission~~ Department of such proposal. The ~~Commission~~ Department

1 shall require the owner of the proposed tower to provide the
2 ~~Commission~~ Department with information specifying the location and
3 height of the tower, and any other information the ~~Commission~~
4 Department may require to ensure aviation safety.

5 F. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall promulgate rules by
6 requiring the owner of an anemometer tower to notify the ~~Commission~~
7 Department upon removal or destruction of an anemometer tower.

8 G. The ~~Commission~~ Department shall have the authority to
9 promulgate rules and implement administrative penalties to enforce
10 the provisions of this ~~act~~ section.

11 H. Violations of this act are prohibited.

12 SECTION 15. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 251, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 251. A. It is hereby declared that it is the policy of
15 the Legislature to make registration procedures for aircraft similar
16 to those for automobiles, with the authority to accomplish the same
17 vested fully in the Oklahoma Tax Commission separately from the
18 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
19 Aeronautics, the jurisdiction of the two ~~Commissions~~ agencies, their
20 directors and officers being separate.

21 B. It shall be the duty of the Oklahoma Tax Commission to
22 promulgate any additional rules and regulations and designate forms
23 and procedures for the implementation of ~~this act~~ Section 251 et
24 seq. of this title.

1 SECTION 16. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 256, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 256. A. Registration fees and taxes on aircraft shall
4 be paid to and collected by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and its
5 agents in the same manner as registration fees and taxes are paid
6 and collected on automobiles.

7 The registration and reregistration of aircraft shall be subject
8 to the following schedule and rates:

9 1. Single-engine piston aircraft shall be taxed according to
10 the following Schedule "A":

7 2. Rotary-wing aircraft shall be taxed at two times the
8 Schedule "A" fee, based on the same weight classifications.

9 3. Multiengine piston aircraft shall be taxed at three times
10 the Schedule "A" fee, based on the same weight classifications.

11 4. Turbo-prop aircraft shall be taxed at six times the Schedule
12 "A" fee, based on the same weight classifications.

13 5. Turbo-jet aircraft shall be taxed at ten times the Schedule
14 "A" fee, based on the same weight classifications.

15 6. Antique aircraft as defined by the Federal Aviation
16 Administration, sailplanes, balloons, and home-built aircraft shall
17 be subject to a flat-rate fee of Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

18 7. The fees of this subsection, except those in paragraph 6 of
19 this subsection, shall be reduced at a rate of ten percent (10%)
20 each year following the date of manufacture until the fee is equal
21 to fifty percent (50%) of the original fee, which shall then be the
22 fee for each year thereafter.

23 8. Every aircraft owner shall have the right to appeal the
24 assessment of the fee as provided for in this subsection, and the

1 Oklahoma Tax Commission shall appraise the aircraft and its avionics
2 as personal property at the fair market value thereof, and shall
3 apply a twelve-percent assessment rate which shall be levied at the
4 appropriate county millage rate.

5 B. Aircraft purchased after January 1 of each year and subject
6 to registration as provided for in this section shall be registered
7 and taxed on a prorated basis. Registration fees and taxes shall be
8 in lieu of all aircraft ad valorem taxes. All such monies collected
9 shall be paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission and disbursed as
10 follows:

11 1. Three percent (3%) of all such funds shall be paid to the
12 State Treasurer for deposit to the credit of the General Revenue

19 Section 401. Contracts entered into for projects and activities
20 of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
21 Aeronautics relating to airport and air navigation facility
22 construction, maintenance and repair shall be awarded using the
23 competitive bidding process set forth in the Public Competitive
24 Bidding Act of 1974. The ~~Commission~~ Department may administer the

1 competitive bidding process through the ~~Oklahoma~~ Department of
2 Transportation rather than the Office of Management and Enterprise
3 Services.

4 SECTION 18. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2021, Section 421, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 421. A. The Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department
7 of Aerospace and Aeronautics is hereby established as the
8 clearinghouse for unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) in ~~the State of~~
9 ~~Oklahoma~~ this state and shall be designated as the agency of this
10 state for the promotion, enhancement and development of UAS and to
11 ensure the safe integration and use of this new technology within
12 the state. The purpose of this clearinghouse is to create a
13 partnership between those entities that currently operate UAS, those
14 that desire to use this technology in the future and other entities
15 that can support the research and development of UAS to ensure that
16 ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state can more effectively respond to the
17 needs of this critical sector of the aviation and aerospace
18 industry. In the operation of this clearinghouse, the ~~Commission~~
19 Department shall cooperate, assist and coordinate with the federal
20 government, agencies of this state, tribal entities, municipalities
21 and other persons in the development of unmanned aircraft systems
22 throughout the state to ensure the acceptance of this technology and
23 the successful integration of UAS into the National Airspace System.
24 Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~

1 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics may use
2 established program processes or may contract with other qualified
3 entities to carry out the duties and responsibilities of ~~this act~~
4 the Unmanned Aircraft Systems Development Act of 2021.

5 B. The primary goal of the UAS clearinghouse within the
6 ~~Commission~~ Department is to establish a central point within state
7 government to develop the strategy for how ~~the State of Oklahoma~~
8 this state can become a leader in the UAS industry. It will focus
9 the collective resources, knowledge, information and assets within
10 state government to ensure coordinated efforts amongst all parties.

11 The clearinghouse will:

12 1. Conduct research on what other states and localities are
13 doing insofar as their UAS rules and regulations so that it can
14 provide recommendations to ensure ~~Oklahoma~~ this state is in the best
15 position within the industry;

16 2. Organize and coordinate the application for any UAS test
17 site, integration opportunity, pilot program or grant funding on
18 behalf of ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state;

19 3. Maintain a registry of UAS being operated by state agencies,
20 except those UAS that are part of a university-affiliated research
21 program; and

22 4. Maintain a registry of educational institutions that offer
23 training programs for users of UAS.

24

1 SECTION 19. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 203, O.S.L.
2 2022 (3 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 413), is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 Section 413. A. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma
5 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics, the
6 Oklahoma Air Service Development Grant Program. The Oklahoma Air
7 Service Development Grant Program (OASDGP) is designed to offer
8 financial assistance by grant to private or public entities for the
9 purpose of assisting commercial air service development. Grant
10 funding is administered based on merit and the potential for a
11 specific project to enhance the state's economy. Grants are one-
12 time awards.

13 B. Grant funding can be used for commercial air service
14 development projects and include minimum revenue guarantees for
15 specific new routes, marketing and advertising of service, market
16 study and research projects to develop data for a business case for
17 new service, start-up cost offsets to reduce the cost of an airline
18 beginning service, and other innovative risk sharing models to
19 support the introduction of new airline service in the state.
20 Grants must be used to recruit service in an airport-pair that has
21 no current, daily scheduled airline service. Grants may not be used
22 to support current routes or to recruit a second carrier to an
23 airport-pair.

24

1 C. Public, private and nonprofit entities within ~~Oklahoma~~ this
2 state that have sufficient financial and management capacity to
3 complete the requested project are eligible for funding under this
4 program. Eligible entities include:

- 5 1. Airport sponsors of publicly owned airports;
- 6 2. Oklahoma municipalities;
- 7 3. Chambers of commerce; or
- 8 4. Community organizations that promote economic development.

9 D. Each application must include a detailed business plan with
10 supporting data for the proposed project. The business plan should
11 include:

- 12 1. Available passengers for the route including local demand
13 and connecting demand;
- 14 2. Detail on available revenue;
- 15 3. Current and historical fare data relative to peers and how
16 the project will lower fares; and
- 17 4. Business demand for companies based in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state
18 or doing business in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state that may use the proposed
19 route.

20 E. Projects with airline support will be considered first for
21 funding under this program. Airline support can be evidenced by a
22 letter, dated, signed, and on airline letterhead, or other
23 communication directly from an airline stating its support for the
24 funding and its interest in the proposed route. An airline letter

1 of support is not required for funding to be allocated to a project
2 but will be used in prioritizing fund awards.

3 F. To be considered for state funding under this program,
4 applicants must demonstrate the ability to provide a minimum twenty
5 percent (20%) of all funding for the project through local sources.
6 Local funding should be dedicated to the project and evidenced by
7 letters of commitment before an application is submitted. Any
8 private enterprise or nonairport, nonmunicipal, nonprofit entity
9 must have a letter of credit to qualify for a grant without a public
10 partner.

11 G. Each application should include a narrative organized into
12 seven (7) sections:

- 13 1. A proposal summary;
- 14 2. Applicant organization description, history, and ability to
15 fund the project;
- 16 3. Air service background and history of the airport/market;
- 17 4. Project description, target route, and specific business
18 plan for service;
- 19 5. Timeline;
- 20 6. Budget including local funding; and
- 21 7. Letters of support.

22 H. Applications will first be vetted for completeness. Any
23 application which does not include the information listed in
24 subsection G will be eliminated from consideration. Any application

1 that does not include local funding for at least twenty percent
2 (20%) of the project cost will be eliminated from consideration.
3 Any applicant that cannot demonstrate he or she is working with an
4 airport sponsor on the project will be eliminated from
5 consideration.

6 I. Once applications have been deemed to meet minimum
7 requirements, they will be evaluated for funding against each other,
8 with special attention paid to the following criteria in this order:

- 9 1. The viability of the business case for service and the
10 opportunity for service to be sustainable;
- 11 2. The need for the service in the community and region;
- 12 3. The challenges with current air service that could be
13 rectified with grant funding;
- 14 4. Share of local funding versus grant funding;
- 15 5. Airline support for the project;
- 16 6. Broad-based stakeholder support for the project; and
- 17 7. The ability to use the funding in a timely manner.

18 The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall be part of this review
19 process. The state may request additional information from the
20 applicant and may require a written response from the applicant for
21 any outstanding questions. The state reserves the right to require
22 formal presentations from each applicant to explain the proposed
23 project.

24

1 J. The state will enter into a grant agreement contract with
2 recipients prior to distributing program funds. The agreement shall
3 include:

- 4 1. The specific project receiving grant funding;
- 5 2. The maximum dollar amount of state funding;
- 6 3. Effective dates of the grant;
- 7 4. Rights to terminate the grant agreement;
- 8 5. Inspection and reporting requirements to verify project
9 status and expenditures; and
- 10 6. Conditions of disbursement of grant funds including
11 obligation to repay funds if the terms of the agreement are not met.

12 The grant agreement contract shall require the awardee to
13 provide ongoing quarterly reports stating progress and detailing any
14 activity related to the project.

15 SECTION 20. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 203, O.S.L.
16 2022 (3 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 414), is amended to read as
17 follows:

18 Section 414. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
19 revolving fund for the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of
20 Aerospace and Aeronautics to be designated the "Oklahoma Air Service
21 Development Grant Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a
22 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
23 consist of all monies received by the Tax Commission which are
24 specifically required by law to be deposited in the fund, any public

1 or private donations, contributions and gifts received for the
2 benefit of the fund, and any amounts appropriated by the
3 Legislature. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are
4 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma
5 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics for
6 the purpose of funding grants as provided in ~~this act~~ Section 411 et
7 seq. of this title. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon
8 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
9 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
10 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

11 SECTION 21. AMENDATORY 17 O.S. 2021, Section 160.20, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 Section 160.20. A. After August 21, 2015, no wind energy
14 facility may be constructed if the base of any tower is located at a
15 distance of less than:

16 1. One and one-half (1 1/2) nautical miles from the center line
17 of any runway located on:

18 a. a public-use airport as defined in Section 120.2 of
19 Title 3 of the Oklahoma Statutes, or

20 b. an airport owned by a municipality;

21 2. One and one-half (1 1/2) nautical miles from any public
22 school which is a part of a public school district; or

23 3. One and one-half (1 1/2) nautical miles from a hospital.
24

1 B. Attestation of compliance with the setback requirements in
2 this section shall be included in any reports required by the
3 Corporation Commission. Stakeholder and landowner disputes arising
4 under subsection A of this section shall fall under the exclusive
5 jurisdiction of the district courts. The Corporation Commission may
6 seek enforcement of the submission and attestation requirements of
7 this subsection and subsection C of this section through its
8 administrative court system.

9 C. After ~~the effective date of this act~~ April 3, 2018,
10 construction or operation of a proposed individual wind turbine or
11 any other individual structure requiring a Federal Aviation
12 Administration (FAA) Form 7460-1 that is part of a wind energy
13 facility shall not encroach upon or otherwise have a significant
14 adverse impact on the mission, training or operations of any
15 military installation or branch of military as determined by the
16 Military Aviation and Installation Assurance Siting Clearinghouse
17 (Clearinghouse) and the FAA. Areas of impact include, but are not
18 limited to, military training routes, drop zones, approaches to
19 runways and bombing ranges. No individual wind turbine or any other
20 individual structure that requires a FAA 7460-1 form that is part of
21 a wind energy facility may be constructed or expanded unless there
22 is an active Determination of No Hazard from the FAA and adverse
23 impacts to the United States Department of Defense, pursuant to
24 Title 32 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 211.6, have

1 | been resolved as evidenced by documentation from the Clearinghouse
2 | for the individual wind turbine or other individual structure. The
3 | Mission Compatibility Certification Letter or successor form may
4 | serve as such evidence of adverse impacts being resolved with the
5 | Department of Defense or successor agency.

6 | 1. The Determination of No Hazard and documentation of the
7 | resolution of adverse impacts to the Department of Defense shall be
8 | filed with the Corporation Commission and the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
9 | ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics.

10 | 2. The requirements established by this subsection shall not
11 | prohibit the construction of an individual wind turbine or any other
12 | individual structure requiring a FAA 7460-1 form that is part of a
13 | wind energy facility if that individual wind turbine or other
14 | individual structure has received a Determination of No Hazard or
15 | mitigation plan on or before ~~the effective date of this act~~ April 3,
16 | 2018.

17 | 3. The Corporation Commission is authorized to promulgate rules
18 | and regulations for the implementation of the provisions of this
19 | section and Section 160.21 of this title.

20 | D. If an owner of a wind energy facility fails to submit an
21 | active Determination of No Hazard and documentation that adverse
22 | impacts to the Department of Defense have been resolved by the
23 | Clearinghouse for the individual wind turbine or other individual
24 | structure prior to the start of construction, the owner shall be

1 subject to an administrative penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five
2 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per day, per violation from the
3 Corporation Commission as provided by law. In addition,
4 stakeholders, including, but not limited to, the Corporation
5 Commission or the ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of
6 Aerospace and Aeronautics may institute an action in any court of
7 general jurisdiction to prevent, restrain, correct or abate any
8 violation of subsection C of this section other than Corporation
9 Commission actions related to submissions or attestations.

10 SECTION 22. AMENDATORY 17 O.S. 2021, Section 160.21, as
11 amended by Section 2, Chapter 310, O.S.L. 2019, is amended to read
12 as follows:

13 Section 160.21. A. The owner of a wind energy facility shall
14 submit notification of intent to build a facility to the Corporation
15 Commission within six (6) months of the initial filing with the
16 Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) of a FAA 7460-1 form. The
17 Corporation Commission shall prescribe the form and submittal
18 requirements of the notification; provided, the information required
19 on the notification form shall include at least the same information
20 required on the FAA form and a map of the project boundary. The
21 owner of a wind energy facility shall submit to the Oklahoma
22 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics
23 copies of all initial FAA 7460-1 forms for all individual wind
24 turbines or any other individual structure that requires a FAA Form

1 7460-1 that is part of a wind energy facility within thirty (30)
2 days of the initial filing with the FAA. The ~~Aeronautics Commission~~
3 Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall prescribe the
4 submittal requirements for the 7460-1 form. The owner of the wind
5 energy facility shall send copies of the notification to the board
6 of county commissioners of every county in which all or a portion of
7 the wind energy facility is to be located within twenty-four (24)
8 hours of filing with the Corporation Commission. If all or a
9 portion of the wind energy facility is to be located within the
10 incorporated area of a municipality, copies of the notification
11 shall also be sent to the governing body of the municipality within
12 twenty-four (24) hours of filing with the Corporation Commission.
13 If the owner of a wind energy facility is required to file
14 subsequent 7460-1 forms with the FAA due to changing locations or
15 heights of individual structures from the locations or heights
16 originally proposed in the initial 7460-1 forms submitted to the
17 ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and
18 Aeronautics, the owner shall, within ten (10) days of filing with
19 the FAA, submit such subsequent 7460-1 forms to the Corporation
20 Commission and ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of
21 Aerospace and Aeronautics. A wind energy facility owner shall not
22 be required to start the notification processes over unless the
23 subsequent 7460-1 forms expand the project beyond its original
24 boundaries submitted to the Corporation Commission.

1 B. Within ten (10) days of receiving a FAA 7460-1 form, as
2 provided for in subsection A of this section, the ~~Aeronautics~~
3 ~~Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shall
4 notify the Oklahoma Strategic Military Planning Commission. The
5 Oklahoma Strategic Military Planning Commission shall notify local
6 base commanders upon receipt of this notification. The Oklahoma
7 Strategic Military Planning Commission shall submit a letter to the
8 Military Aviation and Installation Assurance Siting Clearinghouse
9 outlining potential areas of impact, as provided in Section 160.20
10 of this title, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the
11 notification. The letter from the Oklahoma Strategic Military
12 Planning Commission shall be submitted to the Corporation
13 Commission, the ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Oklahoma Department of
14 Aerospace and Aeronautics and the wind energy facility owner at the
15 same time the letter is submitted to the Clearinghouse.

16 C. Within six (6) months of submitting the notification with
17 the Corporation Commission as provided for in subsection A of this
18 section, the owner of the wind energy facility shall cause a copy of
19 the notification to be published in a newspaper of general
20 circulation in the county or counties in which all or a portion of
21 the wind energy facility is to be located. Proof of publication
22 shall be submitted to the Corporation Commission.

23 D. Within six (6) months of submitting the notification with
24 the Corporation Commission as provided in subsection A of this

1 section, the owner of the wind energy facility shall cause a copy of
2 the notification to be sent, by certified mail, to:

3 1. Any operator, as reflected in the records of the Corporation
4 Commission, who is conducting oil and gas operations upon all or any
5 part of the surface estate as to which the wind energy developer
6 intends the construction of the wind energy facility;

7 2. Any operator, as reflected in the records of the Corporation
8 Commission, of an unspaced unit, or a unit created by order of the
9 Corporation Commission, who is conducting oil and gas operations for
10 the unit where all or any part of the unit area is within the
11 geographical boundaries of the surface estate as to which the wind
12 energy developer intends the construction of the wind energy
13 facility; and

14 3. As to tracts of land not described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of
15 this subsection on which the wind energy developer intends to
16 construct a wind energy facility, all lessees of oil and gas leases
17 covering the mineral estate underlying any part of the tracts of
18 land that are filed of record with county clerk in the county where
19 the tracts are located and whose primary term has not expired.

20 If the wind energy developer makes a search with reasonable
21 diligence, and the whereabouts of a party entitled to any notice
22 described in this subsection cannot be ascertained or such notice
23 cannot be delivered, then an affidavit attesting to such diligent
24

1 search for the parties shall be placed in the records of the county
2 clerk where the surface estate is actually located.

3 E. Within sixty (60) days of publishing the notification in a
4 newspaper as provided for in subsection C of this section, the owner
5 of the wind energy facility shall hold a public meeting. Notice of
6 the public meeting shall be published in a newspaper of general
7 circulation and submitted to the board of county commissioners in
8 the county or counties in which all or a portion of the wind energy
9 facility is to be located. The notice shall contain the place, date
10 and time of the public meeting. Proof of publication of the notice
11 shall be submitted to the Corporation Commission. The public
12 meeting shall be held in one of the counties in which all or a
13 portion of the wind energy facility is to be located.

14 F. With regard to the surface estate upon which the owner of a
15 wind energy facility intends to construct a wind energy facility, at
16 least sixty (60) days before entering upon the surface estate for
17 the purposes of commencement of construction of the wind energy
18 facility, the owner shall provide written notice, by certified mail,
19 of its intent to construct the wind energy facility to:

20 1. Any operator, as reflected in the records of the Corporation
21 Commission, who is conducting oil and gas operations upon all or any
22 part of the surface estate as to which the wind energy developer
23 intends the construction of the wind energy facility;

24

1 2. Any operator, as reflected in the records of the Corporation
2 Commission, of an unspaced unit, or a unit created by order of the
3 Corporation Commission, who is conducting oil and gas operations for
4 the unit where all or any part of the unit area is within the
5 geographical boundaries of the surface estate as to which the wind
6 energy developer intends the construction of the wind energy
7 facility; and

8 3. As to tracts of land not described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of
9 this subsection on which the wind energy developer intends to
10 construct a wind energy facility, all lessees of oil and gas leases
11 covering the mineral estate underlying any part of the tracts of
12 land that are filed of record with county clerk in the county where
13 the tracts are located and whose primary term has not expired.

14 The notice shall contain a map or plat of the proposed location,
15 with sufficient specificity of all of the various elements of the
16 wind energy facility to be located on the governmental section which
17 includes all or any part of the tracts of land described in
18 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this subsection and the approximate date
19 that the owner of the wind energy facility proposes to commence
20 construction. If the wind energy developer makes a search with
21 reasonable diligence, and the whereabouts of a party entitled to any
22 notice described in this subsection cannot be ascertained or such
23 notice cannot be delivered, then an affidavit attesting to such
24 diligent search for the parties shall be placed in the records of

1 the county clerk where the surface estate is actually located.
2 Within thirty (30) days of receiving ~~said~~ such notice, any operator,
3 as described in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this subsection shall
4 reciprocate, in writing by certified mail, certain site, operational
5 and infrastructure information, with sufficient specificity, to be
6 shared with the owner of the wind energy facility to assist both
7 with the safe construction and operation pertaining to the surface
8 estate. This information should include ~~ALTA~~ American Land Title
9 Association (ALTA) surveys of existing subsurface and surface
10 improvements on the property, if any, as well as other technical
11 specifications for existing improvements such as pipe size,
12 material, capacity and depth.

13 G. The owner of a wind energy facility shall not commence
14 construction on the facility until the notification and public
15 meeting requirements of this section have been met. If an owner of
16 a wind energy facility fails to submit the information as required
17 in this section, the owner shall be subject to an administrative
18 penalty from the Corporation Commission not to exceed One Thousand
19 Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per day, per violation as provided
20 by law.

21 SECTION 23. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1135.5, as
22 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 397, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
23 2022, Section 1135.5), is amended to read as follows:

24

1 Section 1135.5. A. Service Oklahoma is hereby authorized to
2 design and issue appropriate official special license plates to
3 persons wishing to demonstrate support and provide financial
4 assistance as provided by this section.

5 Special license plates shall not be transferred to any other
6 person but shall be removed from the vehicle upon transfer of
7 ownership and retained. The special license plate may then be used
8 on another vehicle but only after such other vehicle has been
9 registered for the current year with a licensed operator.

10 Special license plates shall be renewed each year by Service
11 Oklahoma or a licensed operator, unless authorized by Service
12 Oklahoma to be renewed for a period greater than one (1) year.
13 Service Oklahoma shall notify by mail all persons issued special
14 license plates. The notice shall contain all necessary information
15 and shall contain instructions for the renewal procedure upon
16 presentation to a licensed operator or Service Oklahoma. The
17 license plates shall be issued on a staggered system.

18 Service Oklahoma is hereby directed to develop and implement a
19 system whereby licensed operators are permitted to accept
20 applications for special license plates authorized under this
21 section. The licensed operator shall confirm the applicant's
22 eligibility, if applicable, collect and deposit any amount
23 specifically authorized by law, accept and process the necessary
24 information directly into such system and generate a receipt

1 accordingly. For performance of these duties, licensed operators
2 shall retain the fee provided in Section 1141.1 of this title for
3 registration of a motor vehicle. The licensed operator fees for
4 acceptance of applications and renewals shall be paid out of the
5 ~~Oklahoma~~ Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund. Beginning January 1,
6 2023, the licensed operator fees for acceptance of applications and
7 renewals shall be paid out of the Service Oklahoma Reimbursement
8 Fund.

9 If fewer than one hundred of any type of special license plates
10 authorized prior to January 1, 2004, are issued prior to January 1,
11 2006, Service Oklahoma shall discontinue issuance and renewal of
12 that type of special license plate. Any such authorized special
13 license plate registrant shall be allowed to display the license
14 plate upon the designated vehicle until the registration expiration
15 date. After such time the expired special license plate shall be
16 removed from the vehicle.

17 For special license plates authorized on or after July 1, 2004,
18 no special license plates shall be developed or issued by Service
19 Oklahoma until Service Oklahoma receives one hundred prepaid
20 applications therefor. The prepaid applications must be received by
21 Service Oklahoma within one hundred eighty (180) days of the
22 effective date of the authorization or the authority to issue shall
23 be null and void. In the event one hundred prepaid applications are
24

1 not received by Service Oklahoma within such prescribed time period
2 any payment so received shall be refunded accordingly.

3 B. The special license plates provided by this section are as
4 follows:

5 1. University or College Supporter License Plate - such plates
6 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
7 support to any state-supported or private university or college. As
8 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
9 apportioned as provided in Section 1104.1 of this title;

10 2. Environmental Awareness License Plate - such plates shall be
11 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
12 Oklahoma by the Department of Environmental Quality in consultation
13 with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to
14 demonstrate support to implement the statewide general public
15 ~~environmental education program~~ Environmental Education Program
16 created pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Environmental
17 Quality Code. Such plates shall be designed and issued to any
18 person in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a
19 maximum of seven, as for personalized license plates. A dealer's
20 license plate issued pursuant to Section 1116.1 or 1128 of this
21 title may be designated an Environmental Awareness License Plate
22 upon payment of the fee imposed by this section and any other

23 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
24 Aeronautics Revolving Fund and one-third shall be apportioned

1 pursuant to the provisions of Section 500.6 of Title 68 of the
2 Oklahoma Statutes; and

3 3. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and for each
4 fiscal year thereafter, all such revenue shall be paid to the State
5 Treasurer and placed to the credit of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics~~
6 ~~Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Revolving Fund.

7 SECTION 25. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 6005, as
8 amended by Section 1, Chapter 148, O.S.L. 2022 (68 O.S. Supp. 2022,
9 Section 6005), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 6005. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and
11 all subsequent fiscal years, one hundred percent (100%) of the
12 revenues derived pursuant to the provisions of Sections 6001 through
13 6007 of this title shall be paid monthly by the Oklahoma Tax
14 Commission to the State Treasurer and shall be placed to the credit
15 of the Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
16 Aeronautics Revolving Fund.

17 SECTION 26. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.12, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 5003.12. A. This act shall be known and may be cited
20 as the "Aerospace Commerce Economic Services Act".

21 B. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma Department of
22 Commerce, the Aerospace Commerce Economic Services (ACES), whose
23 purpose shall be to create a partnership of service providers to
24 more effectively respond to the needs of the aviation, aerospace and

1 defense industries in the areas of education and training, research,
2 and economic development. ACES will focus available resources to
3 promote cooperation and collaboration among businesses,
4 manufacturers, military installations, commercial aviation,
5 educational institutions, nonprofit research institutions and state
6 government for the purpose of strengthening the economy of ~~the State~~
7 ~~of Oklahoma~~ this state. Contingent upon the availability of funds,
8 the Oklahoma Department of Commerce may employ established program
9 processes or may contract with other qualified entities to operate
10 ACES. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall partner with the
11 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
12 Aeronautics to implement the provisions of this ~~act~~ section.

13 C. ACES is designed to coordinate and integrate the various
14 aerospace resources that currently exist within state and local
15 agencies. The primary goal of ACES is to establish a common
16 statewide strategy for the growth of the Oklahoma aerospace
17 industry. ACES will focus the collective aerospace resources, all
18 or new aerospace resources, to achieve one or more of the following
19 objectives into an integrated, coordinated statewide effort that
20 will:

21 1. Increase contracts between companies in the aviation,
22 aerospace and defense industries in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state and the
23 Department of Defense and its prime contractors;

24 2. Create and retain more high-wage, high-skill jobs;

- 1 3. Strengthen collaborations between businesses and aviation,
2 aerospace and defense interests;
- 3 4. Reduce the flow of federal defense contract dollars out of
4 state;
- 5 5. Expand the aviation, aerospace and defense industries in
6 ~~Oklahoma~~ this state;
- 7 6. Provide engineering and technical assistance;
- 8 7. Provide more suppliers for Oklahoma military installations
9 and the aviation, aerospace and defense industries;
- 10 8. Reduce costs for the Department of Defense and Oklahoma
11 military installations and increase the competitiveness of aviation,
12 aerospace and defense businesses in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state;
- 13 9. Create and align goals to grow aerospace business to a top
14 industry in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state by providing a forum to bring
15 agencies, industry and government together;
- 16 10. Enhance Oklahoma's supply chain utilization in the industry
17 to fill existing gaps in supplier networks;
- 18 11. Develop a recruitment strategy to attract new businesses
19 that reside or have a presence in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state; and
- 20 12. Create a forum for all aerospace stakeholders in ~~Oklahoma~~
21 this state to come together to pool ideas and resources to advance
22 aerospace in the state. State aerospace stakeholders include but
23 are not limited to Federal Aviation Administration, ~~Veterans~~
24 ~~Administration~~ Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, Tinker Air

1 Force Base, all Oklahoma military installations, chambers of
2 commerce, Oklahoma Space Industry Development Authority, Oklahoma
3 Department of Commerce, Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education,
4 Oklahoma ~~Aeronautics Commission~~ Department of Aerospace and
5 Aeronautics, federal Small Business Administration, Unmanned Aerial
6 Systems Cluster Initiative of Oklahoma and Kansas, Oklahoma
7 Manufacturing Alliance, Oklahoma CareerTech, Oklahoma Center for the
8 Advancement of Science and Technology, ~~Governor's~~ Unmanned ~~Aerial~~
9 Systems Alliance of Oklahoma, Unmanned Aerial Systems Council and
10 Oklahoma Bid Assistance Network.

11 D. ACES shall establish an Aerospace and Defense Industry
12 Integrator. The integrator shall be used to engage key players from
13 the government, academia and other key stakeholders to create an
14 industry-wide vision and strategic map that details a plan to
15 enhance the industry. The integrator shall initiate the following
16 activities:

17 1. Assessing the current state of the industry, developing and
18 defining a vision for the future of the industry;

19 2. Identifying supplier network gaps and developing solutions
20 to fill those gaps;

21 3. Identifying funding requirements and developing funding
22 opportunities; and
23
24

1 4. Establishing ongoing mechanisms to monitor activities and
2 devising a process that includes the development and reporting of
3 metrics to track and manage ongoing progress.

4 E. In order to streamline the use of resources with the goal of
5 eliminating duplication of efforts, ACES shall act as a facilitator
6 for the collection and sharing of information and activities
7 concerning the aviation, aerospace and defense industries. ACES
8 shall provide coordination and assistance for the plans and
9 activities of state agencies, task forces, departments, boards,
10 commissions and other entities that have responsibilities or duties
11 regarding the aviation, aerospace and defense industries with the
12 goal of eliminating duplication of effort.

13 F. ACES shall support and foster the growth of the aviation,
14 aerospace and defense industries. ACES shall acquire aerospace
15 executive expertise and provide consulting services to the aviation,
16 aerospace and defense industries, government agencies and
17 organizations across ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state in order to
18 strengthen the policy framework, economic development initiatives
19 and activities of the state.

20 G. ACES may accept funding that includes, but is not limited
21 to:

- 22 1. Monetary contributions;
- 23 2. Contractual arrangements;
- 24 3. In-kind services;

- 1 4. Federal- and state-appropriated dollars;
- 2 5. Private and public foundation grants; and
- 3 6. Fee-for-service products.

4 SECTION 27. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
