## An Act

ENROLLED SENATE BILL NO. 786

An Act relating to crime and punishment; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1435, which relates to burglary in the second degree; modifying offenses; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1436, which relates to penalties for burglary; clarifying language; modifying penalties; creating new classification of offense; and providing an effective date.

SUBJECT: Criminal requirements for burglary

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1435, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1435. <u>A.</u> Every person who breaks and enters <u>the</u> <u>dwelling house of another</u>, in which there is at the time no human <u>being present</u>, or any <u>commercial</u> building or any part of any building, room, booth, tent, railroad car, <u>automobile</u>, <u>truck</u>, <u>trailer</u>, <u>vessel</u> or other structure or erection, in which any property is kept, or breaks into or forcibly opens, any coin operated or vending machine or device with intent to steal any property therein or to commit any felony, is guilty of burglary in the second degree. B. Every person who breaks and enters any automobile, truck, trailer or vessel of another, in which any property is kept, with intent to steal any property therein or to commit any felony, is guilty of burglary in the third degree.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1436, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1436. Burglary is a felony punishable by imprisonment in the State Penitentiary custody of the Department of Corrections as follows:

1. Burglary in the first degree for any term not less than seven (7) years nor more than twenty (20) years; and

2. Burglary in the second degree not exceeding seven (7) years and not less than two (2) years; and

3. Burglary in the third degree not exceeding five (5) years.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
