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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 9030.5, as
16	amended by Section 5, Chapter 196, O.S.L. 2015 (74 O.S. Supp. 2020,
17	Section 9030.5), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 9030.5. A. 1. Except as otherwise provided by
19	subsection C of this section, all state agencies $_{m{ au}}$ including
20	institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,
21	all state departments, boards, councils $_{ au}$ and commissions shall
22	allocate, as a nondeductible item out of any expenditures for
23	capital projects including, but not limited to, bond issues for
24	state construction excluding costs for bond issuance and related

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1 reserves, an amount of one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) of the 2 expenditure to the Oklahoma Arts Council for the purpose of funding 3 the Oklahoma Art in Public Places Act, except as otherwise provided 4 by subsection B of this section.

5 2. The maximum assessment for any project shall not exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). This assessment shall not 6 7 apply to any private donations for a capital project. This allocation shall be applicable to all state agency capital projects 8 9 approved by the appointing authority after September 1, 2004. The 10 works of art commissioned pursuant to the Oklahoma Art in Public 11 Places Act may be placed on public lands, integral to or attached to 12 a public building or structure $_{\mathcal{T}}$  or detached within or outside a public building or structure. 13

1. Of the assessment provided for in subsection A of this 14 В. 15 section, four-fifths (4/5) shall be placed in the Commissioning of Art in Public Places Revolving Fund, created in Section 9030.6 of 16 this title, for the commission of any work of art for the Oklahoma 17 Art in Public Places Act. Institutions within The Oklahoma State 18 System of Higher Education shall remain in complete administrative 19 control of their four-fifths (4/5) assessment pursuant to this 20 subsection for the acquisition of art. The remaining one-fifth 21 (1/5) of the assessment shall be reserved for the Art in Public 22 Places Administrative and Maintenance Revolving Fund created by 23 Section 9030.7 of this title. 24

2. Monies deposited in the Art in Public Places Administrative
 and Maintenance Revolving Fund for the purpose of this moratorium,
 shall be used for continued administration, educational costs<sub>7</sub> and
 maintenance.

5 C. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not be
6 applicable for the fiscal years ending:
