BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 405.5 of Title 10, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

All licensed child care centers shall:

1. Follow the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)
nutrition standards for infants;
2. Provide children with opportunities for moderate and
vigorous physical activity for at least sixty (60) cumulative
minutes per day during a full-day program, including daily outdoor
physical activity when possible, and by providing infants daily
opportunities to freely explore their indoor and outdoor
environments under adult supervision, including engaging with
infants on the ground each day to optimize adult-infant interactions

1 and providing daily time in the prone position for infants less than
2 six (6) months of age; and

3 3. Eliminate screen time, including television, movies,
4 cellular phones, video games, computers and other digital devices
5 for children less than two (2) years of age. The provisions of this
6 paragraph shall not apply to:

- 7 a. electronic media involving physical activity
8 participation,
- 9 b. electronic media when used for children's homework,
- 10 c. e-readers when used for reading,
- 11 d. smart boards and tables when used for hands-on
12 learning activities, such as drawing or puzzles,
- 13 e. occasional special activities, such as watching a
14 movie, and
- 15 f. assistive or adaptive technology for children with
16 disabilities.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
