BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 405.5 of Title 10, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

All licensed child care centers shall:

- 1. Follow the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) nutrition standards for infants;
- 2. Provide children with opportunities for moderate and vigorous physical activity for at least sixty (60) cumulative minutes per day during a full-day program, including daily outdoor physical activity when possible, and by providing infants daily opportunities to freely explore their indoor and outdoor environments under adult supervision, including engaging with infants on the ground each day to optimize adult-infant interactions
