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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 187, as
13	amended by Section 1, Chapter 312, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2018,
14	Section 187), is amended to read as follows:
15	Section 187. As used in this section through Section 187.2 of
16	this title:
17	1. "Campaign" means and includes all activities for or against
18	the election of a candidate for elective state office or for or
19	against a state question;
20	2. "Candidate" means an individual who has filed or should have
21	filed a statement of organization for a candidate committee for
22	state office with the Ethics Commission as required by its Rules. A
23	candidate committee shall include committees for candidates for
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1 partisan elective offices, for nonpartisan judicial offices and for 2 judicial retention offices;

3 3. "Candidate committee" means the only committee authorized by 4 a candidate to accept contributions or make expenditures on behalf 5 of the candidate's campaign, including the campaign of a judicial 6 retention candidate;

4. "Contribution" means any gift, subscription, loan, guarantee 7 or forgiveness of a loan, conveyance, advance, payment, distribution 8 9 or deposit of money made to, or anything of value given to, 10 including **virtual currency**, or an expenditure other than an 11 independent expenditure made on behalf of a political party, 12 political action committee or candidate committee, but shall not include the value of services provided without compensation by an 13 individual who volunteers those services; 14

5. "Expenditure" means a purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, compensation, reimbursement, fee deposit or a gift made by a political party, political action committee, candidate committee or other individual or entity that is used to expressly advocate the election, retention or defeat of one or more clearly identified candidates or for or against one or more state questions;

6. "Limited committee" means a political action committee
organized to make contributions to candidates; a limited committee
may make independent expenditures or electioneering communications,

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1 but may not accept contributions in excess of the limits prescribed 2 for limited committees;

3 7. "Local office" means all elective offices for which a 4 declaration of candidacy is filed with the secretary of any county 5 election board;

8. "Political action committee" means a limited or unlimited
committee that has filed or should have filed a statement of
organization with the Ethics Commission as required by its Rules;

9 9. "Political party" means a political party recognized under10 the laws of this state;

10. "Political party committee" means a committee authorized by 12 the political party to accept contributions or make expenditures on 13 behalf of the political party; a political party committee may 14 include a state committee, a Congressional District committee, a 15 county committee, a precinct committee or any other committee or 16 entity of the party officially recognized in the party's bylaws or 17 similar governing document;

18 11. "State office" means all elective offices for which 19 declarations of candidacy are filed with the Secretary of the State 20 Election Board;

12. "State question" means an initiative or referendum petition for which the Governor has issued a proclamation setting the date on which an election shall be held or a legislative referendum referred by the Legislature for a vote of the people; and

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13. "Unlimited committee" means an independent judicial
 retention committee, a political action committee organized
 exclusively for the purpose of making independent expenditures or
 electioneering communications or a political action committee
 organized exclusively for the purpose of advocating the approval or
 defeat of a state question.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Rule 2.2 of the Rules of the 8 Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2018, Ch. 62, App. I), is amended 9 to read as follows:

10 Rule 2.2. As used in Rule 2:

11 1. "Campaign" means all activities for or against the election 12 of a candidate for elective state office or for or against a state 13 question;

14 2. "Candidate" means an individual who has filed or should have
15 filed a statement of organization for a candidate committee for
16 state office with the Commission as required by these Rules. A
17 candidate committee shall include committees for candidates for
18 partisan elective offices, for nonpartisan judicial offices and for
19 judicial retention offices;

3. "Candidate committee" means the only committee authorized by a candidate to accept contributions or make expenditures on behalf of the candidate's campaign, including the campaign of a judicial retention candidate;

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4. "Clearly identified candidate" means a candidate whose name,
 nickname, photograph or drawing appears, or whose identity is
 otherwise apparent by unambiguous reference;

"Commission" means the Oklahoma Ethics Commission; 5. 4 5 6. "Contribution" means any gift, subscription, loan, guarantee or forgiveness of a loan, conveyance, advance, payment, distribution 6 or deposit of money made to, or anything of value given to, 7 including virtual currency, or an expenditure other than an 8 9 independent expenditure made on behalf of, a political party, 10 political action committee or candidate committee, but shall not 11 include the value of services provided without compensation by an 12 individual who volunteers those services;

7. "Electioneering communication" means any communication or 13 series of communications that is sent by Internet advertising, 14 15 direct mail, broadcast by radio, television, cable or satellite, or 16 appears in a newspaper or magazine that (a) refers to a clearly identified candidate for state office, (b) is made within sixty (60) 17 days before a general election (including a special general 18 election) or thirty (30) days before a primary or runoff primary 19 election (including a special primary or runoff primary election) 20 for the office sought by the candidate, (c) that is targeted to the 21 relevant electorate and (d) does not explicitly advocate the 22 election or defeat of any candidate. "Relevant electorate" shall 23 mean twenty-five thousand (25,000) or more persons in the State of 24

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Oklahoma in the case of a candidate for statewide elective office, two thousand five hundred (2,500) or more persons in the district the candidate seeks to represent in the case of a candidate for the Oklahoma State House of Representatives or judge of the District Court, and five thousand (5,000) or more persons in the district the candidate seeks to represent in the case of all other elective state offices;

8 8. "Expenditure" means a purchase, payment, distribution, loan, 9 advance, compensation, reimbursement, fee, deposit or gift made by a 10 political party, political action committee, candidate committee or 11 other individual or entity that is used to expressly advocate the 12 election, retention or defeat of one or more clearly identified 13 candidates or for or against one or more state questions;

9. "Family member" shall include spouse, children (includingstepchildren), mother, father, sister or brother;

10. "Independent expenditure" means an expenditure made by a 16 person for a communication expressly advocating the election or 17 defeat of a clearly identified candidate or a vote for or against 18 the retention of a judicial retention candidate that is not made in 19 coordination with, cooperation with, consultation with, or concert 20 with, or at the request or suggestion of, a candidate, a candidate 21 committee, or their agents, or a political party committee or its 22 agents. An independent expenditure shall not include the display of 23 a noncommercial yard sign, lapel pin, button, bumper sticker or 24

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1 similar de minimis display of support or opposition to a political
2 party or a candidate;

3 11. "Independent judicial retention committee" means a
4 political action committee organized exclusively for the purpose of
5 making independent expenditures or electioneering communications
6 supporting or opposing the retention of a candidate for judicial
7 retention;

8 12. "Labor union" means an organization of workers formed for
9 the purpose of advancing its members' interests in respect to wages,
10 benefits and working conditions;

11 13. "Limited committee" means a political action committee 12 organized to make contributions to candidates. A limited committee 13 may make independent expenditures or electioneering communications, 14 but may not accept contributions in excess of the limits prescribed 15 for limited committees;

"Officeholder expenses" means ordinary and necessary 16 14. expenses incurred in connection with a candidate's duties as the 17 holder of a state elective office, provided that the expenses are 18 not otherwise reimbursed or paid for by the state. "Ordinary and 19 necessary expenses" are those that would not exist but for the fact 20 that the candidate was elected to and holds a state elective office; 21 "Political action committee" means a limited or unlimited 15. 22 committee that has filed or should have filed a statement of 23

organization with the Commission as required by these Rules;

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1 16. "Political party" means a political party recognized under 2 laws of this state;

3 17. "Political party committee" means a committee authorized by 4 the political party to accept contributions or make expenditures on 5 behalf of the political party. A political party committee may 6 include a state committee, a Congressional District committee, a 7 county committee, a precinct committee or any other committee or 8 entity of the party officially recognized in the party's bylaws or 9 similar governing document;

10 18. "State question communication" means an expenditure made by a person for a communication or series of communications that is 11 12 sent by internet advertising, direct mail, broadcast by radio television, cable or satellite, or appears in a newspaper, magazine, 13 or other printed medium supporting or opposing a state question that 14 is made within sixty (60) days before the election deciding the 15 state question. A state question communication shall not include 16 the display of a noncommercial yard sign, lapel pin, button, bumper 17 sticker or similar de minimis display of support or opposition to a 18 state question; 19

19. "State question" means an initiative or referendum petition for which the Governor has issued a proclamation setting the date on which an election shall be held or a legislative referendum referred by the Legislature for a vote of the people; and

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20. "Unlimited committee" means an independent judicial
 retention committee, a political action committee organized
 exclusively for the purpose of making independent expenditures or
 electioneering communications or a political action committee
 organized exclusively for the purpose of advocating the approval or
 defeat of a state question.

7 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
8 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

9 In accordance with the changes made to the definition of 10 contribution in this act, the Ethics Commission shall promulgate 11 rules to correspond with the change in definition. Such rules shall also require that when **virtual currency** is used and a determination 12 of the value of the **virtual currency** is made, a conversion will be 13 made to United States dollars. The conversion shall be made at the 14 15 prevailing rate within seventy-two (72)) hours of receipt of such virtual currency payment. If the value of the virtual currency 16 results in a dollar amount that exceeds the contribution amount 17 permitted by law, the excess dollar amount shall be deposited into 18 the Ethics 19 Commission Fund created pursuant to Section 4258 of Title 74 of the 20

21 Oklahoma Statutes.
