13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.8, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 5003.8. <u>A.</u> In order to ensure that the Oklahoma
17	Department of Commerce is effectively implementing its mission,
18	purpose and objectives, the Department shall publish an annual
19	report setting forth in detail the operations and programs conducted
20	by it pursuant to <del>this act</del> <u>Section 5003.2 et seq. of this title</u> or
21	to other legislation. The report shall review both statewide
22	progress and departmental progress according to several measures
23	including objective measures listed in the Department's five-year
24	plan. The Department shall present this report to the Governor and

the Legislature. The annual report shall specifically account for 1 2 ways in which the needs, mission and programs of the Department described in this act Section 5003.2 et seq. of this title have been 3 carried out and recommendations shall specifically note what changes 4 5 in the activities of the Department and the programs it administers 6 and of state government are necessary to better address the mission described in this act Section 5003.2 et seq. of this title. 7 The Department shall distribute its annual report by such means that 8 9 will make it widely available to communities, firms and local 10 economic development managers throughout this state.

11 B. In addition to subsection A of this section, the Oklahoma 12 Department of Commerce shall be responsible for collecting data and publishing on their website an annual report to be called the 13 "Future of Oklahoma Industry and Labor (FOIL) Report". The report 14 shall analyze and describe the current and predictable trends of the 15 jobs, industries, and labor workforce in this state. The report 16 shall include an interactive map covering the various regions of the 17 state to show trends in specific job markets, growth industries, and 18 labor workforce shortages as analyzed in the published report. The 19 first report shall be published on July 1, 2022, and a report shall 20 be due each July 1 thereafter. 21 C. In a collaborative effort, the following agencies and 22

23 <u>entities shall work in conjunction with the Department to assist in</u>

24 the collection and analysis of data and the formulation of each

2	shall contribute and analyze data for the Department and shall be
3	required to maintain a link connection to the FOIL report and
4	interactive map on their separate websites:
5	1. Oklahoma Employment Security Commission;
6	2. Department of Labor;
7	3. Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education;
8	4. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education;
9	5. The Center for Economic Management Research at the
10	University of Oklahoma; and
11	6. The Center for Economic and Business Development at
12	Southwestern Oklahoma State University.
13	D. The report shall be utilized by the State Department of
14	Education and the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology
15	Education, and may be utilized by the various public and private
16	secondary and higher education institutions of this state, to
17	identify and prepare specific course content and curriculum which
18	trains students for future occupations, job markets, identified
19	growth industries, labor workforce trends, gaps in skill level, and
20	highly marketable professions in this state.
