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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1990.2, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-1990.2. As used in the Silver Alert Act:
16	1. "Alert" means the statewide silver alert for missing senior
17	citizens or distressed individuals;
18	2. "Local law enforcement agency" includes, but is not limited
19	to, a county sheriff's office, a police department of a municipality
20	or city, or the state highway patrol;
21	3. "Media outlet" includes but is not limited to radio
22	stations, television stations, newspapers and local support
23	organizations; and

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1	4. "Missing senior citizen or distressed individual" means a
2	person:
3	a. whose whereabouts are unknown,
4	b. whose age at the time the person is first reported
5	missing is sixty (60) years of age or older and who is
6	believed to be suffering from dementia or other
7	cognitive impairment, and
8	c. whose disappearance poses a credible threat to the
9	safety and health of the person, as determined by a
10	local law enforcement agency, or
11	d. whose current mental health status prohibits them from
12	reasonable and prudent judgment.
13	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1990.3, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-1990.3. The Department of Public Safety shall develop
16	and implement a statewide silver alert system to be activated on
17	behalf of a missing senior citizen or distressed individual in
18	cooperation with the Department of Transportation, the Department of
19	Human Services, any local law enforcement agency, the Oklahoma
20	Association of Broadcasters and any other appropriate state or local
21	agencies.
22	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1990.4, is
23	amended to read as follows:

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1	e. the procedures for the receipt and evaluation of
2	information received from the public about the missing
3	senior citizen <u>or individual</u> , and
4	f. the procedure for the termination of a silver alert;
5	and
6	2. Coordinate with local and statewide media outlets for the
7	rapid and accurate announcement of a silver alert to the public.
