9	An Act relating to the Child Abuse Prevention Act; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-227.2, as amended by
10	Section 47, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1-227.2), which relates to power and
11	duties of Office of Child Abuse Prevention; modifying criteria of certain annual report; transferring
12	duties to the State Commissioner of Health; requiring
13	the Department of Human Services and the Division of Vital Records to provide certain information to the
14	Office of Child Abuse Prevention or appropriate division of the State Department of Health; requiring
15	the Office of Child Abuse Prevention to review information and offer services as needed; and

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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-227.2, as
20	amended by Section 47, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2018,
21	Section 1-227.2), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 1-227.2. A. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention,
23	giving consideration to the recommendations of the Infant and

Prepare and implement a comprehensive state plan for the
 planning and coordination of child abuse prevention programs and
 services and for the establishment, development and funding of such
 programs and services, and to revise and update said the plan
 pursuant to the provisions of Section 1-227.3 of this title;

8 2. Monitor, evaluate and review the development and quality of 9 services and programs for the prevention of child abuse and neglect, 10 publish and distribute an annual report of its findings on or before 11 January 1 of each year to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of 12 Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and to the 13 chief administrative officer of each agency affected by the report. 14 The report shall include:

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a. activities of the Office,

- b. a summary detailing the demographic characteristics of
  families served including, but not limited to, the
  following:
- 19 (1) age and marital status of parent(s),
  - (2) number and age of children living in the household,
    - (3) household composition of families served,
- (4) number of families accepted into the program by
   grantee site and average length of time enrolled,

1	(5) number of families not accepted into the program
2	and the reason therefor, <del>and</del>
3	(6) average actual expenditures per family during the
4	most recent state fiscal year, and
5	(7) number of individuals whose parental rights have
6	ever been terminated and number of children born
7	to an individual whose parental rights have ever
8	been terminated,
9	c. recommendations for the further development and
10	improvement of services and programs for the
11	prevention of child abuse and neglect, and
12	d. budget and program needs; and
13	3. Conduct or otherwise provide for or make available
14	continuing professional education and training in the area of child
15	abuse prevention.
16	B. For the purpose of implementing the provisions of the Child
17	Abuse Prevention Act, the State Department of Health is authorized
18	to:
19	1. Accept appropriations, gifts, loans and grants from the
20	state and federal government and from other sources, public or
21	private;
22	2. Enter into agreements or contracts for the establishment and
23	development of:
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- a. programs and services for the prevention of child
   abuse and neglect,
- 3 b. training programs for the prevention of child abuse4 and neglect, and
- c. multidisciplinary and discipline specific training
  programs for professionals with responsibilities
  affecting children, youth and families; and
- 8 3. Secure necessary statistical, technical, administrative and
  9 operational services by interagency agreement or contract.

10 C. For the purpose of implementing the provisions of the Child 11 Abuse Prevention Act, the State <u>Board Commissioner</u> of Health, giving 12 consideration to the recommendations of the Infant and Children's 13 Health Advisory Council created in Section <u>44</u> <u>1-103a.1</u> of this <del>act</del> 14 <u>title</u>, is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations as 15 necessary to implement the duties and responsibilities assigned to 16 the Office of Child Abuse Prevention.

D. 1. The Department of Human Services shall, as soon as
reasonably possible, provide the State Department of Health access
to the identifying information of all individuals who, as to any
child, have had their parental rights terminated and the conditions
which led to the making of the finding which resulted in the
termination of parental rights.
2. The Division of Vital Records shall provide birth record

24 information to the Office of Child Abuse Prevention for a child born

1	to an individual whose identifying information has been provided
2	pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection.
3	3. The Office of Child Abuse Prevention or other appropriate
4	division of the State Department of Health shall review the
5	information provided by the Department of Human Services and the
6	Division of Vital Records and, when appropriate and if the resources
7	are available, provide an assessment of the family and offer
8	services if needed.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
