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7	An Act relating to public health; providing short title; creating the "Smoking Cessation and Prevention
8 9	Act of 2017"; expressing legislative intent; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1525, which relates to owner
9	prevention of smoking in nonsmoking areas; requiring signage in additional locations; directing certain agencies to inform the public of the danger of using
11	tobacco products in a motor vehicle where certain children are present; prohibiting the use of tobacco
12	products in certain properties; providing exception; directing certain agency collaboration for certain
13	purpose; expressing legislative intent and findings; assessing a smoking cessation fee on the wholesale
14	sale of cigarettes; providing fee amounts; providing for apportionment of fees; defining terms; requiring
15	the promulgation of rules; creating the Health Care Enhancement Fund; exempting funds from fiscal year
16	limitations; identifying funding source; authorizing appropriation from certain fund; limiting sale of
17	certain excise stamps under specified condition; providing for noncodification; providing for
18	codification; and declaring an emergency.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
22	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
23	It being immediately necessary for the health and welfare of the
24	people of the State of Oklahoma that smoking rates be reduced and

1 that children be warned of and protected from the dangers of 2 smoking, there is hereby created an act which shall be known and may 3 be cited as the "Smoking Cessation Act of 2017".

4 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 5 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

6 It is the intent of the Legislature that the revenues derived 7 pursuant to the fee imposed in Section 7 of this act be used 8 throughout this state for the purposes of preventing Oklahomans from 9 smoking cigarettes and encouraging Oklahomans who already do so to 10 cease cigarette smoking. Any revenue collected pursuant to the 11 provisions of this act shall be subject to the rebate provisions of 12 state-tribal compacts relating to tobacco sales.

13SECTION 3.AMENDATORY63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1525, is14amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1-1525. The state or local governmental agency or the 16 person who owns or operates a public place shall, at a minimum, do 17 the following in order to prevent smoking in public places:

Post <u>conspicuous</u> signs at entrances to <u>and in prominent</u>
 <u>locations within</u> places where smoking is prohibited which state that
 smoking is prohibited or that the indoor environment is free of
 tobacco smoke; and

22 2. Ask smokers to refrain from smoking upon observation of
23 anyone violating the provisions of this act Section 1-1521 et seq.
24 of this title.

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1 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1528 of Title 63, unless there 2 3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: The State Department of Health and the Tobacco Settlement 4 5 Endowment Trust shall work together to inform the public about the dangers of smoking in motor vehicles where children are present. 6 SECTION 5. A new section of law to be codified 7 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1529 of Title 63, unless there 8 9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 10 The use of any tobacco product shall be prohibited on any and 11 all properties owned, leased or contracted for use by the State of 12 Oklahoma, including but not limited to all buildings, land and 13 vehicles owned, leased or contracted for use by agencies or instrumentalities of the State of Oklahoma. Provided, these 14 15 prohibitions shall not apply to the Oklahoma Veterans Centers. SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1530 of Title 63, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 The Oklahoma State Department of Health and the Department of 19 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall work together to 20

develop new and innovative strategies to prevent tobacco use by

- 22 minors.
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SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1531 of Title 63, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Smoking remains the number one preventable cause of death in 4 Α. 5 Oklahoma, killing more people than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, illegal drugs, murders and suicides combined. Eighty-eight thousand 6 Oklahoma children alive today will die prematurely of smoking-7 related illnesses. Increasing the price point of cigarettes is the 8 9 single most effective strategy to reduce cigarette consumption by 10 deterring children and adolescents from taking up smoking, by 11 reducing the overall consumption of cigarettes by an estimated 12 26,000,000 cigarette packs in the first year, by reducing the prevalence of adult smoking by an estimated five percent (5%), by 13 preventing an estimated 28,000 kids today from becoming adult 14 15 smokers, and by reducing health-related disparities among income groups over time. For the reasons stated and in furtherance of the 16 stated purpose of this act, there shall be assessed by the Oklahoma 17 Tax Commission a smoking cessation fee on cigarettes, to be remitted 18 by every wholesaler, as provided in subsection B of this section. 19

B. The fee provided in this subsection shall be One Dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per twenty (20) cigarette package, and a proportionate rate on fractions thereof.

C. Beginning on the effective date of this act, and allsubsequent years, the smoking cessation fee provided by this section

shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and transmitted
 to the State Treasurer, who shall deposit the same in the State
 Treasury to the credit of the following funds in the following
 percentages:

5 a. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to the ABLE Commission Revolving Fund created in Section 567 of 6 Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the purpose of 7 enhanced enforcement of the provisions of Section 8 9 600.13 of Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and all amounts in excess of One Million Dollars b. 10 11 (\$1,000,000.00) to the credit of the Health Care Enhancement Fund created in Section 8 of this act. 12 For purposes of this section "cigarette" and "wholesaler" 13 D. shall have the same meaning as in Section 301 of Title 68 of the 14 15 Oklahoma Statutes.

16 E. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall promulgate rules as needed 17 to implement the provisions of this section.

18 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1532 of Title 63, unless there 20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be designated the "Health Care Enhancement Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies received pursuant to Section 7 of this act and any

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monies designated to the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund shall be appropriated at the discretion of the Legislature for the purpose of enhancing the health of Oklahomans. SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

For the purpose of ensuring maximum wholesaler compliance with 6 7 remittance of the smoking cessation fee, the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall not sell cigarette excise tax stamps to any wholesaler in 8 9 excess of the amount of the monthly average amount of such excise 10 tax stamps sold to such wholesaler during the preceding calendar 11 year prior to the effective date of this act. Provided, the 12 wholesaler may purchase in excess of the monthly average purchased 13 during the preceding calendar year upon documentation, to the Tax Commission's satisfaction, of probable sales greater than the 14 15 wholesaler's sales in the preceding calendar year.

16 SECTION 10. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 17 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
