L 6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L7	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3234 of Title 70, unless there
L 9	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. A state educational institution within The Oklahoma State
21	System of Higher Education may require employees to complete
22	training or professional development on the following topics:
23	1. Sexual harassment;

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1 3. Fire safety;
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- 2 4. Conflicts of interest;
- 3 5. Cybersecurity;
- 4 6. Information technology compliance and data protection,

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- 7. Mental health awareness and suicide prevention;
- 8 8. Substance abuse and alcohol abuse;
- 9 9. Emergency management, including active shooter training and

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- B. A state educational institution within The Oklahoma State
  System of Higher Education may provide employees with optional
  training or professional development on other topics as deemed
  appropriate by the governing board of regents for the institution;
  provided, however, an employee may opt out of optional training or
  professional development without reprisal or retaliation from the
  institution.
- C. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this act.
- 10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
  - SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
