7	An Act relating to the School Safety and Bullying Prevention Act; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 24-
8	100.4, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 277, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 24-100.4),
9	which relates to school bullying policies; modifying requirement for training administrators and school
10	employees; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 24-100.4, as
15	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 277, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp.
16	2017, Section 24-100.4), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 24-100.4. A. Each district board of education shall
18	adopt a policy for the discipline of all children attending public
19	school in that district, and for the investigation of reported
20	incidents of bullying. The policy shall provide options for the
21	discipline of the students and shall define standards of conduct to
22	which students are expected to conform. The policy shall:
23	1. Specifically address bullying by students at school and by
24	electronic communication, if the communication is specifically

1 directed at students or school personnel and concerns bullying at 2 school;

2. Contain a procedure for reporting an act of bullying to a
school official or law enforcement agency, including a provision
that permits a person to report an act anonymously. No formal
disciplinary action shall be taken solely on the basis of an
anonymous report;

8 3. Contain a requirement that any school employee that has 9 reliable information that would lead a reasonable person to suspect 10 that a person is a target of bullying shall immediately report it to 11 the principal or a designee of the principal;

12 4. Contain a statement of how the policy is to be publicized13 including a requirement that:

a. an annual written notice of the policy be provided to
parents, guardians, staff, volunteers and students,
with age-appropriate language for students,

b. notice of the policy be posted at various locations
within each school site, including but not limited to
cafeterias, school bulletin boards, and administration
offices,

c. the policy be posted on the Internet website for the
school district and each school site that has an
Internet website, and

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d. the policy be included in all student and employee
 handbooks;

5. Require that appropriate school district personnel involved in investigating reports of bullying make a determination regarding whether the conduct is actually occurring;

6 6. Contain a procedure for providing timely notification to the 7 parents or guardians of a victim of documented and verified bullying 8 and to the parents or guardians of the perpetrator of the documented 9 and verified bullying;

Identify by job title the school official responsible for
 enforcing the policy;

12 8. Contain procedures for reporting to law enforcement all 13 documented and verified acts of bullying which may constitute 14 criminal activity or reasonably have the potential to endanger 15 school safety;

9. Require annual training <u>once every three (3) years</u> for
administrators and school employees as developed and provided by the
State Department of Education in preventing, identifying, responding
to and reporting incidents of bullying;

20 10. Provide for an educational program as designed and 21 developed by the State Department of Education and in consultation 22 with the Office of Juvenile Affairs for students and parents in 23 preventing, identifying, responding to and reporting incidents of 24 bullying;

15	13. Establish a procedure for:	
16	a. the investigation, determination and documentati	on of
17	all incidents of bullying reported to school	
18	officials,	
19	b. identifying the principal or a designee of the	
20	principal as the person responsible for investig	ating
21	incidents of bullying,	
22	c. reporting the number of incidents of bullying, a	ınd
23	d. determining the severity of the incidents and th	neir
24	potential to result in future violence;	

14. Establish a procedure whereby, upon completing an
 investigation of bullying, a school may recommend that available
 community mental health care, substance abuse or other counseling
 options be provided to the student, if appropriate; and

5 15. Establish a procedure whereby a school may request the disclosure of any information concerning students who have received 6 mental health, substance abuse, or other care pursuant to paragraph 7 14 of this subsection that indicates an explicit threat to the 8 9 safety of students or school personnel, provided the disclosure of 10 the information does not violate the requirements and provisions of 11 the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, the Health 12 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Section 2503 13 of Title 12 of the Oklahoma Statutes, Section 1376 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, or any other state or federal laws regarding 14 the disclosure of confidential information. 15

In developing the policy, the district board of education 16 Β. shall make an effort to involve the teachers, parents, 17 administrators, school staff, school volunteers, community 18 representatives, local law enforcement agencies and students. 19 The students, teachers, and parents or guardian of every child residing 20 within a school district shall be notified by the district board of 21 education of its adoption of the policy and shall receive a copy 22 upon request. The school district policy shall be implemented in a 23

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manner that is ongoing throughout the school year and is integrated
 with other violence prevention efforts.

C. The teacher of a child attending a public school shall have the same right as a parent or guardian to control and discipline such child according to district policies during the time the child is in attendance or in transit to or from the school or any other school function authorized by the school district or classroom presided over by the teacher.

9 D. Except concerning students on individualized education plans 10 (IEP) pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), P.L. No. 101-476, the State Board of Education shall not 11 12 have authority to prescribe student disciplinary policies for school districts or to proscribe corporal punishment in the public schools. 13 The State Board of Education shall not have authority to require 14 school districts to file student disciplinary action reports more 15 often than once each year and shall not use disciplinary action 16 reports in determining a school district's or school site's 17 eligibility for program assistance including competitive grants. 18

E. The board of education of each school district in this state shall have the option of adopting a dress code for students enrolled in the school district. The board of education of a school district shall also have the option of adopting a dress code which includes school uniforms.

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F. The board of education of each school district in this state
 shall have the option of adopting a procedure that requires students
 to perform campus-site service for violating the district's policy.

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G. The State Board of Education shall:

5 1. Promulgate rules for periodically monitoring school
6 districts for compliance with this section and providing sanctions
7 for noncompliance with this section;

8 2. Establish and maintain a central repository for the
9 collection of information regarding documented and verified
10 incidents of bullying; and

3. Publish a report annually on the State Department of
 Education website regarding the number of documented and verified
 incidents of bullying in the public schools in the state.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.

15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 16 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
