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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
23	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 56 O.S. 2011, Section 1017.1, is
24	amended to read as follows:

- Section 1017.1 A. Sections 1 through 5 of this act Sections

 1017.1 through 1017.5 of this title and Section 2 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Choices for Long-Term Care Act".
- B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Choices for Long-Term Care Act is to make long-term services and supports for citizens easily accessible, cost-effective and of high quality and to provide a comprehensive and systematic approach to addressing these needs. The Oklahoma Choices for Long-Term Care Act shall provide older Oklahomans and adults with physical disabilities the opportunity to choose where they live and receive their services, and provide efficient administration of the ADvantage Waiver Program.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.6 of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. As used in this section, "Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)" means a full risk-bearing program that provides comprehensive health services for individuals age fifty-five (55) and over who are sufficiently frail to be categorized as nursing home eligible by the state's Medicaid program. PACE shall be reimbursed on a fixed per-member per-month rate and, in return for such fixed payment, is responsible for providing all health services, including transportation.

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- B. 1. Persons who are fifty-five (55) years of age or older, or their legal guardians or lay caregivers, shall receive options counseling for long-term care as defined in Section 3002.7 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes prior to the admission of a long-term care facility, except in the case of an emergency admission.

 Options counseling shall include, but not be limited to, PACE, if so applicable, nursing facilities and home- and community-based services.
 - 2. In the case of an emergency admission, the options counseling for long-term care shall take place within fourteen (14) days or as soon as is reasonably possible.
- 3. Persons who are fifty-five (55) years of age or older and live within the defined service area of a PACE provider shall receive information regarding PACE as part of options counseling for long-term care as defined in Section 3002.7 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 4. Any person currently residing in a nursing facility shall be able to receive options counseling for long-term care as defined in Section 3002.7 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes at the person's, or their legal guardian's or lay caregiver's, request or at the time of any reevaluation or renewal of long-term care. Nothing in this section shall require any person currently residing in a nursing facility to receive options counseling if they do not desire to do so.

1	C. A PACE organization shall be permitted to engage in
2	enrollment practices throughout the entirety of each month, to be
3	effective the first day of the following month.

- Oklahomans and adults with physical disabilities the opportunity to choose where they live and receive their services, and provide efficient administration of the ADvantage Waiver Program.
- SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.6 of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. As used in this section, "Program of All-Inclusive Care of the Elderly (PACE)" means a full-risk-bearing program that provides comprehensive health services for individuals age sixty-five (65) and over who are sufficiently frail to be categorized as nursing home eligible by the state's Medicaid program. PACE shall be reimbursed on a fixed per-member per-month rate, and, in return for such fixed payment, is responsible for providing all health services, including transportation.
 - B. 1. Beginning November 1, 2019, persons who are sixty-five (65) years of age or greater and live within the defined service area of a Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) shall receive a referral to the PACE organization from the Department of Human Services prior to enrolling in any Long-Term Supports and Services (LTSS) programming outlined in the Oklahoma Choices for Long-Term Care Act.
- 2. Seniors who are being served by other LTSS programming
 before November 1, 2019, who are sixty-five (65) years of age or
 greater and live within the defined service area of PACE shall be

- referred to the PACE organization prior to any re-evaluation or renewal of service period.
 - C. The PACE organization shall have sixty (60) calendar days from documented receipt of referral to complete the level of care and safety in the community determination.
 - D. 1. A task force shall be assembled to review the current LTSS assessment and evaluation process to determine the necessity of an improved assessment methodology.
 - 2. The task force shall be comprised of:
 - a. three members of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority

 Board selected by the Governor,
 - b. three representatives of the Department of Human Services selected by the Director of the Department of Human Services,
 - c. three representatives of providers of ADvantage Waiver services selected by the Department of Human Services,
 - d. three representatives of PACE providers to be selected by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority,
 - e. three representatives of providers of adult day care services selected by the Protective Health Services,

 Long-Term Care Division of the State Department of Health, and
 - f. three representatives of the home care industry selected by the State Department of Health.

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1	3. The task force shall meet monthly and provide a formal
2	recommendation to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the
3	Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives for continued
4	evaluation methods and tools for LTSS within one (1) calendar year
5	of the first task force meeting.
6	E. The PACE organization shall be permitted to engage in
7	enrollment practices throughout the entirety of each month, to be
8	effective the first day of the following month.
