7	An Act relating to hunting licenses; amending 29 O.S.
8	2021, Sections 4-112, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 208, O.S.L. 2022, 4-130, and 4-144 (29 O.S.
9	Supp. 2022, Section 4-112), which relate to hunting licenses, waterfowl stamp, and black bear hunting
10	license; increasing nonresident fees; and providing an effective date.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-112, as
15	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 208, O.S.L. 2022 (29 O.S. Supp.
16	2022, Section 4-112), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 4-112. A. Except as otherwise provided for in the
18	Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code or the Oklahoma Farmed Cervidae
19	Act, no person may hunt, pursue, trap, harass, catch, kill, take or
20	attempt to take in any manner, use, have in possession, sell, or
21	transport all or any portion of any wildlife except fish, without
22	having first procured a license from the Department of Wildlife
23	Conservation. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
24	designate a consecutive Saturday and Sunday in September of each

<sup>1</sup> year as free hunting days in which residents of this state may hunt <sup>2</sup> without first procuring a hunting license pursuant to the provisions <sup>3</sup> of this section.

B. The following legal residents of Oklahoma shall be exempt
from the annual hunting license requirement of paragraph 1 of
subsection E of this section and the following nonresidents shall be
exempt from the annual nonresident hunting licenses required
pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section:

1. Legal residents under sixteen (16) years of age;

10 2. Legal residents sixty-five (65) years of age or older 11 provided they have obtained a senior citizen lifetime hunting or 12 combination hunting and fishing license pursuant to the provisions 13 of Section 4-114 of this title;

3. Legal residents born on or before January 1, 1923;

4. Legal resident veterans having a disability of sixty percent (60%) or more and registered with the veterans registry created by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; provided, that if the veteran has previously received an exemption pursuant to this paragraph, no registration with the veterans registry shall be required;

21 5. Legal resident owners or tenants who hunt on land owned or 22 leased by them;

<sup>1</sup> 7. Legal residents having a proven disability which renders
<sup>2</sup> them nonambulatory and confines them to a wheelchair, as certified
<sup>3</sup> by a physician licensed in this state or in any state which borders
<sup>4</sup> this state;

8. Any legal resident or nonresident under eighteen (18) years
of age who is in the physical custody of a child care facility as
defined by Section 402 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

9. Any legal resident or nonresident hunting, pursuing,
 9 trapping, harassing, catching, killing, taking, or attempting to
 10 take in any manner any species of rattlesnake during an organized
 11 rattlesnake-hunting event or festival and who has a rattlesnake
 12 permit issued pursuant to Section 4-143 of this title.

C. Except as otherwise provided for in the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code, the nonresident hunting licenses issued pursuant to this section and the fee for each license shall be:

16 1. Annual hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other 17 than deer, antelope, elk or bear which expires one (1) year after 18 the date of issuance - One Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$175.00). 19 Nonresidents hunting big game or combination big game and upland 20 game in a commercial hunting area shall be required to have this 21 license;

22 2. Gun hunting license for deer for nonresidents which shall be 23 valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current calendar year

1 deer gun season - Two Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars (\$279.00) Four 2 Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$423.00);

3 3. Archery hunting license for deer for nonresidents which 4 shall expire on January 15 of the calendar year after the year 5 purchased or if purchased during the deer archery season it shall 6 expire at the end of that deer archery season - Two Hundred Seventy-7 nine Dollars (\$279.00) Four Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$423.00);

8 4. Primitive firearms hunting license for deer for nonresidents
 9 which shall be valid for hunting all deer allowed during the current
 10 calendar year deer primitive firearms season - Two Hundred Seventy 11 nine Dollars (\$279.00) Four Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$423.00);

12 5. Hunting license for antelope for nonresidents - Three 13 Hundred Five Dollars (\$305.00) Four Hundred Twenty-three Dollars 14 (\$423.00);

15 6. Hunting license for elk for nonresidents - Three Hundred 16 Five Dollars (\$305.00) Four Hundred Twenty-three Dollars (\$423.00);

Five-day hunting license for nonresidents hunting game other than deer, antelope, elk, quail, turkey or bear - Seventy-four Dollars (\$74.00). Nonresidents hunting big game or combination big game and upland game in a commercial hunting area shall be required to have this license; and

8. Ten-day hunting license for nonresidents hunting small game
 in a commercial hunting area - Five Dollars (\$5.00).

D. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of subsection C of this section:

<sup>3</sup> 1. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee of each license <sup>4</sup> issued pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 7 of subsection C of this <sup>5</sup> section and Two Dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) of the license fee <sup>6</sup> for each license issued pursuant to paragraph 8 of subsection C of <sup>7</sup> this section shall be deposited in the Wildlife Land Acquisition <sup>8</sup> Fund created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-132 of this <sup>9</sup> title; and

10 2. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee for each license 11 issued pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 8 of subsection C of this 12 section shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp and shall be 13 deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund created pursuant to the 14 provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

E. Except as otherwise provided, the annual resident hunting licenses issued pursuant to this subsection shall expire one (1) year after the date of issuance. The resident hunting licenses issued pursuant to this section and the fee for each license shall be:

20 1. Annual hunting license for residents eighteen (18) years of 21 age and older - Thirty-one Dollars (\$31.00);

22 2. Annual hunting license for residents sixteen (16) or 23 seventeen (17) years of age - Six Dollars (\$6.00);

<sup>1</sup> 3. Ten-day hunting license for residents for small game in a <sup>2</sup> commercial hunting area - Five Dollars (\$5.00);

3 4. Five-year disability hunting license for residents for at 4 least six (6) months who are receiving Social Security Disability 5 benefits, Supplemental Security Income benefits or disability 6 benefits under the Railroad Retirement Act, 45 U.S.C.A., Section 7 231a, or residents who are one-hundred-percent disabled and are 8 receiving disability payments from the Multiple Injury Trust Fund 9 pursuant to Section 31 of Title 85A of the Oklahoma Statutes - Ten 10 Dollars (\$10.00);

5. Gun hunting license for deer for residents eighteen (18) years of age or older - Nineteen Dollars (\$19.00). The following persons shall be exempt:

4 residents with proper certification from the United a. 5 States Department of Veterans Affairs or its 6 successor, certifying that the person is a disabled 7 veteran in receipt of compensation at the one-hundred-8 percent rate and registered with the veterans registry 9 created by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans 10 Affairs; provided, that if the veteran has previously 11 received the exemption pursuant to this subparagraph, 12 no registration with the veterans registry shall be 13 required, and

 residents hunting in big game or combination big game and upland game commercial hunting areas.

F. Of the fees collected pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 1 of subsection E of this section, Five Dollars (\$5.00) of the license fee shall be for the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Stamp and shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Wildlife Land Fund created pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-141 of this title.

G. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to require a hunting license, resident or nonresident, of any person merely because the person participates, as owner or handler of an entry, as an official, or as a spectator in the conduct of a field <sup>1</sup> trial or performance test of dogs, whether a resident or nonresident <sup>2</sup> of this state. No license to hunt shall be required of any person <sup>3</sup> engaged in training or working dogs, provided that person is in no <sup>4</sup> way engaged in hunting and does not take or attempt to take in any <sup>5</sup> manner any game.

6 Η. 1. Any person arrested for hunting game other than deer, 7 antelope, elk, bear or turkey without a valid hunting license as 8 required by the provisions of subsection A of this section may 9 purchase a substitute temporary thirty-day license from the 10 arresting game warden in lieu of posting bond. Proof of hunter 11 safety certification will not be required for the temporary 12 substitute license. The fee for a substitute license purchased 13 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be:

a. for legal residents, Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and
b. for nonresidents, One Hundred Forty-five Dollars (\$145.00).

17 2. Except as otherwise provided for by this subsection, the 18 fees from licenses purchased pursuant to the provisions of this 19 subsection shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund to 20 be used exclusively for developing, managing, preserving, and 21 protecting wildlife and wildlife habitat.

I. Any person producing proof in court that a current hunting license issued by the Department of Wildlife Conservation to that person was in force at the time of the alleged offense shall be

entitled to dismissal of a charge of violating this section upon payment of court costs. If proof of a current hunting license issued by the Department to the person that was in force at the time of the alleged offense is presented to the court or district attorney within seventy-two (72) hours after the violation, the charge shall be dismissed without payment of court costs.

J. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by subsection H of this section, any resident convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by the imposition of a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both.

K. Unless a substitute license is purchased as provided for by subsection H of this section, any nonresident convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by the imposition of a fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by both.

19 L. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission shall 20 promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this 21 section.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-130, is amended to read as follows:

1 Section 4-130. A. Except as otherwise provided in the Oklahoma 2 Wildlife Conservation Code, no person may hunt or take any waterfowl 3 during the open season on waterfowl unless the person has first 4 obtained an Oklahoma waterfowl hunting stamp or license from the 5 Director or authorized agents of the Director. Each person shall 6 have the stamp or license in their possession when hunting or taking 7 any waterfowl. When a stamp is purchased, the stamp shall be 8 validated by the signature of the licensee written across the face 9 of the stamp. 10 Persons excepted from the Oklahoma waterfowl hunting stamp в. 11 or license requirement of this section are: 12 1. Legal residents of Oklahoma under sixteen (16) years of age; 13 and 14 2. Legal residents of Oklahoma sixty-five (65) years of age or 15 older. 16 С. 1. The Oklahoma waterfowl hunting stamp fee and waterfowl 17 license shall each be Nine Dollars (\$9.00) for residents and Thirty 18 Dollars (\$30.00) for nonresidents. The remainder of the fee shall 19 be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund, to be used 20 exclusively in the State of Oklahoma, for the purpose of developing, 21 managing, preserving, restoring and maintaining wetland habitats and 22 for the conservation and management of waterfowl and ecologically 23 related species. 24

1 2. The collection and remittance procedures applicable to 2 hunting license fees under this title shall apply to waterfowl stamp 3 or license fees.

3. The waterfowl stamp or license issued pursuant to this
<sup>5</sup> section shall expire on June 30 of each year.

D. The Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission may prescribe,
 by regulation, the form, design and manner of issuance, if any, of
 the waterfowl stamp, which could include the selection of art for
 such stamp from an art contest regulated by the Commission.

10 Ε. Any person arrested for hunting or taking any waterfowl 1. 11 during the open season on waterfowl without a valid Oklahoma 12 waterfowl hunting stamp or license as required by the provisions of 13 subsection A of this section may purchase a substitute temporary 14 thirty-day stamp or license from the arresting game warden in lieu 15 of posting bond. Proof of hunter safety certification shall not be 16 required for the temporary substitute stamp or license. The fee for 17 a substitute stamp or license purchased pursuant to the provisions 18 of this subsection shall be:

a. for legal residents - Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and
b. for nonresidents - One Hundred Forty-five Dollars
(\$145.00).

22 2. The fees from the temporary stamp and license purchased
23 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall be deposited in
24 the Wildlife Conservation Fund, to be used exclusively in the State

<sup>1</sup> of Oklahoma, for the purpose of developing, managing, preserving, <sup>2</sup> restoring and maintaining wetland habitats and for the conservation <sup>3</sup> and management of waterfowl and ecologically related species.

F. Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of
this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twentyfive Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

G. Nothing in this title shall prohibit a person from hunting
waterfowl exclusively on their own property without an Oklahoma
waterfowl hunting stamp or license.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 4-144, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-144. A. No person may hunt or take black bear without having first procured a license from the Director of Wildlife Conservation or an agent of the Director.

B. The Wildlife Conservation Commission shall decide the open season, the bag limits, and territorial limitations for hunting or taking black bear.

18 C. The fees for a license issued pursuant to this section shall 19 be:

20 1. For legal residents, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); and 21 2. For nonresidents, Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) Six Hundred 22 Twenty-three Dollars (\$623.00).

D. Any person who fails to obtain a license as required in subsection A of this section and pay the fee as required in

<sup>1</sup> paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section, upon conviction, shall <sup>2</sup> be punished by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) <sup>3</sup> nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in <sup>4</sup> the county jail for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or by <sup>5</sup> both said fine and imprisonment.

6 Ε. Any person who fails to obtain a license as required in 7 subsection A of this section and pay the fee as required in 8 paragraph 2 of subsection C of this section, upon conviction, shall 9 be punished by a fine of not less than Eight Hundred Dollars 10 (\$800.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by 11 imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed six (6) 12 months, or by both said fine and imprisonment. 13 SECTION 4.
