7	An Act relating to health care; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 650, which relates to interventional pain management; modifying, adding, and deleting definitions; authorizing Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist to provide certain services and operate certain facilities under specified conditions; providing certain construction; and providing an effective date.							
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 650, is							
15	amended to read as follows:							
16	Section 650. A. This act section shall be known and may be							
17	cited as the "Oklahoma Interventional Pain Management and Treatment							
18	Act".							
19	B. As used in this section:							
20	1. "Chronic pain" means a pain state which is subacute,							
21	persistent and intractable;							
22	2. "Fluoroscope" means a radiologic instrument equipped with a							
23	fluorescent screen on which opaque internal structures can be viewed							
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1	as moving shadow images formed by the differential transmission of							
2	X-rays throughout the body							
3	"Fluoroscopy" means a medical imaging procedure that uses an X-							
4	ray beam to take real-time footage of moving internal body parts							
5	such as bones, muscles, joints, organs, and tissue to display a							
6	consistent radiographic picture progressively onto a screen; and							
7	3. "Interventional pain management" means the practice of							
8	medicine delivery of health care services devoted to the diagnosis							
9	and treatment of chronic pain, through the use of such techniques							
10	as:							
11	a. ablation of targeted nerves,							
12	b. percutaneous precision needle placement within the							
13	spinal column with placement of drugs such as local							
14	anesthetics, steroids, <u>and</u> analgesics in targeted							
15	areas of the spinal column, or							
16	c. surgical techniques, such as laser or endoscopic							
17	diskectomy, intrathecal infusion pumps and spinal cord							
18	stimulators <u>, or</u>							
19	d. fluoroscopy.							
20	C. It shall be unlawful to practice or offer to practice							
21	interventional pain management in this state unless such person has:							
22	<u>1. Has</u> been duly licensed under the provisions of the Oklahoma							
23	Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act or the							
24 4	Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act <u>; or</u>							

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<u>2. Is a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist licensed in</u>
 <u>accordance with the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act who holds a valid</u>
 <u>certification in Nonsurgical Pain Management from the National Board</u>
 <u>of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists and</u>
 <u>practices in accordance with the certification</u>.

D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to forbid the
 administration of lumbar intra-laminar epidural steroid injections
 or peripheral nerve blocks by a certified registered nurse
 anesthetist when requested to do so by a physician and under the
 supervision of <u>A Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist who meets</u>
 the criteria of subsection C of this section may:

12 <u>1. Practice interventional pain management, except for surgical</u> 13 <u>techniques, in collaboration with</u> an allopathic or osteopathic 14 physician licensed in this state and under conditions in which 15 timely on-site consultation by such allopathic or osteopathic 16 physician is available.

E. A certified registered nurse anesthetist shall not operate;
 Operate a freestanding pain management facility without
 direct supervision of a in collaboration with an allopathic or
 osteopathic physician who is board-certified in interventional pain
 management or its equivalent; and

E. Nothing in this section shall authorize a Certified
Registered Nurse Anesthetist to prescribe or dispense any opioid or
