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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
15	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
16	The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall not reduce
17	reimbursement rates to skilled nursing facility services, including
18	intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual
19	disability (ICF/IID) services if those services are determined to be
20	below ninety-five percent (95%) of audited reports of allowable
21	costs. Any increases in Federal Medical Assistance Percentage
22	(FMAP) rates shall be prioritized to maintain Medicaid-funded
23	skilled nursing facility services including ICF/IID services equal
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1 to but not exceeding 100 percent (100%) of audited reports of 2 allowable costs.

3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
