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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.12 of Title 70, unless
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. Emotional literacy education shall be taught in the public
22	school districts in this state. Emotional literacy education shall
23	include but is not limited to the following areas of instruction:
24	1. Understanding emotion vocabulary;

- 2. Understanding facial expressions of emotion;
- 3. Understanding coping skills. "Coping skills" means constantly changing cognitive and behavioral efforts to manage specific external and/or internal demands that are appraised as taxing or exceeding the resources of the person; and
 - 4. Understanding conflict resolution.

- B. School districts shall provide emotional literacy education to students during grades kindergarten through six.
 - C. The State Department of Education shall:
- 1. Develop guidelines and materials designed to enable schools to include emotional literacy education within any course of study currently offered by the school district or to offer emotional literacy education as a separate course. The guidelines shall outline the areas of instruction to be taught based on the subject matter standards adopted pursuant to Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 2. Develop professional development programs that are designed to help teachers provide instruction in emotional literacy education and incorporate the instruction into an existing course or courses or develop curriculum for a separate emotional literacy education course;
- 3. Provide and identify resources, including online curricula, for integrating the teaching of emotional literacy education into an existing course or courses or for developing a separate emotional

- literacy education course. Any online curricula provided or

 identified shall include an assessment component for each area of

 instruction listed in subsection A of this section.
 - D. The Department may work with one or more nonprofit organizations that have proven expertise in the development of standards and curriculum and delivery of teacher professional development in emotional literacy education for the purposes of developing and providing guidelines, materials, resources and professional development.
 - E. To deliver high-quality, consistent emotional literacy education, public school districts shall, to the extent possible, assign the responsibility of teaching emotional literacy education to the same teacher or teachers on a continuing basis.
 - F. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
 - SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
