SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution urging audits and recounts of the 2020 General Election in states where fraud has been alleged; encouraging state legislatures to use their power for appointment of electors; encouraging the U.S. Supreme Court to follow the law regarding the dates to receive ballots; encouraging the U.S. Congress to pass national voter ID and paper ballot measures for Congressional elections; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma election system has been referenced as a model of efficiency, inclusivity, and security in the conduct and management elections across our state; and

WHEREAS, the election systems in several states have been called into question in the 2020 General Election regarding their ability to prohibit fraud; and

WHEREAS, the judiciary in several states has ruled contrary to state law, federal law, and the U.S. Constitution by allowing ballots to be counted after the election date set in law; and

WHEREAS, the foundation of the Union of States established by the U.S. Constitution requires strong security and integrity of

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elections to be firmly established for the preservation of our Republic; and

WHEREAS, the Founders empowered the state legislatures with the manner of appointment for presidential electors in clause 2 of Section 1 of Article 2 of the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Founders empowered the state legislatures with the power to prescribe the time, place, and manner of holding elections for U.S. Senators and U.S. Representatives, but also included a provision empowering the Congress to make or alter such regulations at any time in clause 1 of Section 4 of Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT this legislature urges the members of the legislature in any state who had not completed and reported their election results on November 3, 2020, to use their legislative authority to call for full audits, recounts, and any other options at their disposal to expose any fraud or abuse used in their elections.

THAT this legislature urges the members of the legislatures in such states to utilize the powers in clause 2 of Section 1 of Article 2 of the U.S. Constitution for establishing the manner of appointing electors as fraud or abuse is discovered in their elections.

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THAT this legislature urges the members of the legislatures in such states to use their legislative powers to constrain the actions of the judicial branches in their states who have not followed the law by issuing opinions allowing for the receiving and counting of ballots after the election date set by law.

THAT this legislature urges the members of the United States Supreme Court to follow state law, federal law, and the U.S. Constitution and to reverse the judicial opinion allowing additional ballots to be received after the election date in violation of the deadline set in state law and federal law.

THAT this legislature urges the members of the United States Congress to use Section 4 of Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution to make or alter such regulations regarding the elections of U.S. Senators and U.S. Representatives to protect the security and integrity of future elections by at a minimum requiring photo identification in order to cast a ballot in such elections and requiring all voting systems being used in such elections to include the use of paper ballots for the use of audits and recounts.

THAT a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate of the United States, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States, the President and

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
