9	A Concurrent Resolution prohibiting the awarding of certain request for proposal and contracts; requiring
10	review and approval by the Oklahoma Legislature; providing time period for approval; and directing
11	distribution.
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14	WHEREAS, Oklahoma and our nation are facing universal Medicaid
15	uncertainty unparalleled since Medicaid's inception in 1965; and
16	WHEREAS, federal funding for the state's Medicaid program may be
17	in jeopardy over the near future without careful coordination
18	between the state and federal government, health care and mental
19	health provider community; and
20	WHEREAS, state tax revenues make up 18% of the total state
21	Medicaid budget; and
22	WHEREAS, Oklahoma's Medicaid budget has been cut by over
23	\$400,000,000 since 2010 resulting in lower health care and mental
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health provider rates and reducing access to care for the Medicaid population; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's hospitals, nursing homes and behavioral health providers partner with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by providing the state match for much of their provider rates resulting in very successful public/private partnerships; and

WHEREAS, funding and sustainability for Oklahoma's Children's Hospital is impacted by the loss of state and federal dollars; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's only Level One Trauma Center that provides 24-hour trauma care to Oklahoma's citizens would be tragically impacted by the loss of state and federal dollars; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma's two medical schools depend on Medicaid dollars for medical education and rural outreach and may be impacted by the loss of federal dollars; and

WHEREAS, the OU Health Sciences Center (OUHSC) and the OSU

Center for Health Sciences (OSUCHS) are economic engines to the

Oklahoma City and Tulsa communities and their campuses collectively serve all seventy-seven counties through medical outreach, medical residencies and complex specialty care; and

WHEREAS, the OSUCHS strives to enhance rural and underserved health care through an aggressive physician recruitment program, valuable physician training programs and the utilization of OSU outreach and access programs, and the loss of funds would be

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1 detrimental to these programs and an already fragile state health 2 system; and 3 WHEREAS, "supplemental payments" and "provider fees" generate 4 approximately \$650,000,000 annually to the state Medicaid program 5 and those dollars may be at risk. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION 6 OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 7 CONCURRING THEREIN: 9 THAT the Request for Proposal for the Aged, Blind, and Disabled 10 population at the Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall not be 11 awarded or contracts signed in order to be reviewed and enacted 12 through legislation in the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma 13 Legislature, due to the uncertainty of new federal managed care regulations that will impact the Medicaid budget and the 14 "supplemental dollars" and provider rates herein. 15 THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the 16 Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the Oklahoma 17 Health Care Authority Board. 18 19 56-1-1850 5/10/2017 11:46:40 AM 20 LB 21 22 23

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
