WHEREAS, the United States is the world leader in motorcycle safety, promoting education, training, licensing, use of protective gear, and motorcycle awareness; and

WHEREAS, the motorcycling community has committed themselves to decreasing motorcycle crashes and fatalities through training, education, enforcement, and increased public awareness; and

WHEREAS, following proper safety procedures and being cautious of other drivers and riders ensures the safety of Oklahoma's public; and

WHEREAS, approximately 56 people were killed in motorcycle accidents in 2014, a decrease from 92 motorcycle fatalities in 2013. Due to motorcycle safety training, education, and awareness from the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, the Edmond and Oklahoma City Police Departments, and ABATE, Oklahoma's number of motorcycle fatalities is decreasing; and WHEREAS, the National Highway Safety Administration actively

promotes Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, encouraging riders to wear the proper protective and safety gear, never drink and ride, have proper licensing, and to seek proper safety training before taking to the road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
