-	A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the history and tourism behind the Golden Driller; recognizing
10	contributions of Oklahoma's oil and gas industry; recognizing role of John Franklin Stephens Jr.; and
11	directing distribution.
12	
13	WHEREAS, the first International Petroleum Exposition and
14	Congress was held in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1923; and
15	WHEREAS, the International Petroleum Exposition (IPE) continued
16	to be held in Tulsa to educate workers and the public and serve as a
17	marketplace for new equipment; and
18	WHEREAS, at the 1953 IPE, the first "Golden Driller" was put on
19	display by the Mid-Continent Supply Company. The Texas company
20	returned in 1959 with a second temporary driller statue; and
21	WHEREAS, in 1966, the Golden Driller was permanently installed,
22	and the IPE had the largest attendance in the event's history; and
23	WHEREAS, with an arm resting on an oil derrick and standing at
24 2 -	76 feet and weighing 43,500 pounds, the towering Golden Driller

1 statue became a Tulsa landmark and was named the state monument in 2 1979; and

<sup>3</sup> WHEREAS, the Golden Driller was modeled after Sapulpa resident <sup>4</sup> John Franklin Stephens Jr., who was 29 at the time and served as the <sup>5</sup> superintendent of the Golden Driller Project; and

<sup>6</sup> WHEREAS, the Driller was dedicated to the men of the petroleum <sup>7</sup> industry and serves as a reminder of Oklahoma's rich history in the <sup>8</sup> oil and gas industry.

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
 10 OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
 11 CONCURRING THEREIN:

12 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature recognizes the history and 13 tourism behind the state monument, the Golden Driller.

<sup>14</sup> THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature recognizes the contributions <sup>15</sup> of the oil and gas industry to the state's economy and history.

16 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature recognizes the role of John 17 Franklin Stephens Jr. in the design and construction of the Golden 18 Driller.
