19	WHEREAS, breast cancer is one of the most common cancers among	
20	American women, second only to skin cancers, with one in eight women	
21	being diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime; and	
22	WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that nearly	
23	230,000 new cases of invasive breast ca	ancer will be diagnosed in

women in 2015, and the disease is projected to claim the lives of more than 40,000 women this year; and

WHEREAS, men are also at risk for breast cancer and need to be educated about their risk. While far less common in men than in women, men still have a one-in-1,000 chance of getting breast cancer in their lifetime. This year, it is estimated 2,350 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and approximately 440 men will die from breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, death rates from breast cancer have been declining since 1990 because of earlier detection through screening, increased awareness, and improved treatment; and

12 WHEREAS, there are now more than 3 million breast cancer
13 survivors in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, many Oklahoma grassroots organizations, support groups, and clinics are providing support, education, and treatment for men and women affected by breast cancer.
