7	A Concurrent Resolution directing certain review of Advanced Placement U.S. history framework; directing
8	withholding of certain funds from certain Advanced Placement U.S. history activities; directing the
9	State Board of Education to explore certain alternatives; directing certain decisions to be made

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13	WHEREAS, Approximately 500,000 students in the United States
14	take the College Board's Advanced Placement U. S. history course
15	each year, with 5,000 students in Oklahoma enrolled in the AP U.S.
16	history classes for the 2014-2015 school year; and
17	WHEREAS, the AP U.S. history course has traditionally been
18	designed to present a balanced view of American history and to
19	prepare students for college-level history courses; and
20	WHEREAS, the College Board, a private organization responsible
21	for issuing the SAT and the various AP exams, has released a new
22	test and course framework for AP U.S. history; and
23	WHEREAS, the new AP U.S. history course framework differs from
2.4	Oklahoma subject matter standards for social studies: and

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WHEREAS, the new AP U.S. history course framework emphasizes the negative aspects of our nation's history using the ideology of race, gender, class, and ethnicity to teach themes and events in U.S. history while omitting or minimizing positive aspects of American history, which presents a radically revisionist, biased, and inaccurate view of American history; and WHEREAS, the AP U.S. history exam and course framework neglects critical topics that were formerly part of the AP U.S. history course, with very little information mentioned about the Founding Fathers, the principles of the Declaration of Independence, and the religious influences on our nation's history; and WHEREAS, the AP U.S. history course framework presents inaccurate views of historical events such as the motivations and actions of 17th-19th century settlers, the Great Depression, and the development of and victory in the Cold War; and WHEREAS, the AP U.S. history course framework excludes discussion of the U.S. military, including battles, commanders, and heroes, and omits individuals and events that greatly shaped our nation's history such as Albert Einstein, Jonas Salk, George Washington Carver, Rosa Parks, Dr. Martin Luther King, Tuskegee Airmen, the Holocaust, and many other critical topics that have long been part of the AP U.S. history course; and WHEREAS, some of Oklahoma's best and brightest students will be

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studying history according to the College Board's AP U.S. history

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course framework, which has stated "any teacher who presents the principles of the American Constitution taught in the traditional way would be severely disadvantaging his/her students for the College Board exam"; and

WHEREAS, despite offering "revisions" and "clarifications" to the framework, the College Board has refused to change the themes and key concepts of the framework, thus the AP U.S. history
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"required knowledge" for Oklahoma students that is currently being taught in alignment with the 2014-2015 framework is inaccurate,

biased, and negative with revisionist themes and concepts; and

WHEREAS, to prepare students for the AP U.S. history examination, Oklahoma AP U.S. history teachers will have to be trained and adopt materials in order to teach the new AP U.S. history framework's "required knowledge," which is in conflict with

WHEREAS, the A.P. U.S. history framework will be usurping Oklahoma's subject matter standards for history;

the Oklahoma subject matter standards for history; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature directs College Board to withdraw its new AP U.S. history framework before the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year and replace it with the previous AP U.S. history framework.

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THAT the budget for the State Department of Education reflect that Oklahoma taxpayers' money is withheld from AP U.S. history teacher training, curriculum, and scholarships that offset AP U.S. history exams for the 2015-2016 school year until the College Board reverts back to the previous AP U.S. history framework.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature directs the Oklahoma State
Board of Education to explore alternatives to the College Board's
Advanced Placement program for U.S. history that would offer
Oklahoma students the same opportunities that AP presents and is in
agreement with Oklahoma's subject matter standards for history.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature directs that Oklahoma State Board of Education and all Oklahoma school district board of education decisions concerning U.S. history, honors U.S. history, or AP U.S. history programs be in accordance with the Oklahoma subject matter standards for history and social studies and incorporate an emphasis on American founding principles, American exceptionalism, and America's unique role in the world; and

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to David Coleman, president of the College Board, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Governor, and the Lieutenant Governor.

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
