15	troops currently engaged in an active war have entered Oklahoma
16	could be perceived as an act of aggression, escalating the conflict;

18	WHEREAS, the American taxpayers have now had over \$100 billion
19	sent overseas for the war, adding to the increased inflation harming

21	WHEREAS, the massive profiteering during wars and conflicts can
22	often blind politicians to the loss of human life as they focus on

WHEREAS, it is possible to maintain partnerships with military forces from partner countries without jeopardizing our national security by choosing to prioritize peace to save innocent human lives; and

WHEREAS, prioritizing peace is not as excessively profitable as war; however, the previous massive military expenditures would be maintained for those who choose to prioritize financial profitability rather than innocent human lives; and

WHEREAS, the conflict between the nations of Russia and Ukraine has cost an estimated 250,000 lives on all sides; and

WHEREAS, the people of Oklahoma support the innocent civilians around the world who suffer loss of liberty and loss of life because of the decisions of their governments and political leaders; and

WHEREAS, the end of hostilities between the nations of Russia and Ukraine would benefit the citizens of both nations and prevent further loss of innocent lives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature acknowledges and embraces the wisdom of the words of Jesus found in the Bible, in particular the verse found in Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God," as a guiding principle in our efforts to promote peace and diplomacy.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature recognizes that the continuation of the conflict between Russia and Ukraine has led to the enrichment of the military-industrial complex, a phenomenon famously warned against by President Dwight D. Eisenhower, who stated, "In the councils of government, we must guard against the acquisition of unwarranted influence, whether sought or unsought, by the military-industrial complex," and the call for peaceful and diplomatic solutions prioritizes the well-being of the citizens and not the interests of the military-industrial complex.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature offers our state as a neutral site for peace talks and negotiations between the representatives of the nations of Russia and Ukraine with the goal of ending hostilities and stopping further loss of human life.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature encourages the governor of Oklahoma to work with the U.S. Department of State and any other federal entities to host peace talks and negotiations in Oklahoma between the nations of Russia and Ukraine.

That a copy of this resolution be distributed to the governor of Oklahoma, the U.S. Secretary of State, and the U.S. Department of State.
