18                   A Concurrent Resolution encouraging and inviting the  
19                   exhibitors, breed associations and partners to return  
20                   to Oklahoma to begin a new tradition of a perpetual  
21                   Cattlemen's Congress in Oklahoma.

22                   WHEREAS, agriculture leaders in Oklahoma organized and held the  
23                   Inaugural Cattlemen's Congress at the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds in  
24

1 January 2021 in response to the cancellation of the National Western  
2 Stock Show in Denver; and

3 WHEREAS, the Cattlemen's Congress was a necessary event for the  
4 stabilization of the beef industry and the crossroads of cattle  
5 genetics for all of North America; and

6 WHEREAS, more than 2,793 exhibitors from 41 states and three  
7 Canadian provinces came to Oklahoma City and exhibited 9,627 head of  
8 cattle, breaking records for number of head shown, for most breeds,  
9 and for one of the largest cattle shows in all of North America; and

10 WHEREAS, there were 23 sales associated with the Cattlemen's  
11 Congress that took place in Oklahoma City grossing more than \$10  
12 million in sales, many breaking previous records. There were 1,432  
13 lots sold grossing \$10,380,408.00, averaging \$7,254.00 per lot; and

14 WHEREAS, the total economic impact for Oklahoma City for the  
15 Cattlemen's Congress surpassed \$40 million.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION  
17 OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
18 CONCURRING THEREIN:

19 THAT the Oklahoma Legislature encourages and invites the  
20 exhibitors, breed associations and partners to return to Oklahoma to  
21 begin a new tradition of a perpetual Cattlemen's Congress in  
22 Oklahoma.
