8 AS INTRODUCED

9 A Concurrent Resolution describing certain Request  
10 for Proposals; specifying current due date; stating  
11 pending questions; requesting cancellation of certain  
12 Request for Proposals; requesting certain  
13 collaboration; requesting reissue of certain Request  
14 for Proposals; and directing distribution.

15 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority issued a Request for  
16 Proposals on November 30, 2016, for care coordination models for  
17 aged, blind and disabled persons pursuant to Section 5028 of Title  
18 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

19 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority has required the  
20 responses to the Request for Proposals to be delivered by March 1,  
21 2017, at 12:00 p.m.; and

22 WHEREAS, there are pending questions about the long-term  
23 viability of supplemental payments and/or pass-through payments  
24 under a care coordination model; and

1       WHEREAS, there are pending questions about the draft rates for  
2 care coordination and whether the rates are actuarially sound.

3       NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION  
4 OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
5 CONCURRING THEREIN:

6       THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature requests that the Oklahoma  
7 Health Care Authority cancel the Request for Proposals for care  
8 coordination models for the aged, blind and disabled populations  
9 issued on November 30, 2016.

10       THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature requests that the Oklahoma  
11 Health Care Authority work with the Centers for Medicare and  
12 Medicaid Services to resolve any questions about the long-term  
13 viability of supplemental payments and/or pass-through payments for  
14 health care providers including, but not limited to, hospitals,  
15 nursing homes, physicians and medical schools, under a care  
16 coordination model.

17       THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature requests that the Oklahoma  
18 Health Care Authority work with the Centers for Medicare and  
19 Medicaid Services to ensure the rates for care coordination are  
20 actuarially sound.

21       THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature requests that the Oklahoma  
22 Health Care Authority reissue a Request for Proposals by May 1,  
23 2017, for care coordination models for aged, blind and disabled  
24 persons.

1            THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the Oklahoma  
2 Health Care Authority Board and the Executive Director of the  
3 Oklahoma Health Care Authority.  
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
