| 15 | 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: |
| 16 | SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for |
| 17 | their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, |
| 18 | the following proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by |
| 19 | adding a new Section 44 to Article X to read as follows: |
| 20 | Section 44. A. The State of Oklahoma shall not become indebted |
| 21 | in an amount that causes total annual debt service payments to |
| 22 | exceed five percent (5%) of the average of the general fund revenue, |
| 23 | as certified by the State Board of Equalization in December of each |

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calendar year, for the preceding five (5) fiscal years. The

Legislature, upon an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of both houses, may declare an emergency and permit the total indebtedness of the state to exceed the amount provided in this section.

- B. The state shall not be in violation of the provisions of this section if a decline in the average of the general fund revenue, as certified by the State Board of Equalization in December of each calendar year, for the preceding (5) fiscal years, results in annual debt service payments exceeding the limit provided in subsection A of this section; provided that, the state shall not incur any additional debt service payments so long as the amount of debt service payments continue to exceed five percent (5%) of the average of the general fund revenue, as certified by the State Board of Equalization in December of each calendar year for the preceding five (5) fiscal years.
- C. For purposes of calculating this total amount of indebtedness as provided in subsection A of this section, annual debt service payments shall not include any indebtedness incurred through the master lease program as provided in Section 3206.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, pursuant to a declaration of an emergency as provided in subsection A of this section or any general obligation bonds issued pursuant to Section 39A of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution.
