7	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or
8	rejection proposed amendments to Sections 1, 3, 4, and 23 of Article VI and Section 15 of Article IX of
9	the Oklahoma Constitution, which relate to executive officers; directing the Governor to appoint the State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction,
11	Commissioner of Labor, Commissioner of Insurance and members of the Corporation Commission; removing
12	eligibility and term limit provisions for such officers; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

15	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
16	1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
17	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
18	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
19	the following proposed amendments to Sections 1, 3, 4, and 23 of
20	Article VI, and Section 15 of Article IX of the Oklahoma
21	Constitution to read as follows:
22	Section 1. A. The Executive authority of the state shall be
23	vested in a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, State
24	Auditor and Inspector, Attorney General, State Treasurer,

Superintendent of Public Instruction, Commissioner of Labor,

Commissioner of Insurance, and other officers provided by law and

this Constitution, each of whom shall keep his or her office and

public records, books, and papers at the seat of government, and

shall perform such duties as may be designated in this Constitution

or prescribed by law.

- B. The Secretary of State shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate for a term of four (4) years to run concurrently with the term of the Governor.
- C. The State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction,

 Commissioner of Labor and Commissioner of Insurance shall be

 appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate for

 a term of four (4) years to run concurrently with the term of the

 Governor.
 - Section 3. No person shall be eligible to the office of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, State Auditor and Inspector, or Attorney General, State Treasurer or Superintendent of Public Instruction except a citizen of the United States of the age of not less than thirty-one (31) years and who shall have been ten (10) years next preceding his or her election, or appointment, a qualified elector of this state.
- Section 4. A. The term of office of the Governor, Lieutenant
 Governor, State Auditor and Inspector, and Attorney General, State
 Treasurer, Commissioner of Labor and Superintendent of Public

Instruction shall be four (4) years from the second Monday of January next after their election. The said officers shall be eligible to immediately succeed themselves except as otherwise provided in this section.

- B. 1. No person shall be eligible to serve as Governor for a period of time in excess of eight (8) years. Such years need not be consecutive. Any years served by a person serving as Governor for less than a full term to fill a vacancy in such office shall not be included in the eight-year limitation set forth herein.
- 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of this amendment, any person serving as Governor at the time of passage of this amendment shall be eligible to complete the term of office to which he or she was elected but shall not be eligible to serve as Governor for a period of time in excess of eight (8) years, excluding years served for less than a full term to fill a vacancy in such office. The provisions of this paragraph shall apply regardless of whether such years were served prior to or after passage of this amendment.
- C. No person shall be eligible to serve as Lieutenant Governor, State Auditor and Inspector, or Attorney General, State Treasurer, Commissioner of Labor or Superintendent of Public Instruction for a period of time in excess of eight (8) years. Such years need not be consecutive. Any years served by a person elected or appointed to serve less than a full term to fill a vacancy in any such office shall not be included in the limitations set forth herein. Any

person serving in such position at the time of passage of this amendment shall be eligible to complete the term for which he or she has been elected and shall be eligible to serve an additional eight (8) years thereafter, notwithstanding the provisions of this amendment.

D. The Legislature is hereby authorized to enact laws to implement the provisions of subsections B and C of this section.

Section 23. A. There shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State, at the first general election, a chief officer of the Insurance Department, who shall be styled the "Insurance Commissioner", whose term of office shall be four years: Provided, That the first term of the Insurance Commissioner so elected, shall expire at the time of the expiration of the term of office of the first Governor elected The Commissioner of Insurance shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate for a term of four (4) years to run concurrently with the term of the Governor. The Insurance Commissioner of Insurance shall be at least twenty-five (25) years of age and well versed in insurance matters.

B. No person shall be eligible to serve as Insurance

Commissioner for a period of time in excess of eight (8) years.

Such years need not be consecutive. Any years served by a person elected or appointed to serve less than a full term to fill a vacancy in such office shall not be included in the limitation set

forth herein. Any person serving in such position at the time of passage of this amendment shall be eligible to complete the term for which he or she has been elected and shall be eligible to serve an additional eight (8) years thereafter, notwithstanding the provisions of this amendment. The Legislature is hereby authorized to enact laws to implement the provisions of this subsection.

Section 15. A. A Corporation Commission is hereby created, to

be composed of three persons, who shall be elected by the people at a general election for State officers, and their terms of office shall be six (6) years. In case of a vacancy in said office, the Governor of the State shall fill such vacancy by appointment until the next general election, when a successor shall be elected to fill out any unexpired term appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate for a term of four (4) years to run concurrently with the term of the Governor.

B. No person shall be eligible to serve as Corporation

Commissioner for a period of time in excess of twelve (12) years.

Such years need not be consecutive. Any years served by a person elected or appointed to serve less than a full term to fill a vacancy in such office shall not be included in the limitation set forth herein. Any person serving in such position at the time of passage of this amendment shall be eligible to complete the term for which he or she has been elected and shall be eligible to serve an additional twelve (12) years thereafter, notwithstanding the

1 provisions of this amendment. The Legislature is hereby authorized 2 to enact laws to implement the provisions of this subsection. 3 SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in 4 5 the following form: BALLOT TITLE 6 Legislative Referendum No. 7 State Question No. THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS: 9 This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends 10 Section 1 of Article 6. It directs the Governor to appoint the State Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, 11 Commissioner of Labor and Commissioner of Insurance. The 12 appointment would be for a four-year term concurrent with that 13 of the Governor. It amends Section 3 of Article 6. It removes 14 15 eligibility requirements for the State Treasurer and Superintendent of Public Instruction. It amends Section 4 of 16 Article 6. It removes term limits for the State Treasurer, 17 Commissioner of Labor and Superintendent of Public Instruction. 18 It amends Section 23 of Article 6. It removes term limits and 19 eligibility requirements for the Commissioner of Insurance. 20 amends Section 15 of Article 9.
