The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for 17 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 18 the repeal of Section 3 and the following proposed amendment to 19 Section 4 of Article VII-B of the Oklahoma Constitution to read as 20 follows: 21 Section 4. When a vacancy in any Judicial Office, however 22 arising, occurs or is certain to occur, the Judicial Nominating 23 Commission shall choose and submit to the Governor and the Chief

Justice of the Supreme Court three (3) nominees, each of whom has

1	previously notified the Commission in writing that he will serve as
2	a Judicial Officer if appointed. The the Governor shall appoint one
3	(1) of the nominees a nominee to fill the vacancy, but if he fails
4	to do so within sixty (60) days the Chief Justice of the Supreme
5	Court shall appoint one (1) of the nominees, the appointment to be
6	certified by the Secretary of State and to be confirmed by the
7	Senate.
