7	A Resolution encouraging closer economic relationships between the United States and Taiwan by				
8	negotiating a FTA; commending the signing of an International Expedited Traveler Initiative;				
9	celebrating the 37th anniversary of the sister-state relationship between the State of Oklahoma and Taiwan; commending Mr. Louis M. Huang for efforts and contributions; and directing distribution.

13	WHEREAS, for decades the United States and the Republic of China				
14	(Taiwan) have fostered a close relationship that has been of mutual				
15	economic, cultural and strategic benefit; and				
16	WHEREAS, bilateral trade between the U.S. and Taiwan reached				
17	\$65.3 billion in 2016, making Taiwan the 10th largest trading				
18	partner of the U.S. as well as the largest per capita importer of				
19	U.S. agricultural products; and				
20	WHEREAS, Taiwan maintains biennial agricultural procurement				
21	missions to the U.S. to sign multi-billion dollar supply deals and				
22	has been actively dispatching a substantial delegation to				
23	participate in the SelectUSA Investment Summit since 2013; and

WHEREAS, U.S. exports to Taiwan, combined with Taiwan's investment in the U.S., support over 330,000 well-paid U.S. jobs, and both nations could realize further economic gains through the establishment of a free trade agreement (FTA) as well as by enhancing the platforms of Trade and Investment Framework Agreement (TIFA) and Digital Economy Forum (DEF); and

WHEREAS, Taiwan remains a beacon of democracy as well as the 7 only full-fledged democracy in the Chinese speaking world, the 8 9 results of Taiwan's 2016 presidential election, which marked both 10 the third peaceful transition of political power since the first popular vote for President held in 1996 and the first transition of 11 12 its national legislative majority since 1949, serve as proof that 13 Taiwan is a worthy member candidate for the Communities of Democracies (CD); and 14

WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 has continued to be 15 the cornerstone of relations between the U.S. and Taiwan for 38 16 years, both countries have further affirmed that Taiwan is an 17 important and enduring economic and security partner through working 18 in a mutually beneficial partnership to address global challenges in 19 such areas as international humanitarian assistance, public health 20 and technology under the Global Cooperation and Training Framework 21 (GCTF) established in June 2015; and 22

23 WHEREAS, travel from Taiwan to the United States has increased24 by more than 50 percent since the announcement of Taiwan's

participation in the U.S. Visa Waiver Program in 2012, EVA Air 1 launched their direct Taipei-Houston route in 2015, and the U.S. and 2 3 Taiwan signed a joint statement on an International Expedited Traveler Initiative in 2016, all significant efforts which will 4 5 promote tourism and encourage exchanges between the two peoples; and WHEREAS, Taiwan acts as a natural hub to other Asian 6 destinations, with Taiwan's Civil Aeronautics Administration 7 providing services for nearly 1.53 million controlled flights 8 9 carrying 58 million incoming and outgoing passengers annually; and 10 WHEREAS, this year marks the 37th anniversary of the sister-11 state relationship between Oklahoma and Taiwan, a bond nurtured 12 through mutually beneficial exchanges: 1,319 jobs in Oklahoma are supported by Taiwan affiliated companies, Oklahoma exported 23.2 13 million in goods to Taiwan in 2016, making Taiwan the 9th largest 14 15 export market for Oklahoma in Asia.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION 17 OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

18 THAT the Oklahoma State Senate encourages closer economic
19 relationships between the United States and Taiwan by negotiating a
20 FTA between the two countries.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate commends the signing of a joint statement on an International Expedited Traveler Initiative between the United States and Taiwan which encourages tourism.
