WHEREAS, Taiwan is now a member of the U.S. Visa Waiver Program (effective November 1, 2012), reflecting the friendship, trust, and cooperation shared between our two countries, and making travel between Taiwan and Oklahoma for business and tourism even more convenient; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is recognized as a nation with exemplary economic and environmental progress, including substantial progress in the aviation industry for many years; and great advantages would result in Taiwan's participation in the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO).
