11	WHEREAS, Norman Heaton made his first parachute jump with the
12	82nd Airborne Division during Jump School and had completed 31
13	military jumps when he was honorably discharged from the U.S. Army
14	in January 1958; and
15	WHEREAS, Heaton joined the Oklahoma State University Skydivers
16	in the fall of 1961. He served as President of the club for two
17	years and was the only instructor and jumpmaster in the group and
18	was responsible for training all of the students; and
19	WHEREAS, he has been a member of the Parachute Club of America,
20	now known as the United States Parachute Association, for 49 years.
21	The association is the national representative body for skydiving
22	and the parachuting branch of the National Aeronautic Association;

WHEREAS, Heaton founded the Oklahoma Parachute Council in early
1964 and served as its first President; and

3 WHEREAS, in 1964, he qualified for the nation's highest 4 parachuting license, the US/FAI Class D Parachute License, followed 5 by the FAA Senior Parachute Riggers License and also attained the 6 coveted Instructor/Examiner Rating; and

7 WHEREAS, Heaton was hired in May of 1964 as the Assistant 8 Director of the Parachute Club of America and then in July was named 9 Executive Director. During his tenure, he helped increase club 10 membership to over 25,000 members; and

11 WHEREAS, he was the only person in the world, at the time, to 12 have served as Meet Director for eleven National Parachuting 13 Championships. He also served as Meet Director for two world 14 parachuting championships; the XI World Parachuting Championships in 15 1972 in Oklahoma; and the 1st World Cup of Relative Work Parachuting 16 in 1973 in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Heaton was the U.S. Representative to the International Parachute Committee (IPC) of the Federation Aeronique (FAI), the international representative body for all aviation sports, from 1969 to 1975; and

21 WHEREAS, in 1971, he made his one-thousandth freefall parachute 22 jump and was awarded the coveted Gold Wings of the USPA. The Gold 23 Wings were presented by Apollo Astronaut Ed Mitchell at the opening

ceremonies of the 1971 National Parachuting Championships in
Tahlequah; and

3	WHEREAS, Heaton received the USPA Achievement Award and was
4	bestowed the Paul Tissandier Diploma by the FAI. He also was named
5	Executive Director Emeritus by the USPA Board of Directors; and
6	WHEREAS, on October 11, 2014, Heaton became the first Oklahoman
7	to be inducted into the Skydiving Museum and Hall of Fame.
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
9	OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
10	THAT the Oklahoma State Senate congratulates Norman Heaton for
11	his induction into the Skydiving Museum and Hall of Fame.
