6	AS INTRODUCED
7	A Resolution relating to state purchasing policies; directing examination of state purchasing policies
8	relating to products installed, used or stored in occupied buildings for certain purpose; requiring
9	recommendation of certain authority relating to environmentally preferable purchasing; and directing
10	distribution.

13	WHEREAS, according to the United States Environmental Protection
14	Agency, the average American citizen spends ninety percent of his or
15	her time indoors; and
16	WHEREAS, occupied public buildings, including libraries, public
17	schools and universities, health-care facilities, office buildings
18	and more, welcome millions of people each and every day; and
19	WHEREAS, according to the Government Accountability Office,
20	fifteen thousand public schools in this country circulate air of
21	unsatisfactory quality; and
22	WHEREAS, indoor air quality in public buildings is impacted by
23	the products and materials governments purchase every day that are
24	

1 stored and used, including the permanent building elements from 2 which the building is constructed and finished; and

3 WHEREAS, an environmentally preferable purchasing policy 4 requires governments and public entities to use products or services 5 that have a lesser or reduced effect on human health and the 6 environment in comparison to competing products or services that 7 serve the same purpose; and

8 WHEREAS, various organizations and industries have collaborated 9 to develop tools, such as GreenScreen benchmark, Cradle to Cradle, 10 Health Product Declarations, and others that can be used to identify 11 products that reduce potential adverse environmental or health 12 impacts; and

WHEREAS, environmentally preferable purchasing policies direct agency departments and their subsidiaries to adhere to purchasing guidelines intended to mitigate any negative impacts of government purchasing on human and environment health.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION
OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

19 THAT the State Purchasing Director is hereby directed to examine 20 the state's purchasing policies, especially for those products that 21 when installed, used or stored in buildings, to:

Establish preferences for products and materials for which
 both ingredients and their health impacts are transparent and
 available;

2	selecting products with lesser environmental and health impacts,
3	including the use of available tools to identify environmentally
4	preferable products; and
5	3. Make recommendations to the Legislature regarding

8	impacts on the citizens of this state.
