

HB 3939 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Expands the Oregon Business Development Department residential infrastructure grant program to certain cities and until January 2, 2028.

Detailed Summary:

Directs the Oregon Business Development Department to provide grants for infrastructure projects to the following cities:

- \$2,350,000 to the City of Florence for streets, sidewalks, under grounding power, street lights, stormwater, water and wastewater improvements;
- \$3,000,000 to Baker City for water, sewer, streets and private utilities;
- \$3,000,000 to the City of Burns for water, sewer, streets and private utilities;
- \$1,000,000 to the City of Ontario for water, sewer, stormwater and streets;
- \$3,000,000 to the City of Burns and the City of Hines for 4,200 lineal feet of streets with water, sewer and private utilities, including power or fiber;
- \$1,000,000 to the City of Dallas for water, sewer, storm drainage and street improvements in the vicinity of Oakdale Avenue and SW Hayter Street;
- \$1,000,000 to the City of Dallas for water, sewer, storm drainage and street improvements in the vicinity of SE Barberry Avenue and SE Hankel Street; and
- \$1,500,000 to the City of Carlton for a two-part water loop system.

Appropriates \$15,850,000 out of the General Fund to the Oregon Business Development Department to provide the said grants.

Declares emergency, takes effect on July 1, 2025.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Directs to the Oregon Business Development Department to also provide grants for infrastructure projects to the following cities:

- \$3,500,000 to the City of Wilsonville for transit, water and utility enhancements and extensions on SW Stafford Road between Boeckman Road and SW Frog Pond Lane;
- \$4,000,000 to the City of Adair Village for wastewater treatment plant improvements; and
- \$2,500,000 to the City of Grants Pass for waterline looping on Redwood Highway.

Modifies appropriation amount to \$25,850,000.
