

SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 4121 Relating to cannabis

HB 4121 directs the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to establish a registration program for industrial hemp products that contain cannabinoids if consumed by humans or animals.

The measure sets labeling and packaging requirements, allows for temporary permits for licensee and lab workers, limits the number of licenses, and authorizes minor decoy operations, inspections, and enforcement. OLCC is also directed to create and maintain maps of operation sites.

The measure has a minimal fiscal impact for the current biennium, and fiscal impact OLCC in the 2025-27 biennium of \$1.6 million and seven positions. Expenditure limitation will need to be included in OLCC's 2025-27 budget, and will be supported by fees charged to registrants.

The Transportation and Economic Development Subcommittee recommends HB 4121 be reported out do pass.
