House Bill 2016

Sponsored by Representative KOTEK

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Education to develop and implement statewide education plan for educationally disadvantaged youth.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to statewide education plans; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "educationally disadvantaged youth" means mi-5 nority youth who have been historically underserved and for whom there is a significant 6 achievement gap compared with other youth.

7 (2) The Department of Education shall develop and implement a statewide education plan
8 for educationally disadvantaged youth. The plan must address the educational needs of ed9 ucationally disadvantaged youth from early childhood through higher education, and must
10 include strategies to:

(a) Develop culturally appropriate educational materials that are evidence-based or based
 on best practices and that are used for ensuring that educationally disadvantaged youth en ter kindergarten ready to learn;

(b) Address the disproportionate rate of disciplinary incidents for educationally disad vantaged youth compared to other youth in the education system;

16 (c) Increase parental engagement in the education of educationally disadvantaged youth;

(d) Increase the engagement of educationally disadvantaged youth in educational activ ities before and after regularly scheduled school hours;

(e) Increase the percentage of educationally disadvantaged youth who earn a high school
 diploma, a modified diploma or an extended diploma and who enroll in a post-secondary in stitution of education;

(f) Ensure that educationally disadvantaged youth in grades 6 through 12 who had not considered enrolling in a post-secondary institution of education are directed toward, and are able to access, post-secondary educational opportunities that align with their interests and abilities; and

(g) Ensure that educationally disadvantaged youth in post-secondary institutions of edu cation receive culturally appropriate services, including orientations, mentoring and support
 as a first generation college student, to increase retention and graduation rates at post secondary institutions of education.

30 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 31 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect $\rm HB\ 2016$
