## House Bill 2177

Sponsored by Representative STARK; Representative ESQUIVEL (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs Legislative Fiscal Office to conduct study and report findings regarding 2017-2019 biennium sources of Oregon Liquor Control Commission revenue related to alcoholic beverages and recipients of revenue distributions. Requires office to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2019.

Sunsets January 2, 2020.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to Oregon Liquor Control Commission revenue related to alcoholic beverages; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Legislative Fiscal Office shall conduct a study and report findings regarding the sources of Oregon Liquor Control Commission revenue related to alcoholic beverages, and the services, programs and contracts funded by distributions of the revenue to cities, counties, and mental health, alcoholism and drug services.

- (2) The study shall cover all revenue related to alcoholic beverages that the commission receives or distributes during the 2017-2019 biennium. The study shall identify, with specificity, the amount received from each revenue source, including but not limited to revenue from each tax imposed on the manufacture of malt beverages, wine, cider and distilled liquor, and revenue from license fees for each license type. The study shall identify the specific cities, counties and programs receiving distributions, and the amounts distributed to each recipient. The office shall also conduct random examinations of city, county and program use of the distributed revenues and include specific examples of typical uses in the study findings.
- (3) In conducting the study, the Legislative Fiscal Office shall consult with the Legislative Policy and Research Committee and may consult with state agencies and members of the public who have an interest in the services, programs and contracts funded by commission distributions. The commission, Oregon Department of Administrative Services, Oregon Health Authority, State Treasurer, Department of Revenue and other state agencies shall provide the office with information to assist the office in the completion of this study.
- (4) The office shall submit a report with the results of the study to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to government efficiency in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2019.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2020.

SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
